Report of the Trustees for the year ended 30 September 2025

The trustees present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2025. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland.

Objectives and Activities

The objects of the CIO are the advancement of amateur sport by promoting the community participation in healthy recreation, for the benefit of the residents of Churchill, Somerset and the surrounding area, by (A) the provision of facilities for playing cricket;(B) encouraging and developing where possible the cricketing skills and knowledge of senior and junior members.

Achievements and Performance

All the charity's trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit when exercising their powers and duties.

This season the club continued to expand the junior and women's sections. Junior cricket coaching sessions were held during the winter months in indoor nets and outdoor coaching and matches were held from April until the end of the school term in July. Both boys and girls took an active part in training and matches. The training was run by qualified coaches and the club paid for training courses for new coaches so that we now have 5 fully qualified instructors.

Over 90 juniors took part in the training sessions at under 7,9,11 and 13 age groups and the under 11 and 13 teams played competitive cricket in the North Somerset Youth Cricket League. The trustees expect that these groups will continue to play in the 2026 season as the juniors showed great enthusiasm for the game and were supported by many parents and volunteers. The trustees are grateful to all those who helped in organising the matches and taking the juniors to away games, which gave them the opportunity to play at new grounds.

At the end of the season there was an awards cricket festival for the under 7s and under 9s teams at which every child who had participated received a medal and top performers received an additional award. It was a great day for everyone who participated and the juniors thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Another success of the season was the women's team which played league matches in the Somerset Women's and Girls' competition. The team competed in the Somerset Pairs Softball Filler League competition and were runners up in the Somerset Women's Softball KO Cup Final. This was a great achievement for a team which was only formed 3 years ago.

The club has fully implemented the ECB Safe Hands and ECB Anti-discrimination policies and the trustees thank those volunteers who helped with this.

Club membership continued to grow with over 55 senior members and 90 junior members together with parents and volunteers. The trustees are very grateful to all those who volunteered their assistance throughout the season.

During 2025 the club completed a full refurbishment of the pavilion and changing rooms and the trustees are grateful to the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) County Grants scheme for providing a £10,000 grant towards the cost of the pavilion upgrade.

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation and assessment of going concern

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to the accounts. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the CIO's ability to continue as a going concern.

Currency

The presentational currency throughout the financial statement is Pounds Sterling (GBP)

Funds Structure

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with the specific restrictions imposed by the donor or trust deed. Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use for any purpose in the furtherance of charitable objectives.

Recognition of income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, if it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of the income receivable can be reliably measured.

Donations and grants are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation or grant is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that these conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Recognition of expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required, and the amount of the obligation can be reliably measured.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised at cost and are depreciated using the straight line basis at the following rate:

Pavilion improvements - 10%

Machinery and equipment - 20%

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 30 September 2023

The trustees present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2023. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland.

Objectives and Activities

The objects of the CIO are the advancement of amateur sport by promoting the community participation in healthy recreation, for the benefit of the residents of Churchill, Somerset and the surrounding area, by (A) the provision of facilities for playing cricket; (B) encouraging and developing where possible the cricketing skills and knowledge of senior and junior members.

Achievements and Performance

All the charity's trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit when exercising their powers and duties.

This season the club continued to expand the junior and ladies sections. Junior cricket coaching sessions were held during the winter months in indoor nets and outdoor coaching and matches were held from April until the end of the school term in July. Both boys and girls took an active part in training and matches. The training was run by qualified coaches and the club paid for training courses for new coaches so that we now have 5 fully qualified instructors.

Over 70 juniors took part in the training sessions at under 7,9,11 and 13 age groups and the under 11 and 13 teams played competitive cricket in the North Somerset Youth Cricket League where the under 13's finished 15th and the under 11's finished 9th in their respective leagues. The trustees expect that these groups will continue to play in the 2024 season as the juniors showed great enthusiasm for the game and were supported by many parents and volunteers. The trustees are grateful to all those who helped in organising the matches and taking the juniors to away games, which gave them the opportunity to play at new grounds.

At the end of the season there was an awards day at which every child who had participated received a medal and top performers received an additional award. An entertaining match was arranged between the youngsters and their parents which probably ended in a draw, but no one was quite sure and much fun was had by all.

Another success of the season was the ladies team which for the first time played league matches and finished 3rd in the Somerset Women's and Girls' competition Division 3 North. As the team was only formed in 2022 this was a great achievement, which was recognised at the club's Annual Dinner when members of the Ladies team received awards for their contribution to the club's success.

The men's first and second X1's had mixed fortunes in the Somerset Cricket League during the 2023 season, which was unfortunately badly affected by the weather. This resulted in an unusually large number of league fixtures being cancelled, but when we did get to play there were some exciting matches.

The club has fully implemented the ECB Safe Hands and ECB Anti-discrimination policies and the trustees thank those volunteers who helped with this.

Club membership continued to grow with over 40 senior members and 66 junior members together with parents and volunteers. The trustees are very grateful to all those who volunteered their assistance throughout the season.

All the charity's trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit when exercising their powers and duties.

This season the club ran training sessions for junior members at Under 7, 9 and 11 year groups. These sessions were led by qualified cricket coaches, and met on one evening during the week and on Sunday mornings from April to the end of the school term in July. The under 11 year group played matches against other clubs in Somerset on Sunday mornings and for many of the players this was their first introduction to competitive cricket. The juniors showed great enthusiasm in these matches and in all over 60 youngsters (both boys and girls) took part. Often there were more than 100 mums and dads watching and helping in the organisation of these games.

At the end of the season there was an awards evening at which every child was given a medal and exceptional performers were also awarded trophies.
