Para 1.20	<p><b>During our first year, Prevent ALL was focused on initial fund-raising activities and promotion of our objectives. These included building a website and social media pages, engaging with local media.</b></p> <p><b>Our initial efforts on fundraising included community events, sponsored activities and local media promotion. The local community were key to supporting our efforts.</b></p> <p><b>We have also established a relationship with the Institute of Cancer Research, who's research into prevention of Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia we are aiming to support in the future. Our website has been built and explains this research and why this would benefit children in the future. We have met with the ICR to better understand the research and how we can help.</b></p> <p><b>We provide our first support to families and children undergoing treatment at the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford. We are aiming to expand these efforts in the future.</b></p>

Spent a total of £12,215 on operating expenses and our first grants. A balance at the end of the year of £8,780.</b></p> <p><b>The Trustees decided to retain these funds at year end to cover expected operating costs and to fund and upfront cost for future events.</b></p>
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	<p><b>Our policy for reserves aims to ensure that on a prudent basis the Trustees have sufficient reserves to</b></p>

		<p>continue operations. In setting the reserves we consider the following reasons:</p> <p>a) The risk of an unforeseen emergency or other unexpected need for funds, eg an unexpected large bill or finding 'seed-funding' for an urgent project</p> <p>b) Covering unforeseen day-to-day operational costs, eg employing temporary staff</p> <p>c) A source of income, eg a grant, not being renewed. Funds might be needed to give the trustees time to take action if income falls below expectations</p> <p>d) Planned commitments, or designations, that cannot be met by future income alone, eg plans for a major asset purchase or to a significant project that requires the charity to provide 'matched funding'</p> <p>e) The need to fund short-term deficits in a cash budget, eg money may need to be spent before a funding grant is received.</p>

Trustee selection methods including details of any constitutional provisions e.g. election to post or name of any person or body entitled to appoint one or more trustees	Para 1.25	<p><b>Eligibility for trusteeship</b></p> <p>(a) Every charity trustee must be a natural person.</p> <p>(b) No individual may be appointed as a charity trustee of the CIO:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if he or she is under the age of 16 years; or</li> <li>- if he or she would automatically cease to hold office under the provisions of clause 12(1)(e).</li> </ul> <p>(c) No one is entitled to act as a charity trustee whether on appointment or on any re-appointment until he or she has expressly acknowledged, in whatever way the charity trustees decide, his or her acceptance of the office of charity trustee.</p> <p>(d) At least one of the trustees of the CIO must be 18 years of age or over. If there is no trustee aged at least 18 years, the remaining trustees may only act to call a meeting of the charity trustees, or appoint a new charity trustee.</p> <p><b>Number of charity trustees</b></p> <p>(a) There must be at least three charity trustees. If the number falls below this minimum, the remaining trustee or trustees may act only to call a meeting of the charity trustees, or appoint a new charity trustee.</p> <p>(b) The maximum number of charity trustees is 7. The charity trustees may not appoint any charity trustee if as a</p>

		<p>result the number of charity trustees would exceed the maximum.</p> <p><b>Appointment of charity trustees</b></p> <p>(1) Apart from the first charity trustees, every trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.</p> <p>(2) In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.</p>
