### **TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT**

#### **YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025**

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the organisation for the year ended 31 March 2025.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The aims of the charity shall be to:

For the public benefit, the prevention or relief of poverty in Derby, in particular but not exclusively by providing emergency food supplies and related provisions to individuals in need and to other charitable organisations in Derby working to prevent or relieve poverty

#### **SUMMARY OF THE MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT IN RELATION TO THESE OBJECTS**

In planning the activities for the year, the Charity kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and in all its meetings the Trustees ensured that this was the driving force behind the Charity's activities.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

- Despite increased pressures of demand for service, lead to us being less than 4 weeks away from running out of funds in August, to ending the year in the best financial position since becoming an independent charity in 2023.
- Distributed 19,575 food parcels with partners, ensuring that those facing food insecurity were supported during the cost-of-living crisis.
- This equated to £465,873 retail value of food making 176,175 meals within those parcels
- We supported 22848 Adults and 14283 children through these parcels
- We redistributed over £210,000 of surplus food that could have ended in landfill - increase of over £40,000 from last year
- For 2<sup>nd</sup> year in row we raised and spent over £100, 000 on purchasing food to ensure we could meet the supply and demand of those in need.
- Provided Christmas support on top of normal food parcel provision we provided 2642 meals via hampers or hot meals equating to 21,105 meals, including over 3200 children.
- We have supported with over 1200 applications for Household Fund support, winter essentials & over 800 children with school uniform in our summer campaign.
- We successfully secured funding to launch our new furniture and electrical project, helping those facing the challenge of making 'home' or eating.
- Led on 2 child poverty summits as part of our role within the Derby Poverty Commission and played leading role in development of Derby's Anti-Poverty Strategy.

#### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025

- Continued to increase the partner projects who work with us to a total of 19 food bank or community shop or pantries meaning we have offer in all wards of the city and over 30 warm welcome style projects.
- We have started development of a Derby membership scheme for accessing food support and working with external partner to open Derby's 1<sup>st</sup> Community Shop selling surplus food items at low cost.
- Took over the running of 1 community hub that was at risk of collapse and set up a new offer in one ward of the city. We are progressing to handover the 2 Warm welcomes we took over during last financial year.
- Celebrated 5 years of Derby food 4 Thought Alliance in March 2025.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### **Governing document**

Derby Food 4 Thought Alliance has as its registered office 30 Charnwood Street, Derby, DE1 1GU. is a CIO (charity registration No. 1198665) and registered with the Charity Commission on 20<sup>th</sup> April 2023.

### **Trustee selection**

The Trustees yearly undertake a skills audit to ascertain those skills that are required of trustees. Efforts are made to recruit as Trustees persons who have among them the range of skills necessary or desirable for the conduct of the Charity's work and fulfilment of its objects in its field of operation.

### **Risk management policy**

The Trustees examine the major risks facing Derby Food 4 Thought Alliance annually when updating business plans. Systems have been developed to monitor and counter such risks, to lessen any impact they may have in the future.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

### **Reserves Policy**

The charity has a reserves policy to hold three months running costs in reserves. At 31 March 2025 the charity had unrestricted reserves of £31,716.

### **Independent Examiner**

Mark Newey of Derby Community Accountancy Service and will be in office as independent examiner for the ensuing year.

### 1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### Organisation information

Derby Food 4 Thought Alliance's registered office is 30 Charnwood Street, Derby, DE1 1GU, At the end of the year there were 3 trustees.

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102, "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities applying FRS 102, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015. The organisation is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The accounts are prepared in Sterling which is the functional currency of the organisation. Monetary amounts in these financial statements to the nearest £.

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost convention apart from freehold property that is carried at market value. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

These are accounts for the year ended 31 March 2025 are prepared in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland. The impact on the reported financial position and financial performance for the previous year are not affected by the transition to FRS 102.

#### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the Board have a reasonable expectation that the organisation has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Board continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

#### 1.3 Charitable Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Board in furtherance of the general objectives of the organisation.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Board for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

#### 1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the organisation is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Gifts in kind have been included at market value of gifts received and in assets acquired. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

### 1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs relating to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources. Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in the support of the charitable activities.

### 1.6 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discounts offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

### 1.7 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

### 1.8 Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the organisation has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

### 1.9 Financial instruments

The organisation has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

#### *Derecognition of financial liabilities*

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the organisation's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

### 1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the year in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the board is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

### 1.11 Taxation

The organisation is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.

#### 1.12 Depreciation

Individual fixed assets costing £1,000 or more are capitalised at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful economic lives on a straight line basis as follows:-

#### **Community Action Derby**

Fund to support refugees with vital support.

#### **National Grid**

Fund to support residents of Derby in winter months with warm welcome offer and other support services.

#### **National Lottery**

Cost of Living Fund & Awards for All Funds to support the staffing and delivery costs of our core work to support those facing food insecurity over winter months

#### **Acorn Close Friendship Group**

The fund was spent on a monthly Warm Welcome and support.

#### **Community Care Hub**

Weekly Warm Welcome and Food provision to support residents of Spondon.

#### **Foundation Derbyshire (Our Abbey)**

Weekly Warm welcome provision based in Abbey Ward.

#### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the organisation for the year ended 31 March 2024.

#### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The aims of the charity shall be to:

For the public benefit, the prevention or relief of poverty in Derby, in particular but not exclusively by providing emergency food supplies and related provisions to individuals in need and to other charitable organisations in Derby working to prevent or relieve poverty

#### SUMMARY OF THE MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT IN RELATION TO THESE OBJECTS

In planning the activities for the year, the Charity kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and in all its meetings the Trustees ensured that this was the driving force behind the Charity's activities.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

- Despite challenging times for the voluntary and the rise in demand of support we raised enough support through donations and grants to meet all the charitable aims and objectives.
- Distributed 20,107 food parcels with partners, ensuring that those facing food insecurity were supported during the cost of living crisis.
- This equated to £489,772 retail value of food making 180,963 meals within those parcels
- We supported 23,380 Adults and 13,512 children through these parcels
- We redistributed over £170,000 of surplus food that could have ended in landfill
- Provided Christmas support on top of normal food parcel provision we provided 2622 meals via hampers or hot meals, including over 400 children.
- We applied for 913 applications for additional financial support helping a total of 1184 people (539 children)
- We raised and spent £110,254 on purchasing food to ensure we could meet the supply and demand of those in need.
- We successfully transitioned from being a part of Community Action Derby to an independent charity
- Increased the partner projects who work with us to a total of 15 food bank or community shop or pantries and over 30 warm welcome style projects.
- We successfully supported 5 projects to transition from a traditional food bank to a more dignified shop or pantry model.

- Took over the running of 2 warm Welcome projects that would have collapsed without out support.
- Celebrated 4 years of Derby food 4 Thought Alliance in March 2024.
- Had over 3397 bags, boxes or trays of food donated.

### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

#### 1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

##### **Organisation information**

Derby Food 4 Thought Alliance's registered office is 30 Charnwood Street, Derby, DE1 1GU, At the end of the year there were 3 trustees.

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102, "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities applying FRS 102, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015. The organisation is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The accounts are prepared in Sterling which is the functional currency of the organisation. Monetary amounts in these financial statements to the nearest £.

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost convention apart from freehold property that is carried at market value. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

These are accounts for the year ended 31 March 2024 are prepared in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland. The impact on the reported financial position and financial performance for the previous year are not affected by the transition to FRS 102.

#### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the Board have a reasonable expectation that the organisation has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Board continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

#### 1.3 Charitable Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Board in furtherance of the general objectives of the organisation.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Board for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

#### 1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the organisation is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Gifts in kind have been included at market value of gifts received and in assets acquired. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

#### 1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs relating to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources. Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in the support of the charitable activities.

#### 1.6 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discounts offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

#### 1.7 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

#### 1.8 Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the organisation has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

#### 1.9 Financial instruments

The organisation has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

##### *Derecognition of financial liabilities*

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the organisation's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

#### 1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the year in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the board is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

#### 1.11 Taxation

The organisation is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.
