Activities: We aim to provide gifts or experiences to the siblings of children undergoing cancer treatment. Those siblings are often isolated and confused with such extreme circumstances and upsets to their normal family life. This can quite dramatically affect family and sibling bonds for some time. Our purpose is to give them a treat to make them feel still valued and important within the family.

We have also started to support days out for siblings and their families by providing refreshments and gifts for the children. As the charity trustees of the Trust you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

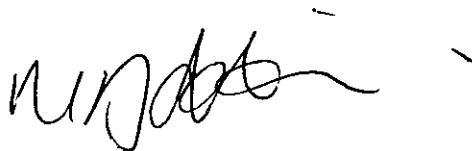

To relieve the needs of children up to and including 16 years of age, in particular within the Bristol area who are siblings of children with cancer, from the stress and isolation of seeing their brother or sister in treatment by providing gifts, packages, or days out ideally also with parent, grandparent or guardian or in a group of children in similar situations, and the provision of age-appropriate gifts to older children with cancer staying in hospital around Christmas time designed to relieve their needs.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

We have had steady start as new charity. Fundraising has generally been organic with minimal input for fundraising activities.

We have implemented the process for referrals and processed gifts or experiences for over 30 children. The process needed to be simple and efficient to allow hospital social workers to send the requests to us that we then purchase and send directly to the family. We have had good feedback on the way we are doing this. As part of the process, we ask for a comment about how the family feel our gifts would help the child involved. We have received extremely positive feedback from children's families stating that our gifts give them an important lift during very difficult times.

We were also requested to sponsor a sibling's workshop, organised by Bristol Children's Hospital. Whilst we were not actually in attendance, we sent gift bags and lunch for 8 siblings of children in active cancer treatment.

From our own experiences being in hospital with our children over Christmas we discovered that older children are not catered for as much as younger children. So, our other objective is to send into the hospital gifts targeting older children. This was very well received by the hospital.

During the year the trustees have always acted in the best interests of the charity in accordance with guidelines on public benefit provided by the Charities Commission.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We have had around 30 referrals, some for siblings with the same family and all feedback received has been very positive indeed. We are told we are making a difference.

We have sent gifts to the siblings of children in treatment for cancer. Feedback from families is extremely encouraging. A typical response from a family is this (children's names have been removed and replaced with X & Y)

"X has been largely without his mum since Y's diagnosis at the end of March as Y required surgery then intense rehabilitation/radiotherapy. Y is learning to walk and talk again after the brain tumour surgery. X is now faced with further disruption as Y will start Oncology regime and must remain at the hospital as an inpatient as too fragile and fatigued. X is only 9 and this diagnosis has turned his life upside down. These items will give him joy and he enjoyed choosing them. Thank you."

The pace we are working at is going well. During the year we have also sponsored two siblings' workshops at the request of Bristol Children's Hospital. These were designed to give siblings of children in treatment the chance to see where their brother or sister is being treated. We are pleased to have been asked to do this.

We also sent a large quantity of gifts to the hospital at Christmas. These gifts were chosen to target older children and were well received. This was in the form of 3 large gift sacks, cost exceeding £500 containing over two dozen gifts and was shared between two main oncology wards at Bristol Children's Hospital.
