C. Objectives and Activities

Objectives:

2. The advancement of education for the public benefit, in relation to the environment and the natural world, in Surrey and Hampshire and in such other parts of the United Kingdom as the Trustees may determine, especially in relation to children and young people.

Main Activities

Forest Kids exists to enable children and young people in the Ash area and beyond to find a place of belonging where they can explore the Christian faith, improve their mental and physical wellbeing, and cultivate an interest in and care for the natural environment. This is done through regular age-appropriate group activities in a woodland setting.

The Charity was formed in July 2022, and started running activities for children in November 2022. The Charity has been offered the use of Candle Wood, adjoining Henley Business Park, free of charge for sessions with children, and this has been very suitable for its needs so far.

Transport for the children to get to Candle Wood has been provided by renting a minibus from Woking Community Transport, whose help and support is gratefully acknowledged.

D. Management and Performance

The Charity has continued its work in delivering woodland-based sessions, with an expansion from fortnightly to weekly sessions during term time in the summer of 2024. This increase was made possible through the recruitment of a new volunteer. Termly family events have continued, along with pre-session home visits.

Each session welcomed up to 18 children, with an average attendance of 11. Over the year, 16 new children joined, with referrals primarily coming from a local school. Participants have continued to enjoy learning bushcraft skills, deepening their understanding of the natural environment, and engaging in discussions about the Christian faith and positive life choices. A noticeable increase in confidence has been observed in many of the children. Parent feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, particularly highlighting improvements in social skills and connections.

The Trustees extend their sincere gratitude to the volunteers who support the charity's events. Their dedication and willingness make it possible for the Charity to continue its valuable work. The Trustees met three times during the financial period.

The Trustees have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning activities. They are confident that the Charity's activities as outlined in this report meet the public benefit requirements.

Financial Review

The Charity's first financial period ran from 20 July 2022 to 31 December 2023. Subsequent periods end on 31 December in each year.

The Charity's main source of income is regular giving from individual supporters (£10,584). Most giving comes via Stewardship, which collects Gift Aid on the Charity's behalf. Total income for the period was £10,700.

The Charity's main expenditure consists of salaries and pension (£5,689), equipment and materials for sessions (£1,202), and the hire of minibuses for transport (£1,424). Total expenditure was £9,257, leaving a net surplus of £1,443 and total reserves of £4,020. The Trustees consider that these reserves are sufficient for the Charity's needs.

The Charity has no restricted funds. The Charity does not hold any investments for income generation, or any interest in land.

The Charity has not made or received any grants.



The Charity was formed in July 2022, and started running activities for children in November 2022. The Charity has been offered the use of Candle Wood, adjoining Henley Business Park, free of charge for sessions with children, and this has been very suitable for its needs so far.

Transport for the children to get to Candle Wood has been provided by renting a minibus from Woking Community Transport, whose help and support is gratefully acknowledged.

D. Management and Performance

The Charity began children's activities through the use of volunteers, including the Team Leader, Sarah Adamson. Contributions to the Charity's work through friends and networks brought in funds more quickly than expected, with the result that it was possible to employ Sarah for one day a week from December 2022.

Children were contacted principally through schools, churches, community organisations and social media.

Volunteers have come through contacts made in local churches.

Initially it has been possible to run fortnightly sessions on Saturday mornings in school term time. The Trustees anticipate the possibility of running weekly at some point in 2023, as team numbers permit.

Between ten and fifteen children have attended each session. Activities include games, bushcraft learning and pursuits, learning about the woodland environment, and faith-based stories to help children explore the Christian faith in a relaxed and unpressured environment.

Once a term, the Charity has invited carers and parents to be present and engage in activities alongside the children.

Home visits are made in the week preceding each session, to build relationships with the children and their families.

The Trustees were appointed by the Charity's foundation document, its CIO Constitution. No new appointment of trustees has been made during the financial period. The Trustees met 6 times during the financial period.

The Trustees are very grateful for the volunteers who help to run the charity's events; without their hard work and willingness, it would not be possible for the Charity to carry out its work effectively.

The Trustees have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning activities. They are confident that the Charity's activities as outlined in this report meet the public benefit requirements.

E. Financial Review

The Charity's first financial period ran from 20 July 2022 to 31 December 2023. Subsequent periods will end on 31 December in each year.

The Charity's main source of income is regular giving from individual supporters (£12,382). Most giving comes via Stewardship, which collects Gift Aid on the Charity's behalf. Total income for the period was £12,598.

The Charity's main expenditure consists of salaries and pension (£5,891), equipment and materials for sessions (£1,594), and the hire of minibuses for transport (£1,196). Total expenditure was £10,021, leaving a net balance of £2,557. The Trustees consider that these reserves are sufficient for the Charity's needs.

The Charity has no restricted funds. The Charity does not hold any investments for income generation, or any interest in land.

The Charity has not made or received any grants.
