- To promote and facilitate teaching of Hinduism within the educational system and outside it. To create an Institute of Hindu Studies UK for courses in all aspects of Hinduism to all ages from children to senior citizens. This can be linked to universities in the UK and abroad for certification.
- To publish high-class publications for teaching and learning Hinduism in the UK
- To create and maintain high-class resources for all stakeholders in the education of Hinduism in the UK

SACRE Membership

HEB UK worked with various Hindu organisations to identify and recommend SACRE members from Hindu Faith. For following SACREs, Hindu members were identified and recommended in the reporting period:

Inputs to Agreed Syllabus

SACRE member from Westminster SACRE requested review of Agreed Syllabus and coverage of Hinduism. Review was carried out and suggestions were provided to the member.

Diwali Assembly Campaign

Similar to year 2023, webinars were run in October 2024 on how to take assemblies on Diwali. HEB UK also prepared presentations for KS2 and KS3/4 students and these were shared with the workshop participants and more widely through our website. Over 70 people participated in the webinars and assemblies were given in more 50 schools across the UK. The webinars were conducted with the support of Vaani programme which provides training on speaking skills.

Working with Action for Harmony

Action for Harmony (AfH) is an informal group of organisations working towards causes of Hindu society in the UK. AfH organised Harmony Conference to discuss issues facing the Hindu society in the UK. HEB UK actively contributed in curating the conference content especially related education sector. We also presented keynote speech on state of Hindu Dharma in religious education in the UK and conducted three workshops on the topics of participation in SACRE, creating content and roles of mandirs in religious education.

GCSE Teaching Material Development

After Harmony Conference, HEB UK started work on a project to develop teaching material for GCSE Hinduism syllabus. The purpose of the project is to develop material that could be used by the teachers in the UK and the material would be of such high quality that would benefit the teachers and students. During the reporting period, total of 10 teaching plans were prepared for Year 10 Hinduism syllabus.

Other Stakeholder Engagement

HEB UK liaised with REC UK in order to get involved as member organisation. Discussions are ongoing for further involvement.

Financial Review

In reporting year 2024-25, HEB UK has income of £25,200 which was through donations from multiple organisations which wanted to support activities of HEB UK.

Currently HEB UK does not hold any reserves, however the trustees would review the financial strategy during coming years.

The trustees are also looking at how to build fund through donations and regular income to support future activities.





Activities Undertaken during Reporting Period

HEB UK conducted following activities during the reporting period:

1. Continuous Professional Development

Twyford Academies Trust invited HEB UK to conduct CPD for teachers on Hinduism. Prof. Nawal Kant Prinja conducted this online session on 31st October 2022. We received a very positive response from the trust.

“We were very grateful for the session and thought it was fantastic. It was clear, purposeful and well ordered. Following the session we have a few ideas on how we will implement some of the ideas and nuances into our lessons. It was particularly helpful to have information around polytheism and monotheism explained and whether stories are literal or metaphorical.”

2. SACRE Hindu Members Conference

HEB UK conducted online conference for SACRE members from Hindu community. The conference was attended by 45 individuals. The topic covered were as follows:

- Role of Key National Organisations- REC, NASACRE

- Experience Sharing
