The 2024 Rally was able to show case farming practices of yesteryears.

The Rally offers an opportunity to showcase traditional farming practices from earlier times. The Charity has demonstrated various aspects of agricultural life, such as ploughing fields, harvesting using a combine harvester that produces straw for animal bedding, and processing crops like corn and wheat for human consumption (such as flour) or animal feed, depending on the quality of the yield. Vintage vehicle displays also evoke nostalgic memories for attendees. The event provides a social opportunity for friends and family to reconnect and meet with those they have not seen in some time.
