The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the Charity is to educate the public in the art and science of classical music and in particular to:

- Promote orchestral concerts in South Lakeland, particularly in Kendal.
- Manage a chamber orchestra formed of players principally from Cumbria and North Lancashire, but also from other areas as necessary, to take part in concerts for as long as the society considers such as orchestra viable.
- Introduce classical music to young people by running a Youth Education project in schools and elsewhere in the community.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The charity continues to operate the Lakeland Sinfonia Orchestra, which is composed principally of local and regional professional players and teachers to support their musical development.

During the year, Martin Hughes, former associate leader of Northern Sinfonia (RNS), and Head of Strings at the RCS, Glasgow, was appointed Artistic Director, and Fay Sweet, principal violist and animateuse was appointed Artists' Secretary.

During the period of this report from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025 Lakeland Sinfonia staged a total of four orchestral concerts, two of which took place in the Westmorland Hall of Kendal Leisure Centre, one in Kendal Town Hall and one in Holy Trinity Parish Church, Kendal.

In addition, the charity staged three Live & Local lunchtime chamber music recitals at the Old Laundry Theatre, Bowness-on-Windermere, and one at Kendal Town Hall.

Tickets for all these events were available to the public in addition to members of the charity and its donors.

The charity has continued the scheme to offer young people, usually sixth form students, the opportunity to act as 'Youth Ambassadors' in front of house roles at concert events. This experience is of great value to participants for their CVs and in applications for further education and employment.

At one Kendal primary school the charity operated a pilot scheme of the nascent Youth Education project with the objective of furthering the musical education, enjoyment and knowledge of the school pupils. Three visits to Castle Park School during May and June 2025 by players from the Lakeland Sinfonia orchestra were delivered at the school for Key Stage 2 pupils. Feedback from the sessions was highly positive.

In 2024-25 the charity was awarded an Arts Council grant for a project to deliver eight orchestral concerts plus some outreach events. This was partly delivered by the charity staging two orchestral concerts in the Westmorland Hall, and the pilot of the Youth Education Project.

The charity delivered the six remaining concert performances of the Arts Council project by contracting with the Glasshouse (Royal Northern Sinfonia) to have those concerts performed in the Westmorland Hall for an agreed fee per concert. This variation to the long-standing partnership between the charity and the Glasshouse (RNS) was to transfer responsibility for administration, ticketing and concert costs to the Glasshouse and has resulted in a significant reduction in the charity's turnover and potential financial liabilities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have agreed that sufficient unrestricted funds should be held to enable the charity to meet contracted amounts in the event of the society having to cancel a concert or season of concerts. The consequences of the policy are reviewed annually when the annual accounts are approved. The charity has an insurance policy to cover the costs in the event of a cancellation.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

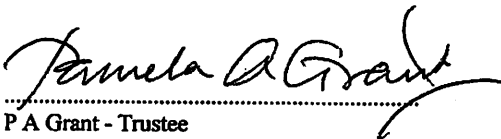

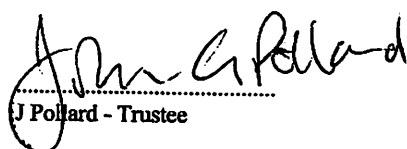

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 20% reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the Charity is to educate the public in the art and science of classical music and in particular to:

- Promote orchestral concerts in South Lakeland, particularly in Kendal.
- Manage a chamber orchestra formed of players principally from Cumbria and North Lancashire, but also from other areas as necessary, to take part in concerts for as long as the society considers such as orchestra viable.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the period of this report from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 the charity staged a total of eight orchestral concerts, seven of which took place in the Westmorland Hall of Kendal Leisure Centre and one in Holy Trinity Parish Church, Kendal. The Lakeland Sinfonia Orchestra performed at two of these concerts with the remaining six by visiting orchestras including Royal Northern Sinfonia (plus their Chorus at one event), the Halle and Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra

The charity continues to operate the Lakeland Sinfonia Orchestra, which is composed principally of local and regional musicians and to support their musical development.

In addition, the charity staged the first of a series of "Live and Local" lunchtime recitals at the Old Laundry Theatre, Bowness on Windermere with further such recitals being planned for the following financial year. Tickets for all these events were available to the general public in addition to members of the charity and its donors.

The charity established a partnership initially with one local school with the objective of furthering the musical education and knowledge of school students. One recital by players from the Lakeland Sinfonia orchestra was staged at the school. A saxophone quartet of four school students played "Welcome Music" before the start of one concert in the Westmorland Hall, giving them the opportunity to meet the internationally renowned sax soloist who played at that concert.

The charity has introduced a scheme offering young people, normally sixth form students, the opportunity to act as "Youth Ambassadors" in "front of house" roles at concert events. This experience is of value to participants for their CVs and in applications for further education and employment.
