- Grant applications during the year have not been successful yet, more are being written. Private donors have put up the funds to get new heating installed before winter 2025-26, which will be returned as and when funds are raised.
- Power supply has been upgraded to 3-phase, and installation date is set (September 2025).
- Faculty (planning permission) has been submitted and approval given.

- Researched and selected a number of grant-making bodies to apply for funding for major works in and around the church building in support of the charity's main goal of creating a community centre in the church building.

The charity currently has £722 in its bank account, a £123 cash float held by the Chair and no liabilities (e.g., loans).



