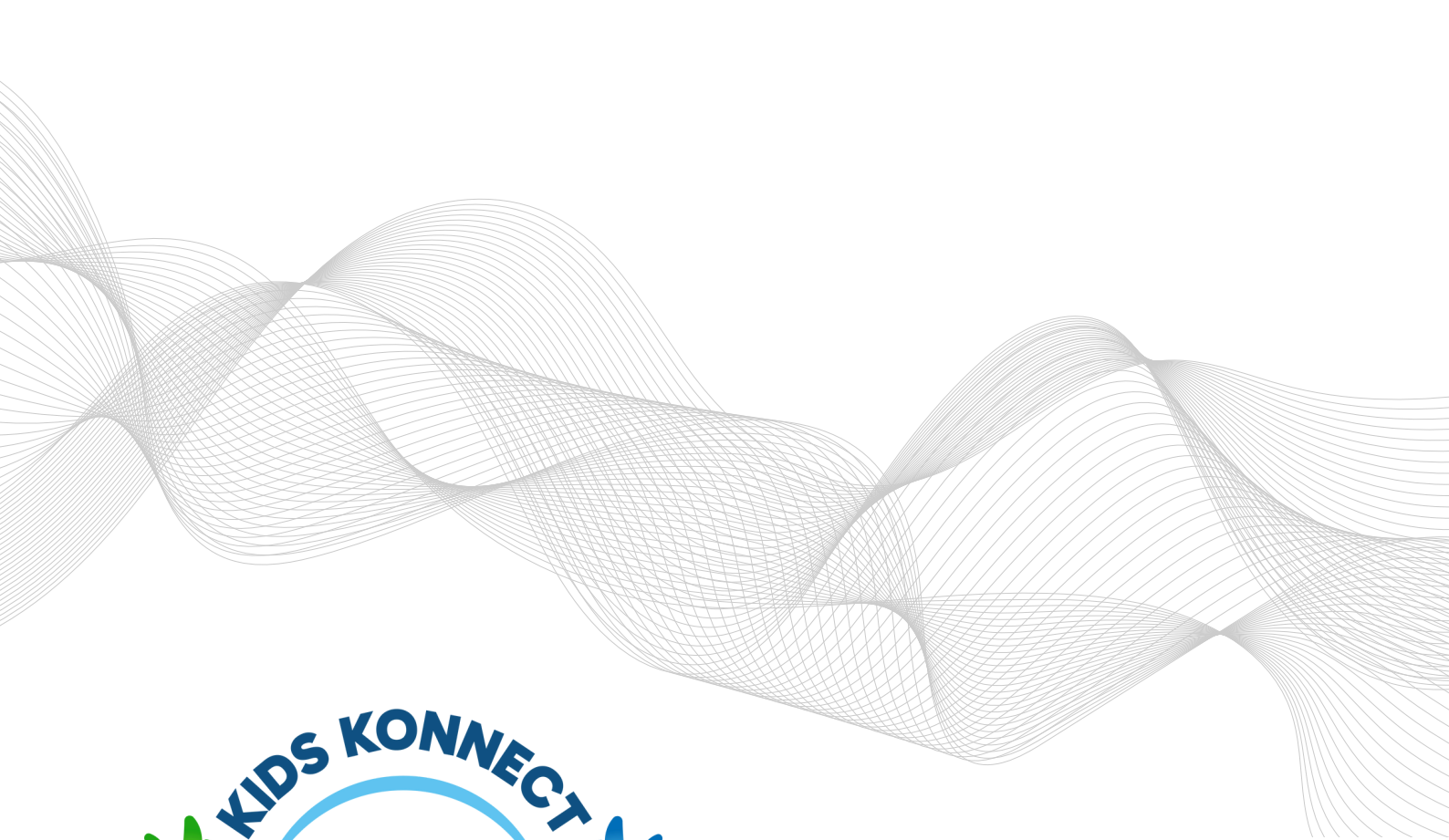

Founded in 2022, Kids Konnect Ltd. continues its commitment to empowering disadvantaged and vulnerable young girls in Hackney and Haringey. In 2025, we strengthened our trauma-informed, culturally sensitive approach to supporting girls facing poverty, social isolation, and mental health challenges.

Our work focused on creating safe, inclusive spaces where girls could develop confidence, resilience, and a sense of belonging, while also supporting families through practical assistance and community connection.

CHAIR / DIRECTOR'S FOREWORD

2025 has been a year of consolidation, growth, and deeper community impact for Kids Konnect Ltd. Building on the foundations laid in previous years, we focused on strengthening programme quality, partnerships, and organisational resilience.

We are proud of the progress made in expanding access to creative and therapeutic opportunities for children who are often excluded from mainstream provision. None of this would be possible without the dedication of our trustees, staff, volunteers, funders, and community partners.

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES IN 2025

Dance for Healing

serves 80 children weekly

Launched in 2025, Dance for Healing is our flagship creative wellbeing programme supporting disadvantaged and vulnerable young girls aged 6–18 in Hackney and Haringey. Using trauma-informed dance and movement, the initiative promotes emotional expression, resilience, confidence, and mental wellbeing.

Key highlights include:

- Structured dance and wellbeing sessions every weekend
- Targeted outreach to vulnerable girls facing barriers to arts participation
- Free meals and food education resources for families
- Safe spaces for peer connection and self-expression
- Culmination in a Grand Performance Show
- Accredited AQA certificates, opening pathways to education, arts careers, and future employment

Annual Performance Show

engages around 1000 children, families, and community member

This event showcases participants' talents, builds confidence, fosters community engagement, and celebrates cultural diversity among socially isolated girls in Hackney and Haringey.

Bridging the Gap

serves 300 children and their families

Supporting over 300 disadvantaged girls and their families, this programme provides culturally sensitive aid through food parcels, clothing vouchers, hygiene kits, and urgent household support. Financial literacy workshops equip participants with skills for long-term stability, resilience, and dignity.

Move Together: Sports & Fitness Weekend

engages around 300 children, adults, and families

A 3-day community sports and wellbeing event during Mayor's Community Weekend 2025, providing inclusive fitness, team sports, and wellbeing activities for children, adults, and families.

Holiday Activities and Food Programme

serves 150 children

Delivered from 5–19 August 2025, this programme offered children aged 8–15 nutritious meals, physical activity, and interactive nutrition education, fostering healthy habits and wellbeing.

Camp Shalom 2025

serves 50 children

A two-weeks summer programme for vulnerable and poverty-stricken children living in cramped conditions age 8–13, combining creative activities, fitness, arts and crafts, educational and recreational trips, physical and sport programs in a safe and culturally appropriate environment.

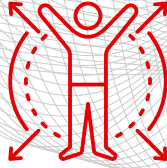

The organisation is overseen by a committed **Board of Trustees** who provide strategic leadership, financial oversight, and ensure strong governance in line with regulatory and legal standards.

- Secure sustainable funding to ensure long-term programme delivery

- Introduce new initiatives to enhance arts, sports, and wellbeing opportunities across Hackney and Haringey

Structure and Objectives

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is therefore governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. There are no investment restrictions.

The above trustees served throughout the period. The Board has the power to appoint additional trustees, as it considers fit. None of the trustees have any beneficial interest in the charity and did not receive any remuneration. The trustees are involved with in the running of the charity.

The objects of the charity are to advance in life and help young people through: -

1. The provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare, designed to improve their conditions of life, and;
2. Providing support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.

Developments and Activities

The charity's activities include providing weekly out-of-school-hours activities for young girls, quarterly meetings and events for young and teenage girls, annual shows for the public performed by our participants, annual trips to study heritage and history, quarterly meetings with professional educational panels for participants parents & general support to girls in need, in Hackney & Haringey.

The trustees consider that the performance of the charity this period has been most satisfactory. The trustees have identified the risks to which the charity may be exposed and systems have been established to mitigate these risks. The trustees have had due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission, including public benefit guidance.

During the year, the charity received donations of £58,141 (2024- £40,656) and expensed £24,413 (2024- £34,137) through charitable expenditure and support costs.

Reserves

Reserves of £13,753 (2024- £10,221) represent the available funds at the year end. The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity's activities.

Responsibilities of the Trustees

Company Law requires the trustees, who are also directors, to prepare a report and financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company at the end of the year. These must be in accordance with applicable law and regulations and in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (UK GAAP).

Company law requires that trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of its surplus or deficit for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to select suitable accounting policies, and then apply them on a consistent basis, making judgements and estimates that are prudent and reasonable. The trustees must also prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Basis of Independent Examiners' report



1) General Information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and a registered charity in England. The registered office is located at 80 Moundfield Road London N15 6BH.

2) Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Charities Act and applicable accounting standards including the SORP (FRS 102) subject to the revaluation of certain fixed assets and the non-provision of depreciation thereon.

The presentation currency is sterling.

Going Concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis as there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Incoming Resources

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds. It is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees. Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Holistic Development: Ensuring every girl is equipped to succeed academically, emotionally, and socially.

PROGRAMS AND EVENTS IN 2024

In 2024, Kids Konnect Ltd. continued to expand its reach and deepen its impact. Our diverse programs addressed both the immediate needs and long-term goals of the young girls and their families in Hackney and Haringey.

SINGING CLASSES

Rise and Sing has become a key program, using music to build confidence, social skills, and a sense of belonging. Through singing and teamwork, girls develop self-expression, form friendships, and strengthen their voices—both in music and in life.



ANNUAL PERFORMANCE SHOW

Showcasing the talents of socially isolated young girls, this initiative helps them overcome isolation, build confidence, and gain community support in Hackney and Haringey while celebrating their cultural backgrounds as part of the BAME community.



WEEKENDS AWAY

Rise and Sing has become a key program, using music to build confidence, social skills, and a sense of belonging. Through singing and teamwork, girls develop self-expression, form friendships, and strengthen their voices—both in music and in life.



PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES IN 2024

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

These sessions offered a fun and supportive environment for girls to develop leadership skills, teamwork, and physical fitness through sport.

NATURE WALKS FOR HER & WEEKEND GETAWAYS

These programs were designed to promote physical activity, mental well-being, and community building through outdoor activities and weekend retreats in local parks and natural settings.

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

Through program and culturally sensitive counseling, we provided mental health support to help girls manage stress, anxiety, and other emotional challenges.

BRIDGING THE GAP

Distribution of food parcels, clothing vouchers, hygiene kits, and financial literacy workshops to equip young girls and their families with practical skills in budgeting, saving, and money management

Singing Classes:

- Increased self-confidence among participants, as they found their voices both in music and in personal expression.
- Strengthened social bonds and friendships, reducing isolation and fostering a sense of community.
- Improved communication and teamwork skills through group singing and collaborative activities.
- Encouraged cultural expression, allowing girls to celebrate and share their diverse backgrounds through music.

Annual Performance Show:

Structure and Objectives

The above trustees served throughout the period. The Board has the power to appoint additional trustees, as it considers fit. None of the trustees have any beneficial interest in the charity and did not receive any remuneration. The trustees are involved with in the running of the charity.

The objects of the charity are to advance in life and help young people through: -

1. The provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare, designed to improve their conditions of life, and;
2. Providing support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.

Developments and Activities

The charity's activities include providing weekly out-of-school-hours activities for young girls, quarterly meetings and events for young and teenage girls, annual shows for the public performed by our participants, annual trips to study heritage and history, quarterly meetings with professional educational panels for participants parents & general support to girls in need, in Hackney & Haringey.

The trustees consider that the performance of the charity this period has been most satisfactory. The trustees have identified the risks to which the charity may be exposed and systems have been established to mitigate these risks. The trustees have had due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission, including public benefit guidance.

During the year, the charity received donations of £40,656 (2023- £42,578) and expensed £34,137 (2023- £38,876) through charitable expenditure and support costs.

Reserves

Reserves of £10,221 (2023- £3,702) represent the available funds at the year end. The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity's activities.

Responsibilities of the Trustees

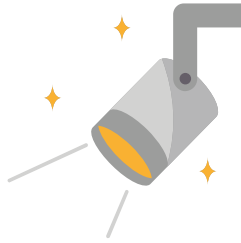
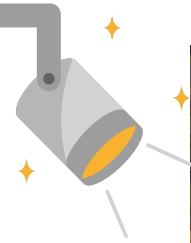
PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

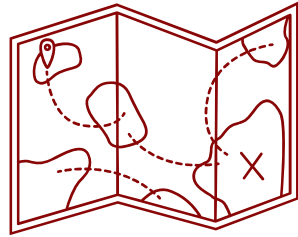


Annual Performance Shows:

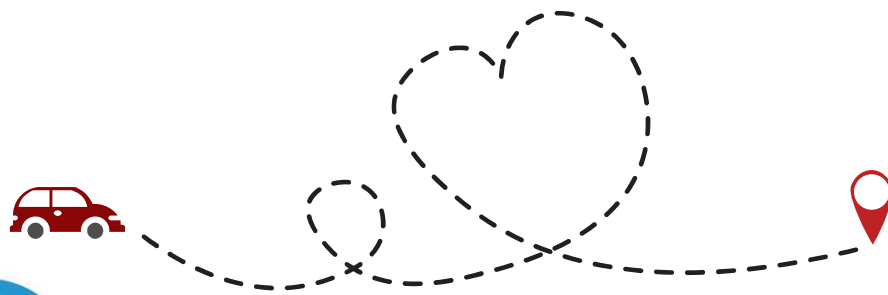




Heritage Trips:

Reserves

Reserves of £3,702 represent the available funds at the year end. The present level of funding is adequate to support the continuation of the charity's activities.
