- Identify immediate priorities/projects, including the further development of a Regional Youth Voice.

There have been very productive network meetings with good attendance from across the region. Members have benefited from being able to discuss national initiatives such as NCS, DCMS, NYA, British Youth Council and Prince's Trust. In particular the unit has worked with the NYA to establish themselves as a potential bursary training delivery partner.
