During the year we were again able to offer a reduced cost neutering scheme to encourage people to neuter their cats. We were able to neuter 202 cats / kittens during the year. All cats that would probably not have been neutered.</p> <p>Overall making a good contribution to the reduction of the overpopulation of cats without homes or support.</p> <p>In November 2024 one of our founders gave an interview to a local paper highlighting the increase in abandoned cats.</p> <p>Over the year we rehomed around 50 cats / kittens, providing them with any necessary vet treatment, and finding suitable adopters to place them in new homes. For 2022 the charity became the Community Partner for the Pets at Home Foundation, Keighley store. Fundraising in store and supporting their Foundation made us eligible for a share of their Santa Paws Fund, we received £2797 on 17 January 2023.

The charity operates alongside (but independently of) several local cat rescues and some national ones, to target specific local areas where there are significant number of stray / unneutered cats. Helping to reduce the number of unwanted cats.

Our major risks relate to the funds we have. We control the number of cats coming into / being helped by the rescue based on our funds available. In the year to 5 April 2023, we were lucky enough to receive 3 large donations, 2 from the Estate of Kirsty Murphy totalling £35483.05 in the summer of 2022. The 3rd donation came from another local Cat Charity - Keighley Cat Care, who donated £15000 to us on 6 May 2022.

This in turn has enabled us to donate £10400 to other small local rescues through the year.

Our main purpose is to rescue abandoned or in need cats in and around Keighley and Bingley (and surrounding areas). Seek to protect all cats and encourage people to take good care of them. Educate people on the importance of neutering, vaccinating and promote responsible cat ownership.

- Care for, vaccinate and neuter all cats in our care.
- To have all cats in our care examined by a veterinarian and microchipped.
- To ensure all cats in our care receive any treatment they require.
- To locate the owners of any lost cats where possible
- Scrutinise applications from members of the public who wish to adopt one of the cats in our care. Carrying out home checks and charging an adoption fee (a fee is charged in part to cover the costs of vet fees but is primarily charged at such a rate to establish that the adopters have the funds to look after the cat).
- To rehome the cats in our care with suitable adopter.

Members of the public are able to approach the rescue for help with their own cat or a cat they are aware of that needs help. This benefit is available to anyone but due to our limited space and funds we are forced to work on a priority basis. However, we do operate a waiting list process and can often help the cat at a later date. A cat in need of any vet treatment will always be given priority.

Our foster volunteers are vital to our operation. We operate a foster home-based care system for the animals in our care and rely on our foster volunteers to care for the animals within their own homes.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

While the rescue primarily looks to rescue, care for and rehome abandoned cats, cats in need we are highly motivated to educate the population on the need to neuter cats to help reduce the number of unwanted / stray cats. During the year we were able to offer a reduced cost neutering scheme to encourage people to neuter their cats. With a huge boost to our funds in the year we were able to neuter a significant number of cats that would probably not have been neutered. The offer was open to anyone with no need to prove income levels. Overall making a good contribution to the reduction of the overpopulation of cats without homes or support.

On average we rehomed 11 cats per month. In addition to neutering / microchipping and vaccinating, the cats in our care received any veterinary treatment they required to bring them back to health. Our vet costs for the year were nearly £70k which equated to approx. 80% of our total expenditure (excluding expenses) in the year.

Prior to 2021-22 we only dealt with one vet practice, early in 2022 we set up accounts with an additional 2 practices. This made it easier to operate across our area and also helped the public by being able to offer a selection of venues for our neutering scheme.

At the beginning of 2022 we applied for and were chosen as one of the Pets At Home Foundation community partners, connected to their Keighley store. This was a huge boost, not only as this would increase our donations of food and litter but also made us eligible for their Santa Paws Appeal which ran in December 2022.

In the Summer of 2022, our Chair, Laura Westcough took part in interviews for a local newspaper and a local radio station to highlight the uphill struggle facing cat rescues in our local area.
