The EEEMRYWU continues to work towards its objectives these include:-

- i. Regular meetings with the NYA 5 per year
- ii. Attendance at the Centre for Social Policy
- iii. Work with George Williams College (Centre for Youth Impact) on Impact measures and Data ecosystems 8 meetings per year
- iv. Regular meetings with UK Youth 5 meetings per year
- v. Representation at National Boys and Girls Clubs

We have an increasing membership and meetings are well attended by organisational representatives. We are providing the sector with news, resources, reports and our developing website.

In the last quarter we have rolled out Bursary Round 6 with a Level 2 Award with 19 learners attending and a full Level 3 certificate course with 15 learners. We will be adding a further 5 learners for the last five units course. These learners have the Level 2 and are looking to top up to Level 3. We have commissioned Training providers for the September round of courses and will commence recruitment in July.

The region has also delivered the consultation events for the National Youth Strategy with activities for professionals and young people in both East of England and the East Midlands areas.

In the first stage consultation

Professionals – We held this at our RYWU meeting in breakout rooms, plus contributions from 6 additional events (involving eight organisations) – total number of professionals participating **64**

Young people – 2 events reaching 43 young – mixed groups included SEND, alternative education, NEET, in care, young carers, LGBTQ+

In the second stage consultation – for young people only
5 events held, eight groups involved, total number of young people **90**.

The unit has recruited Participation Youth Workers to develop and deliver our youth voice strategy in both East of England and East Midlands (one p/t worker in each area)

Finally, the Trustees met on Friday 20th June to continue implementation of the Unit's Strategic Business Plan and address the performance indicators set out in the funding agreement

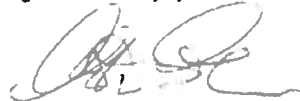

This year the charity has continued it's development pulling in additional financial support from the Department for Culture Media and Sports, and through the delivery of contracts with the National Youth Agency and George Williams College.

The contracted delivery has seen the provision of 120 training places for Level 2 and Level 3 Youth Work qualifications and the commissioning of five training organisations to deliver the courses. The continued provision of the Regional Impact networks in East of England and the East Midlands, and finally the delivery of a Healthy Data Eco system with youth work providers in Cambridgeshire.

The Regional Unit meets bi-monthly and has increased its membership and maintains a high level of attendance at meetings. The Trustees held a residential weekend in July and developed its Strategic Business plan for the next three years.

Core goals in the business plan are

- Grow our membership
- Increase our engagement with members
- maximise use of our resources
- Create a robust infrastructure for the organisation
- Ensure best practice in governance of the organisation and its resources
- To be at the forefront of shaping and influencing youth work policy in the region and nationally

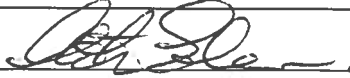

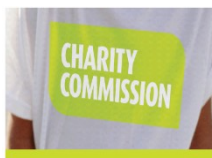
