We work with a team of dedicated volunteer fundraisers, during the period we raised money through our online presence and various fundraising events.

We are still in the early stages of making funding applications to trusts and foundations to enable us to assist even more stray animals in the future.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

In our second year we have developed our fundraising strategy, primarily working with volunteer fundraisers, and managed to raise £19,414 in the period 2 April 2023 to 1 April 2024, and received donated services worth £2,000.

In this period, we continued running our outreach project in North Goa and reached in excess of 500 animals requiring sterilisation as part of our Animal Birth Control (ABC) programme, rescuing and treatment for injuries, parasite control treatment, or requiring a course of medicine. Towards the end of the period we purchased an ambulance for the project which will significantly increase the number of animals we can help.

We bought equipment and medicines to continue running the animal shelter in Agonda, South Goa, efficiently and to be able to reach as many injured animals as possible. We were able to assist over 1,500 animals in the period as part of the shelter's ABC programme and other rescue and treatment cases.

We worked very closely with the local communities to ensure all stray and beach dogs are being fed during the monsoon season when most of the businesses are closed and there is no one available to care for the animals and no one to report on any sicknesses or injuries. Through our monsoon feeding programme in North and South Goa we reached an estimated 200+ dogs.

We bought equipment and medicines to run the animal shelter in Agonda, South Goa, efficiently and to be able to reach as many injured animals as possible. We were able to assist over 300 animals in the period as part of the shelter's ABC programme and other rescue and treatment cases.

We worked very closely with the local communities to ensure all stray and beach dogs are being fed during the monsoon season when most of the businesses are closed and there is no one available to care for the animals and no one to report on any sicknesses or injuries. 
