It is the intention to apply all investment income received to charitable purposes. These investments and properties are held as an endowment fund which is available for distribution if the trustees see fit. The trustees aim to retain reserves in the range of £10,000 to £15,000 to cover unexpected expenditure. At 31 March 2025 the trust held unrestricted reserves of £63,052 including a designation of £48,978 for a proposed building project. This leaves free reserves of £14,074.

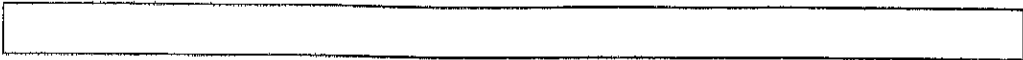
