**Objects and activities of the charity**

***The purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document.***

The company's/charity's objectives and regulations are regulated by the governing document adopted on 14 January 2022. Our charity Sincere Giving was formed to provide support and aid to Rohingya families living in internally displaced camps inside Myanmar Burma. Our campaigns focus on providing food packs, water, winter aid, community centres, schools and facilities for some of the most oppressed and destitute.

From the beginning we have provided food packs over the month of Ramadan and special Eid Gift packs which included both food and toys for children. We understand that displacement can have adverse effect on children and we aim to give them ease through gifts while helping build community centres and schools to empower them in the future.

***The main activities undertaken in relation to those purposes during the year.***

Through 2024 Sincere Giving continued to not only provide aid to the Rohingya families living in internally displaced camps inside Myanmar Burma. We also made an active effort to start a campaign to share more information on the history of what has gone on in Myanmar and its effects on the Rohingya people.

Our team researched and created easy to digest information that we showcased on the homepage of our website which is shared with our donors and supporters. This information highlighted who the Rohingya people are, where they're from, how they have been persecuted and how we can support them.

***The main activities undertaken during the year to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit.***

Water Well donations have been a popular way for donors to give in honour of their loved ones. Through the coming years we will look at growing this part of the charity to allow more donors to be able to give towards building and maintaining water wells. We have also been working closely with members of Tower Hamlets councils to help Sincere Giving add new clothes banks which we aim to collect clothes and recycle what we can and use a portion to help local homeless and families in need of clothes. Our hope is to get approved to have as many clothes banks in Tower Hamlets as possible.

***The degree to which the achievements and performance during the year have benefited wider society.***

From the inception of Sincere Giving, our most popular campaign has been our food distribution campaign. This year we continued this effort and provided food packs to over 200 Rohingya families. As well as this, our team has managed to raise money for several new water wells around the Arakan area of Myanmar, which will go on to benefit families for many years to come.

**Statement of the Directors' and Trustees' Responsibilities**

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011 and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. Notwithstanding the explicit requirement in the extant statutory regulations, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008, to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the SORP 2005, in view of the fact that the SORP 2005 has been withdrawn, the Trustees determined to interpret this responsibility as requiring them to follow current best practice and prepare the accounts according to the FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), .

In particular, the Companies Act 2006 and charity law require the Board of Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity as at the end of the financial year and of the surplus or deficit of the charity. In preparing those financial statements the Board is required to :-

### **Report of the Independent Examiner to the Trustees of the charitable company on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024**

I report to the Trustees on my examination of the financial statements of the charitable company on pages 7 to 15 for the year ended 31 December 2024 which have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) and with the Financial Reporting Standard 102, (effective 1st January 2016) as modified by FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), published by the Charity Commission in England & Wales (CCEW), and under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 12.

#### **Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and the Independent Examiner and the basis of the report**

As described on page 2 to 4, you, the charitable company's Trustees, who are also the Directors of the Company for the purposes of Company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011 and all other applicable law and with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice, applicable to smaller entities, and for being satisfied that the financial statements give a true and fair view.

The Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Section 144(1) of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) does not apply, and that there is no requirement in the memorandum and articles of the charity for the conducting of an audit, and that the accounts do not require an audit in accordance with Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006 and that no member or members have requested an audit pursuant to Section 476 of the Companies Act 2006. As a consequence, the Trustees have elected that the financial statements be subject to independent examination.

Having satisfied myself that the financial statements are not required to be audited under any legal provision, or otherwise, and are eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:-

- a) examine the financial statements of the charity under Section 145 of the Act;



## Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024

### 1 Accounting policies

#### *Policies relating to the production of the accounts.*

##### **Basis of preparation and accounting convention**

The accounts have been prepared on the accruals basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102, (effective 1st January 2016) and 'FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), published by the Charity Commission in England & Wales (CCEW) , effective January 2016, , and in accordance with all applicable law in the charity's jurisdiction of registration, except that the charity has prepared the financial statements in accordance with the FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), in preference to the previous SORP, the SORP 2005, which has been withdrawn, notwithstanding the fact that the extant statutory regulations, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 refer explicitly to the SORP 2005. This has been done to accord with current best practice.

##### **Risks and future assumptions**

The charity is a public benefit entity.

#### *Policies relating to categories of income and income recognition.*

##### **Nature of income**

Gross income represents the value, net of value added tax and discounts, of goods provided to customers and work carried out in respect of services provided to customers.

##### **Categories of Income**

Income is categorised as income from exchange transactions (contract income) and income from non-exchange transactions (gifts), investment income and other income.

**Income from exchange transactions** is received by the charity for goods or services supplied under contract or where entitlement is subject to fulfilling performance related conditions. The income the charity receives is approximately equal in value to the goods or services supplied by the charity to the purchaser.

**Income from a non-exchange transaction** is where the charity receives value from the donor without providing equal value in exchange, and includes donations of money, goods and services freely given without giving equal value in exchange.

##### **Income recognition**

Income, whether from exchange or non exchange transactions, is recognised in the statement of financial activities (SOFA) on a receivable basis, when a transaction or other event results in an increase in the charity's assets or a reduction in its liabilities and only when the charity has legal entitlement, the income is probable and can be measured reliably.

Income subject to terms and conditions which must be met before the charity is entitled to the resources is not recognised until the conditions have been met.

All income is accounted for gross, before deducting any related fees or costs.

##### **Recognition of liabilities and expenditure**

**Objects and activities of the charity**

*The purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document*

The company's/charity's objectives and regulations are regulated by the governing document adopted on 14 January 2022. Our charity Sincere Giving was formed to provide support and aid to Rohingya families living in internally displaced camps inside Myanmar Burma. Our campaigns focus on providing food packs, water, winter aid, community centres, schools and facilities for some of the most oppressed and destitute. From the beginning we have provided food packs over the month of Ramadan and special Eid Gift packs which included both food and toys for children. We understand that displacement can have adverse effect on children and we aim to give them ease through gifts while helping build community centres and schools to empower them in the future.

*The main activities undertaken in relation to those purposes during the year.*

Sincere Giving continues to provide aid to Rohingya families living in internally displaced camps inside Myanmar Burma. Through 2023 we provided families with Food Packs, Winter Packs and built water wells in remote villages in Myanmar. We also had the pleasure of providing 11 water wells over the course of 2023. These water wells provide safe drinking water for families in various villages across Myanmar. Animals and agriculture also benefit from the clean source of water.

*The main activities undertaken during the year to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit.*

In the start of 2023, we saw the tragic earthquake in Turkey and our volunteers and us saw a need to use our platform to help those effected by the earthquake. Within a matter of weeks, we managed to get essential aid collected, sorted and sent to Turkey. Our team went out and distributed the care packs to the families most effected. In total we managed to provide over 1,000 care packs made up of thousands of items donated by the local community. Many also gave their Zakat donations, which we distributed as cash gifts to families.

*The degree to which the achievements and performance during the year have benefited wider society.*

Our clothes donation efforts continued, we got permission from the local authority to put out 4 clothes banks in total which generated additional income for the charity which went on to provide funds to the Rohingya families and the upkeep of the community centres we built the previous year.

Through the coming years we will focus on working with our partner charity on the ground in Myanmar to work out what the families living there need most and start new campaigns to support their needs as well as continue our efforts to provide water wells, food packs and community centres.

This has been done to accord with current best practice.

##### **Risks and future assumptions**

The charity is a public benefit entity.

#### *Policies relating to categories of income and income recognition.*

##### **Nature of income**

Gross income represents the value, net of value added tax and discounts, of goods provided to customers and work carried out in respect of services provided to customers.

##### **Categories of Income**

Income is categorised as income from exchange transactions (contract income) and income from non-exchange transactions (gifts), investment income and other income.

**Income from exchange transactions** is received by the charity for goods or services supplied under contract or where entitlement is subject to fulfilling performance related conditions. The income the charity receives is approximately equal in value to the goods or services supplied by the charity to the purchaser.

**Income from a non-exchange transaction** is where the charity receives value from the donor without providing equal value in exchange, and includes donations of money, goods and services freely given without giving equal value in exchange.

##### **Income recognition**

Income, whether from exchange or non exchange transactions, is recognised in the statement of financial activities (SOFA) on a receivable basis, when a transaction or other event results in an increase in the charity's assets or a reduction in its liabilities and only when the charity has legal entitlement, the income is probable and can be measured reliably.

Income subject to terms and conditions which must be met before the charity is entitled to the resources is not recognised until the conditions have been met.

All income is accounted for gross, before deducting any related fees or costs.

##### **Recognition of liabilities and expenditure**

A liability, and the related expenditure, is recognised when a legal or constructive obligation exists as a result of a past event, and when it is more likely than not that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and when the amount of the obligation can be measured or reliably estimated..

Liabilities arising from future funding commitments and constructive obligations, including performance related grants, where the timing or the amount of the future expenditure required to settle the obligation are uncertain, give rise to a provision in the accounts, which is reviewed at the accounting year end. The provision is increased to reflect any increases in liabilities, and is decreased by the utilisation of any provision within the period, and reversed if any provision is no longer required. These movements are charged or credited to the respective funds and activities to which the provision relates.

##### **Allocating costs to activities**

Direct costs that are specifically related to an activity are allocated to that activity. Shared direct costs and support costs are apportioned between activities.

#### **Objects and activities of the charity**

##### ***The purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document.***

The company's/charity's objectives and regulations are regulated by the governing document adopted on 14 January 2022. Our charity Sincere Giving was formed to provide support and aid to Rohingya families living in internally displaced camps inside Myanmar Burma. Our campaigns focus on providing food packs, water, winter aid, community centres, schools and facilities for some of the most oppressed and destitute.

From the beginning we have provided food packs over the month of Ramadan and special Eid Gift packs which included both food and toys for children. We understand that displacement can have adverse effect on children and we aim to give them ease through gifts while helping build community centres and schools to empower them in the future.

##### ***The main activities undertaken in relation to those purposes during the year.***

Our slogan is "Together for those in need" and this year we really saw everyone come together to help us at fundraising events that we held throughout the year which included family fun days, car washes and football tournaments. Our volunteers have been a core part of our fundraising organisation. We also came together to complete a 5km run through Victoria Park. One of the highlights from our volunteers was when we asked for people to help us organise food packs, it was amazing how many families and individuals came to help us.

##### ***The main activities undertaken during the year to further the charity's purpose for the public benefit.***

Going forward we aim to provide more water wells, help even more families with food aid and start building a support network between our volunteers and people living in IDP camps. This will give the Rohingya people time to share their stories and help us inform more about what they're going through. We also have some fundraising events planned, one of these will include a fundraising trek and we also want to do a fundraiser where some of our volunteers will be able experience what it's like to live as an internally displaced refugee.

As we grow as a charity, we hope to not just provide financial and food aid to the Rohingya people but to also raise the awareness of their plight through videos, articles and infographics. To achieve this, we are building up our team of regular volunteers and securing a base for them to work from.

##### ***The degree to which the achievements and performance during the year have benefited wider society.***

Funds raised were distributed via our charity partners who are on the ground in Myanmar. We helped build 6 water wells, provide food packs to over 500 families, build 2 community centres, fix 2 more community centres and we continue to help Rohingya families throughout the year by identifying what they need to help them restore their lives.

### 1 Accounting policies

#### ***Policies relating to the production of the accounts.***

##### **Basis of preparation and accounting convention**

The accounts have been prepared on the accruals basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102, (effective 1st January 2016) and 'FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), published by the Charity Commission in England & Wales (CCEW) , effective January 2016, , and in accordance with all applicable law in the charity's jurisdiction of registration, except that the charity has prepared the financial statements in accordance with the FRS 102 SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities) 2015, (as amended by the Bulletin issued in February 2016), (The SORP), in preference to the previous SORP, the SORP 2005, which has been withdrawn, notwithstanding the fact that the extant statutory regulations, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 refer explicitly to the SORP 2005. This has been done to accord with current best practice.

##### **Risks and future assumptions**

The charity is a public benefit entity.

#### ***Policies relating to categories of income and income recognition.***

##### **Nature of income**

Gross income represents the value, net of value added tax and discounts, of goods provided to customers and work carried out in respect of services provided to customers.

##### **Categories of Income**

Income is categorised as income from exchange transactions (contract income) and income from non-exchange transactions (gifts), investment income and other income.

**Income from exchange transactions** is received by the charity for goods or services supplied under contract or where entitlement is subject to fulfilling performance related conditions. The income the charity receives is approximately equal in value to the goods or services supplied by the charity to the purchaser.

**Income from a non-exchange transaction** is where the charity receives value from the donor without providing equal value in exchange, and includes donations of money, goods and services freely given without giving equal value in exchange.

##### **Income recognition**

Income, whether from exchange or non exchange transactions, is recognised in the statement of financial activities (SOFA) on a receivable basis, when a transaction or other event results in an increase in the charity's assets or a reduction in its liabilities and only when the charity has legal entitlement, the income is probable and can be measured reliably.

Income subject to terms and conditions which must be met before the charity is entitled to the resources is not recognised until the conditions have been met.

All income is accounted for gross, before deducting any related fees or costs.

##### **Recognition of liabilities and expenditure**

A liability, and the related expenditure, is recognised when a legal or constructive obligation exists as a result of a past event, and when it is more likely than not that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and when the amount of the obligation can be measured or reliably estimated..

Liabilities arising from future funding commitments and constructive obligations, including performance related grants, where the timing or the amount of the future expenditure required to settle the obligation are uncertain, give rise to a provision in the accounts, which is reviewed at the accounting year end. The provision is increased to reflect any increases in liabilities, and is decreased by the utilisation of any provision within the period, and reversed if any provision is no longer required. These movements are charged or credited to the respective funds and activities to which the provision relates.

##### **Allocating costs to activities**

Direct costs that are specifically related to an activity are allocated to that activity. Shared direct costs and support costs are apportioned between activities.
