STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Objectives and activities

Har Sewa Medical Trust is registered as a not-for-profit charity in the UK. Its activities are managed by an Executive Committee of Trustees of up to six members, supported by a team of volunteers.

Our overall aim is to provide medical, educational, and general well-being treatment, advice, and support to people from underprivileged backgrounds, primarily in India, who do not have the means to pay for treatment. This support can make a huge impact and improve the quality of life for individuals, families, and their communities.

India has a high prevalence of avoidable blindness and basic medical needs. We have been doing medical Camps in India since 2017, mainly in Punjab. We also learnt through our work in Panjab and other parts of India that the reason people do not come forward for treatment is due to a lack of education, money and support from their communities. More recently, we have started sponsoring local primary schools and bringing gyms to a standard for better wellbeing.

- To raise funds in the UK and to minimise our administrative and other costs so nearly all the funds we raise are used for providing quality medical services and wellbeing services
- To raise awareness about the causes of various diseases, the importance of good health and regular exercise the effect it has on individuals and communities who have no access to adequate health care.
- To not only look at the medical model of disability (treating the cause) but also the social model of inclusion in a society where medical intervention is not an option, and how the use of aids can help to maximise independence for people whose vision and hearing are impaired through the use of low visual aids.
- Finding volunteers in the UK and the countries where we operate who will support us with fundraising in the UK and local fundraising, promotion and the running of extensive annual medical camps in the countries where we operate.

All our volunteers are truly committed to fundraising, raising awareness about avoidable illnesses, attending meetings, and attending medical camps in other countries.

We started with a group of about 7 volunteers, and over the years the numbers have grown to 20 and include young people, working and retired Individuals.

We work with community leaders in the countries in which we operate. They give up their day-to-day work to support us in our role within the community.

The network of people we work with in the UK and India continues to grow, and this is a key area in the growth of the charity.

A key element for Har Sewa Medical Trust is that all Executive Trustee members and volunteers pay for their travel and accommodation in India and the other countries within which we operate.

A Typical Medical Camp – February 2024

Our medical camps begin long before the first patient arrives, with extensive research conducted by our dedicated medical volunteers to identify areas with the greatest need for healthcare services. Once a target community is identified, careful planning is undertaken in collaboration with local residents and key stakeholders to ensure that essential services are accessible and well-organised.

A crucial part of the planning process involves identifying suitable service providers and facilities. This includes hospitals, local transport links, and a registration site, typically a school building or community hall, with ample outdoor space as well as rooms for medical screening and consultations. These facilities accommodate a range of specialists, including doctors, opticians, dentists, and audiologists, among other healthcare providers.

Local volunteers are also recruited and trained to support both the planning and execution of the camp. Their knowledge of the area and community is invaluable in ensuring the camp runs smoothly and efficiently.

The Har Sewa Medical Trust, comprising executive trustees and volunteers, carefully coordinates the logistics for all visiting volunteers. This includes travel arrangements from airports, train stations, and coach services to the campsite. For volunteers travelling from the UK, the journey typically involves a nine-hour flight to Panjab, followed by approximately half a day's travel by car to reach the camp location. To facilitate smooth operations, the team generally stays together in one village, allowing for daily morning and evening debriefings to review progress and address any challenges.

The February 2024 camp was held in the village of Moranwali, Panjab, India, with the support of World Cancer Care. As the latest initiative in Panjab, this camp achieved several significant outcomes:

- **Cancer Screening and Awareness:** World Cancer Care followed up with treatments and tests for cancer patients, including mammography, pap smears, PSA tests, bone scans, and blood cancer evaluations. Educational lectures were conducted in groups to raise awareness about all forms of cancer, and free literature was distributed to attendees.
- **Patient Reach:** Specialist doctors from well-known local hospitals attended the camp, seeing an estimated 6,300 patients over the duration of the event.
- **Laboratory Tests:** Modern Medical Laboratory, Mediscan Lab, and Panam Nursing College Lab conducted over 2,100 blood tests, providing critical diagnostic support.
- **ECG Screening:** More than 600 patients received free ECG tests.
- **Eye Care:** Over 1,550 patients received eye tests, resulting in 695 patients being prescribed corrective glasses, 1,460 receiving free eye drops, and 220 diagnosed with cataracts, of whom 158 patients underwent successful surgery.
- **Chronic Disease Detection:** 80 patients were diagnosed with diabetes, 150 with high blood pressure, and 15 with previously undiagnosed heart conditions, highlighting the importance of preventative screening.
- **Dental Care:** Around 163 patients were examined by dentists and received treatment as required.

The February 2024 camp in Moranwali stands as a testament to the dedication of our volunteers, the cooperation of local partners, and the commitment of organisations like World Cancer Care. By bringing essential healthcare services directly to underserved communities, we not only provide immediate treatment but also raise awareness, encourage preventative care, and support long-term health improvements in the region.

A typical medical camp

February 2023

This started with research carried out by our medical volunteers to find a suitable area of need. Planning to locate essential services within that area is completed with the help of locals in the area and key stakeholders. An essential part of this was finding service providers and locations such as hospitals, local transport and a registration site in the local area. This needs to be typically a school building or local community hall with lots of outside space as well as rooms to do the screening and checking by doctors, opticians, dentists and audiologist's other providers.

We also found local volunteers that we could work with and rely on to help us plan and run the camp.

The Har Sewa Medical Trust, comprising executive trustee members and volunteers, spent time working through the logistics and practicalities of how volunteers will get to the local camp area, including airports, and train and coach travel. Volunteers travelling from the UK had a 9-hour journey to Panjab and then about half a day travel by car where the camp was being held. The team usually all stay in one village so that we can do our morning and evening debriefings easily.

The camp was held in the village of Moranwali Panjab India and supported by World Cancer Care. As this was our latest camp in Panjab, we achieved the following; -

- World Cancer Care has followed up with treatments and tests for mammography, pap smear, PSA bones and blood cancer for cancer patients.
- Lectures had been arranged in groups for awareness of all cancer and free literature was handed out to all.

- Specialists from known local hospitals had attended to see an estimated 6,000 patients that attended the camp.
- Modern Medical Laboratory, Mediscan Lab and Nursing College Panam Lab conducted over 2,000 blood tests for patients.
- Over 500 patients attending the medical camp had free ECG tests.
- Over 1500 patients had eye tests which resulted in 795 patients given corrective glasses, 1400 patients given free eye drops, and 200 patients being diagnosed with cataracts of which 163 patients have been successfully operated on.
- 80 patients were diagnosed being diabetic, 150 were diagnosed with high blood pressure, 15 were diagnosed having heart diseases which they were not aware of being attending the camp.
- 150 patients were seen by dentists and treatment was given.



This policy of continuous improvement has meant our medical camps and other activities are better organised with better outcomes each year.

Our Trustees are hardworking and carry out their duties without remuneration and this voluntary work has helped Har Sewa Medical Trust to prosper over recent years.

Our financial position continues to improve through the receipt of donations and HMRC Gift Aid. We made a surplus of £871 for the period ended.

Following our success in India considering extending the scope of our charitable work to other areas of the world.
