Structure, governance and management

Governing Document

Dali Dog Rescue UK is established by Constitution and registered as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) with the Charity Commission in England and Wales on 6 April 2022 under charity number 1198532.

The charity's constitution was last amended 5 January 22.

Appointment of Trustees

Apart from the first charity trustees, every trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO. At present our Trustees have been selected from our known volunteer pool, for their skills and abilities.

Objectives, activities, achievements and performance

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The object of the CIO is, for the benefit of the Public, to relieve the suffering of dogs in Cyprus who are abandoned, stray or otherwise in need of care and attention, and which may be at risk of being euthanised.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

Support of the dogs flown to the UK by the Cyprus registered charity D.O.G Rescue Cyprus (Dali Organized Group). We introduce our charity to all new adopters bringing Dali dogs directly from Cyprus. This includes:

- sharing knowledge to help dogs settle in their homes,
- helping adopters source training & behavioural resources in their local area,
- looking for suitable homes for the dogs already in the UK when necessary,
- fundraising to keep dogs safe in both UK and Cyprus,
- participating in and growing the Dali Dog community in the UK,
- fostering awareness of rescue dogs and their needs

We continue to grow our website to help our rescue and work on building the information resource available on it. We supported 44 dogs into new homes in the UK.

Appreciation

We truly appreciate the support of our Dali family. Our adopters, fosters, volunteers and donors are all very much an integral part of rescue we are grateful for their continued support.

Financial review

The Trustees have adopted a reserves policy, which they consider appropriate to ensure the continued ability of the charity to meet its objectives. The Trustees aim to ensure reserves equal to 3— 6 months of operating expenditure are available, which we work to maintain.

Operational and Staff Report

Volunteers

Our volunteers are involved in interviewing and assessing prospective adopters, helping us match dogs to the right families. Some volunteers also provide advice and help monitor our groups and forums to help adopters find the help and support they need.

Our microchip administration is undertaken by a volunteer to ensure our dogs are protected with the rescue's lifetime support marked on their chip. Volunteers also help us run our auctions and participate in fundraising events.

We also have a homecheck coordinator who liaises with a third party charity called the Animal Team to ensure checks are carried out to the standard required.

Activities

Our Cyprus sister charity D.O.G Rescue Cyprus (Dali Organized Group), continues to feel the pressure from the sheer number of dogs in need of help in Cyprus.

In the UK we organised auctions and raffles as well as using our fundraising platform FUNDRAZR to raise funds to ensure we can support dogs in need of help in Cyprus and also in the UK.

244 dogs flew from our sister charity to the UK in this financial year and 26 of these flew to foster homes. We fly dogs directly to foster homes to try to help them find families as some dogs get overlooked and this can help them.

We homed 44 dogs in the UK. These dogs were either flown to foster homes or needed to find new homes due to changes in their families circumstances as people return to offices post covid, thereby showing the importance of a rescue back up team in the UK who can help ensure our rescue dogs do not become a burden on the already stretched UK system. We have 2 dogs in forever foster in the UK due to health reasons and 7 dogs who have benefited from rehabilitation in a kennel environment with 2 now successfully in homes.

Changes by some vets in their requirements for patient registration with regards to Brucellosis, led to us encouraging our sister charity in Cyprus to implement pre flight Brucellosis testing, which is now in place for all dogs flying to the UK.. Christmas cards and calendars continue to be created to help raise awareness and funds.

Risks

As the UK economic climate continues to prove volatile, there is a higher risk of dogs needing support as their families are forced to work longer hours or in roles that are not suitable for having a dog in their family.

There is also the ongoing concerns around vets in the UK creating new policies to manage their patients that are not part of the formal DEFRA entry requirements to the UK. We continue to monitor Brucellosis challenges through the experienced networks set up to assist and stay updated with the situation in the UK.

We are also concerned about the UK Government making changes to the ages that puppies can enter the UK as this will adversely affect the puppies we support, meaning that they will spend at least 6 months of their lives in kennels. The UK Government also cruelly want to prevent dogs who have been cruelly maimed before rescue by having ears cropped and tails docked from entering the UK. We are saddened at the effect this will have on dogs in rescue.

Vet bills in the UK are an ongoing risk and concern for dogs in foster and also for dogs who are with families who cannot afford to continue to care for them.

Related parties

We work closely with the Cyprus charity D.O.G Rescue Cyprus (Dali Organized Group) and have a Memorandum of Understanding with them. Our role is to support them in their aim of rehoming dogs from pounds in the local area of Dali, Cyprus to prevent dogs from being euthanased. We also help with finding potential adopters in the UK for dogs that are flown to foster homes.



Independent Examiner's Report to the trustees of Dali Dog Rescue UK



1 Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

- the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014.
- the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).
- and with the Charities Act 2011.

Dali Dogs Rescue UK meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

The board of trustees has a reasonable expectation that there are adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The accounts have been prepared under the going concern basis.

1.2 Change in basis of accounting

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year.

1.3 Changes to previous accounts

No changes have been made to accounts for previous years except reclassification of income based on additional information.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Recognition of incoming resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

2.2 Incoming resources with related expenditure

Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SoFA.

2.3 Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

2.4 Tax reclaims on donations and gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SoFA at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

2.5 Contractual income and performance related grants

This is only included in the SoFA once the related goods or services have been delivered.

2.6 Donated services and facilities

These are only included in incoming resources (with an equivalent amount in resources expended) where the benefit to the charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material. The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the charity of the service or facility received.

2.7 Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual

2.8 Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

2.9 Governance costs

Include costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

2.10 Grants with performance conditions

Where the charity gives a grant with conditions for its payment being a specific level of service or output to be provided, such grants are only recognised in the SoFA once the recipient of the grant has provided the specified service or output.

2.11 Grants payable without performance conditions

These are only recognised in the accounts when a commitment has been made and there are no conditions to be met relating to the grant which remain in the control of the charity.

2.12 Tangible fixed assets for use by charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £1000. They are valued at cost.

7 Transactions with trustees and related parties

All trustees are volunteers and do not receive any remuneration for their services.

No expenses were reimbursed to the trustees during the year (2023: £348).

The charity works in partnership with a Cypriot charity, D.O.G Rescue Cyprus, which is part of the same group "Dali Organized Group". Funds of £66,401 (2023: £69,895) were transferred to the charity with regard to dog adoption fees used to prepare the dogs to fly to the UK, flights, and assistance with the maintenance of the rescue center and welfare of the dogs in Cyprus.
