### **Income:**

Our total income for the year was £22.78, generated entirely through cash donations in commercial outlets.

### **Expenditure:**

Expenditures were kept to a minimum, focused primarily on small-scale awareness materials and minimal administrative costs. Trustees have been working on a voluntary basis to ensure that donations are directed towards fulfilling our mission as much as possible.
