STANLEY AREA YOUTH CONSORTIUM 2024

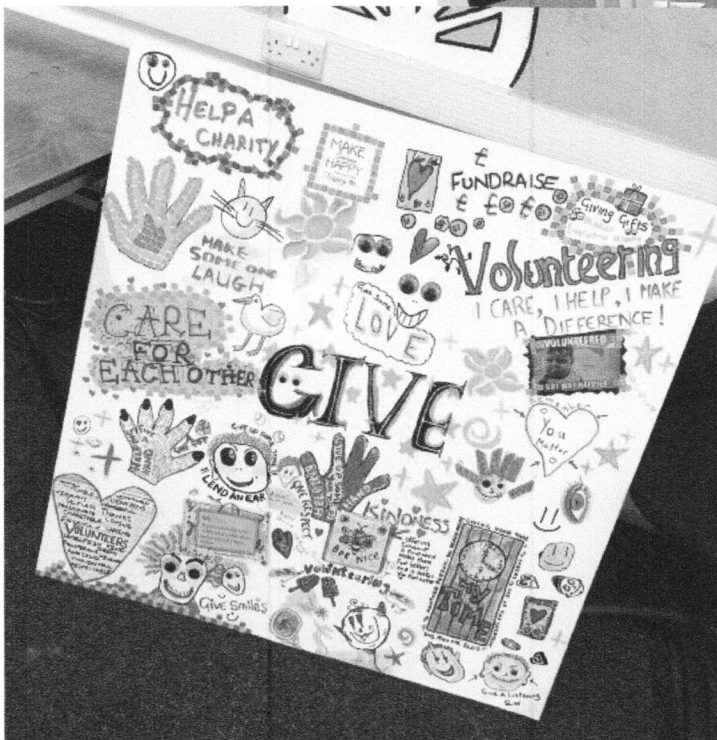
Much of 2024 was taken up with the Know Your Neighbourhood Project. The sessions connected volunteers with organisations and also looked at training needs and provided appropriate training as required. This culminated in a volunteer awards ceremony and celebration attended by over 100 people

The consortium linked up with NE Youth and the Youth Print North Durham partners providing joint activities and shared practice. Almost 100 young people took part in inter-youth provider activities.

The Consortium grant funded 2 sets of Spero Robots, this STEM based activity has been loaned to other youth organisations and uniformed services. Proving very popular and fun for young people who want to build on their programming and coding knowledge.

Fun and Food delivery has increased across Consortium partners, regularly achieving well over 80% of young people attending and qualifying for benefits based free school meals

The youth consortium peer mentors' group have gone from strength to strength mentoring younger club members to train up and become the volunteers and peer mentors of the future.





STANLEY AREA YOUTH CONSORTIUM 2023

As we move away from COVID 19, the youth consortium continue to support young people in the aftermath of the lockdown. A return to face-to-face session was very welcome and youth club numbers were significantly higher with many young people craving being around other humans. The young people were so happy to get involved with sports and team games.

A significant number of young people still felt withdrawn and we found out that coming back to normality while welcome, was quite difficult and the clubs worked to support and encourage these young people too. One to one support and the mental health journals and pack were among the tools used with support of the active peer mentors group.

A second mental health survey confirmed these findings and led the work for the consortium and the clubs. In this period 37 young people had extra support for mental health and reported that the support had been essential in making them feel better.

The youth consortium peer mentors group have gone from strength to strength mentoring younger club members to train up and become the volunteers and peer mentors of the future. A weekly training programme has been put in place every week to teach our new volunteers to be the youth workers of the future.

Accounts



After two tough years for families and young people, Stanley Area Youth Consortium and our partners were still dealing with the aftermath of COVID 19 with meetings and work being conducted online rather than face to face.

Our mental health survey highlighted how hard many young people had found the pandemic. Some had lost family or friends and many were left scared and isolated by the lockdown and the media representation. Many were worried how it would affect their learning and hated doing lessons online.

The youth consortium took young people's mental health very seriously, allocating a lot more worker time to supporting mental health within our clubs. The workers and peer mentors had worked throughout the lockdown supporting people with online chats and activities to try and ease the worry.

They decided to produce a mental health pack which could help young people with coping strategies and to recognise when things weren't right. They highlighted worries and concerns with young people they were working with and helped support them to use the pack. The feedback for the pack was good, with 23 young people using it and all of them said it helped them to manage their mental health.


