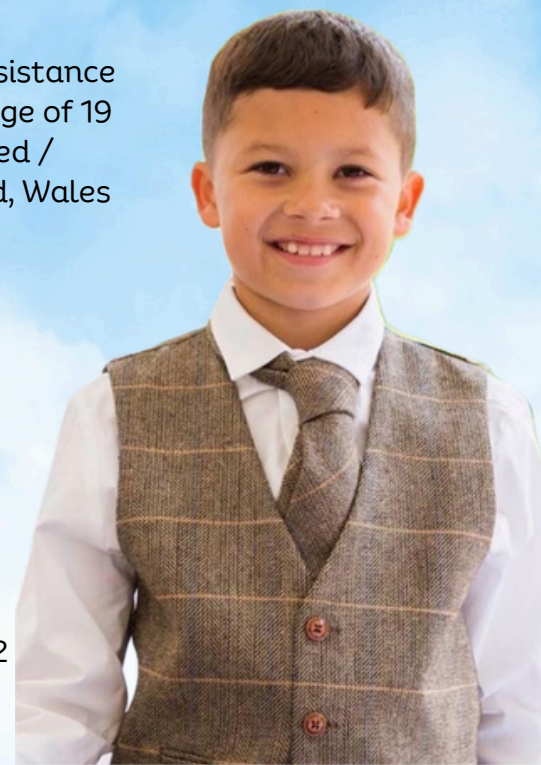

Activities and Achievements

Harlee's Angels continues to provide support to families across the UK who have experienced the sudden loss of a child. During the year ending 31 March 2025 the charity continued its core mission of ensuring that no family feels alone following the unexpected death of a child.

During the year the charity funded counselling support for bereaved families and was able to assist approximately six families with financial grants to access specialist bereavement counselling and support services.

The charity also continued to host monthly Grief Café sessions, providing a safe and supportive environment where bereaved parents and families can meet, share experiences and support one another. In addition to providing direct support, Harlee's Angels undertook a number of fundraising and awareness activities throughout the year. These included participation in events such as the Dorset Plane Pull and the ABP Southampton Marathon. The charity was also invited to AFC Totton to raise awareness of the charity's work and collect donations with the support of the charity's mascot, Harbo.

Harlee's Angels was honoured to be selected as a beneficiary of the Netley Marsh Steam and Craft Show and received a donation of £500. The charity also hosted a successful Great Gatsby Gala Ball at The Grand Hotel in Southampton, raising funds to support its ongoing services.

The charity attended a number of community events including the Oasis Academy Mayfield Christmas Fayre, the St James Park Summer Festival in Shirley, the Babies' Necessities event and local fundraising events organised by schools and community groups. Valentine Primary School and Hamble FC both hosted fundraising events in support of the charity.

During the festive period, the charity also delivered Christmas parcels to the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) to support families spending the festive season in hospital.

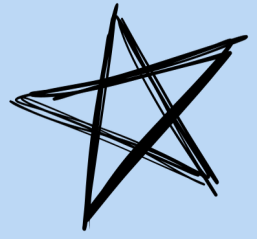

Harlee's Angels also hosted regular Grief Cafe sessions, held at Southampton Crematorium. These sessions provide a safe and supportive environment for bereaved families to meet others who understand their experiences, helping to reduce isolation and support emotional wellbeing. The charity continues to work closely with Southampton General Hospital, particularly the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU). During the year the charity delivered Christmas parcels to families with PICU to

To relieve the needs of families in Southampton and the surrounding area experiencing bereavement from the sudden death of a child up to the age of 17 by grant funding for counselling support and essential household costs.

Objectives of the charity

It is the intention of the charity to provide financial assistance in the form of money or bank transfer to families who are on proven low income.

Referrals to the charity for financial assistance will be via the PICU at Southampton General Hospital, Local General Practitioner or by direct contact with the charity through the web site / messenger / Facebook.

The criteria for referral will be that the child will be aged up to 17 years and will have passed away following an accident, sudden or unidentified illness. The reason for these criteria is that at present most charities are in place to assist with children who have either passed or are in palliative care for known illnesses. The sudden and unexpected death of a child is very traumatising for the whole family, they will not have had time to process the death or its reason, to say final goodbyes or to spent time and make memories with that child before their passing. In the event of an accident, they may even have been unable to hold their child before funeral arrangements are made. This can affect the persons mental health and will result in the need for immediate counselling and time of work.

The purpose of the financial assistance is to support the family in the initial period following the death of their child, it is anticipated that this time scale will be in the first year, however this will be considered on a 1-1 basis and decided by the trustees/founders. The financial assistance is to benefit the whole family, identified as mother, father, guardian, siblings and grandparents, to be used for the purpose of funding private 1-1 counselling, as free counselling is often unavailable immediately following the death and when most needed, to be used to assist with paying rent and mortgage payments, utilities bills and household and grocery bills, as the beneficiary will be dealing with grief and unable to work and may not be entitled to sick / bereavement pay through their employment, especially for the self-employed or those on zero hour contracts. This financial help is to alleviate the pressures to cover essential bills.

The charity will provide food parcels, items will be considered on a 1-1 basis, depending on needs and size of the family concerned and will be considered by the trustees and founders.

Assistance for counselling can also be provided. Families can also apply for assistance with funding days out. Consideration will be by agreement with the trustees / founders and the above criteria will apply in all cases.
