REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD 14 JANUARY 2022 TO 31 MARCH 2023

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 14 January 2022 to 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our charity's purposes as set out in the objects contained in the company's articles of association are:

The object of the CIO is the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation for the benefit of inhabitants of Avon, Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, Gloucestershire, Jersey, Somerset and Wiltshire by the provision of facilities for playing netball, including, but not limited to:

- (A) Providing netball activities, regional competition and training.
- (B) Supporting the development of individual players, coaches, officials and volunteers across all levels of the game of netball.

The CIO supports and endorses England Netball vision, mission and strategic goals. The CIO's own Vision is:

- for netball to be the number 1 sport for women and young people in the South West.

The CIO's own Mission Statement is:

- to establish netball in the South West as the first choice sport for women and young people either as a player, coach, official or volunteer and across all levels of the game.

Public benefit

In planning the charity's activities for the period the trustees kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The focus of the charity's activities during the period, which explains the delivery by the charity of public benefit, is set out above under 'objectives and aims' and below under 'achievement and performance'.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In January 2022 Netball South West was granted CIO status by the Charity Commission after c.18 months work by a task and finish group and with the full support of the rest of the board. All volunteers are to be thanked for their efforts in continuously developing and driving forward the organisation.

Highlights of the work achieved in the 12 months to March 2023 also included working alongside member county associations to deliver the following:

- A successful volunteer awards ceremony and ongoing support for volunteers across the region.
- A successful Game Conference for member coaches and officials
- Funding for members with Walking Netball Host Training who are now out delivering across the region
- Providing free access to clubs to enter the regional leagues
- Support for B award umpire assessments
- Continued provision of free Zoom account access to counties
- A free Trans Awareness course for volunteers
- Roll out of the new umpire mentor workshop
- Delivery of 3 senior and 2 junior leagues, successful delivery of the Regional Schools Tournament
- Support for clubs, schools and volunteers across the region

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Netball South West continues to be in a very healthy position financially. Income has only dropped slightly over the past 12 months (less than predicted) and outgoings were reduced due to Covid-19 constraints. The Member Give Back offer put in place early in the financial year accounted for most outgoings.

Principal funding sources

Netball South West's principal source of funds is from member affiliations. Going forwards we will be looking for external funding opportunities in order to deliver on our wider aims and objectives. A risk review carried out as part of the change in governance structure identified that reducing the reliance on member income would be prudent and was one of the contributory factors in deciding to apply for CIO status.

Netball South West does not act as a custodian or hold any assets on behalf of other organisations

Reserves policy

An unrestricted reserve of £9,000 is recommended by England Netball, and the trustees ensure that the reserves are always in surplus of this balance.

FUTURE PLANS

The trustees met on 24th March 2023 to plan for the new season. In addition to delivering its annual activities, Netball South West plans to offer the following opportunities for its members and prospective members:

1. Financial incentives for counties to develop 4 new clubs each
2. Signposting to training for counties that broaden members' understanding of equality and inclusion
3. An initiative that includes free access to up to 4 Walking Netball host training courses
4. Financial support for umpires wishing to develop towards their B Award
5. Bursaries for regional clubs who represent NSW at national finals
6. A tournament for state schools
7. A framework that will encourage counties to run an Over 40's tournaments in their area, with winners coming together for a regional final
8. A student offer for players at the University of Bath to support them dropping out from the game
9. An offer for ladies living in central Bristol to engage in sun and social netball

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

The charity is controlled by its governing document and is constituted as a foundation CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation). It was first registered with the Charity Commission on 14 January 2022.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES





1. TRANSFER FROM PREDECESSOR ORGANISATION

1 April 2022, the activities, assets and funds of Netball South West were transferred to this Charitable Incorporated Organisation

The activities of the CIO are reported here as for the year ended 31 March 2023.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Details of designated funds:

FP Reserve 2023-24

Income accrued over the previous year (2022-2023) from income including membership fees and bank account interest. These funds form the basis of the Financial Plan for the coming year.

Rise Again Funds

Established to provide an extra layer of financial support to members following the COVID pandemic and designed to provide financial support to counties, clubs and players to return to netball.

Strategy Development Fund

Established to provide strategic management within the NSW Region. Intended to provide support to Regional Management Board (RMB) to deliver aims and objectives, for example, through the hire of a Netball Development Officer from England Netball.

NDO Delivery Budget

Provides a source of income for the Netball Development Officer to meet targets agreed between England Netball and NSW RMB as part of the Service Level Agreement for the hire of the NDO.

Walking Netball Tournaments

Provides funding to the NDO to focus on the expansion of membership engagement through walking netball. Used to provide court hire, umpires, trophies etc for walking netball tournaments.

Community Development Fund

Established to provide support to members at grass roots level of netball and used for development of players, clubs, umpires etc. Examples of use include support to establish new netball clubs within the region.

Heather Crouch Fund

Funds bequeathed to NSW by former chair, Heather Crouch. Funds are used to provide financial hardship support to officials and players.

One Awards

Funds provided by NSW to provide an annual prizegiving award to celebrate the work of volunteers within the NSW region.

Volunteering Hardship Fund

Established to provide financial support to volunteers within the NSW region.

NSW Website Development Fund

Short term fund established to accrue funds for anticipated major update of NSW website and social media platforms.

Education & Training (Coaching)

Funds intended for the development of coaches at club level.

Education & Training (MtGL Game Conference)

Used to provide funds for Game Conference events such as that held in 2023. Events provide specific updates to players and officials on rules, development training for players and officials and training on matters such as mental health and wellbeing.

NSW Merchandise Shop

Safeguards income from the NSW Merchandise Shop. The shop is run by SWR Sports and provides income from donated profits of merchandise sales. Used to provide financial support to the Competition and Events Working Group.

Youth Group

Established to provide a focus for young people within the NSW region.

Competition and Events Working Group (CEWG)

Safeguards funds within the CEWG and includes the following:

Regional League 1 (RL) deposits

RL 2 deposits

RL3 deposits

RL pre-season warm up tournament accrued funds

RL Playoffs tournament accrued funds

Masters' and Under-19s accrued funds - this will be subsumed within the Cell Group NDO activities in 2023-2024.

U16 and U14 RL accrued funds

U12s Tournament accrued funds - this will be subsumed within Cell Group NDO activities in 2023-2024.

State Schools Tournament accrued funds - this will be subsumed within the Schools Education Group in 2023-2024

Regional Schools accrued funds. This is a major event for junior players involving 42 teams.

TRANSFERS BETWEEN FUNDS

Transfers are made between unrestricted funds at the end of every accounting period in cases where:

- i) the activity of the unrestricted fund has come to an end and there is an unspent balance that is not repayable to the funder(s), when the surplus is transferred to unrestricted funds; and
- ii) the unrestricted fund is in deficit and has either come to an end or there is no prospect of a surplus in a later period, when the deficit is eliminated by transfer from an unrestricted funds.
