Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Enterprises (FRSSE 2008)

There has been no change to the accounting policies (valuation rules and methods of accounting) since last year.

1.1 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation:

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on straight line basis for five years

2 Incoming Resources

Recognition of Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the Charity becomes entitled to the resources; the Trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Investment Income

This is included in the accounts when receivable

Expenditures and Liabilities

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the Charity to pay out resources.

Governance costs

Include costs of preparation and examination of statutory account, the costs of Trustee meetings and cost of any legal advice to Trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Assets

Tangible fixed assets

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year and cost at least £250. They are valued at cost or a reasonable value on receipt. Depreciation is charged at the following rates so as to write off the assets over estimated economic useful lives as follows.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities

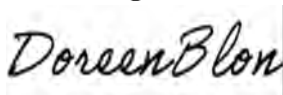

The Trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with charities Acts and comply with section 394 of the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Information for new charity trustees The charity trustees will make available to each new charity trustee, on or before his or her first appointment: (a) a copy of the current version of this constitution; and

		(b) a copy of the CIO's latest Trustees' Annual Report and statement of accounts. The charity trustees shall manage the affairs of the CIO and may for that purpose exercise all the powers of the CIO. It is the duty of each charity trustee: (a) to exercise his or her powers and to perform his or her functions in his or her capacity as a trustee of the CIO in the way he or she decides in good faith would be most likely to further the purposes of the CIO; and (b) to exercise, in the performance of those functions, such care and skill as is reasonable in the circumstances having regard in particular to: (i) any special knowledge or experience that he or she has or holds himself or herself out as having; and, (ii) if he or she acts as a charity trustee of the CIO in the course of a business or profession, to any special knowledge or experience that it is reasonable to expect of a person acting in the course of that kind of business or profession.
