About the work we do.

Activities

We are delivering Shona language to a group of Children from Zimbabwe which is their first language and or their parents first language including the teaching of the Zimbabwean culture, customs and traditions.

We practice " Mobile Library" which is an outreach to Communities facing similar or the same challenges in life and ways of how that can be overcome. We work with people with lived experience.

We also deliver befriending services to the community ,those people who face isolation and distress.

We periodically engage into sporting activities with young people and Adults including walking and ball games.

Financial Status

We currently do not have any sponsor or

doner and our activities are solely self funded but we are in the process of making financial applications.

We therefore do not have a financial record of money spent in the financial year.

Structure and How it is Managed.

The team meets up to plan and agree on activities to be done. Sometimes we do zoom meetings and each member has a leadership role in the activities we do and we engage volunteers where need be and go through the necessary safeguarding checks prior to commencement.

Volunteers also sign the volunteer forms before activities.

Public Benefit

The Communities that we work with

including families have been transformed as the Children are enjoying the multicultural benefit and understanding the historical context of migration and the benefits of a multicultural society.

We are seeing an improvement in individual beneficiaries that we work with psychologically and emotionally as they are now able to express how they feel and seek help before relapsing.

The sports aspect is helping a healthy lifestyle and improving the physical and mental wellbeing of the beneficiaries

2. The Charity did not make an income during this reporting year.

3. Devuli Helpers Trust UK abides by very strict rules of transparency and accountability as documented in our Constitution.

4. We participate in various activities which are aligned with our charitable purposes. We engage in the following

activities

(a) Mental health awareness campaign, we do our awareness on zoom with Professionals , beneficiaries and other stakeholders or partners. This promotes social inclusion and it builds trust with our beneficiaries who will open up more.

(b) Hospital visits, we identify patients in collaboration with hospital staff who do not have relatives or any friends and we talk to them. This fulfills social exclusion according to our purposes.

(c) Visiting targeted communal places such as food banks, the and the Job Centre to speak to clients and advise if need be particularly on employment empowerment.

5. Hospital visits are one of the most important events that touch the emotion , physical and psychological wellbeing of the beneficiaries in a positive way.

6. The challenges that we face is that we do not have a Trust vehicle and we use our own cars and we use out of pocket expenses on fuel and food. We are applying from different sources for funding our activities.

7. Chairman- Jaspan Mudekunya who oversees the daily running of the Organisation, approves in activities to be done, sourcing for work spaces, applies for funding, organises meetings and events including hosting most zoom meetings.

Secretary- Cathrine Nhatiso- Responsible for writing reports, activities and keeps the register of the beneficiaries, partners and other stakeholders. She also leads the drama, netball and amateur choir team.

Treasure- Terence Maison. He is responsible in the opening of bank accounts. Documents income and expenditure. Provides organisations with

the balance sheet and bank statements. He is responsible for hospital visits and befriending services.

Fagesi Mudekunya is a committee member and replaces everyone during their absence. She leads sports and employment empowerment. Participates in all types of visits.

8. We are very functional as trustees and we have supportive volunteers who come but not very consistent. We need to keep appealing for volunteers to join us.

FINANCIAL POSITION

1. Devuli Helpers Trust UK did not get funding during this reporting period. We have been sustained by out of pocket expenses.

2. All the Trustees of the Organisation are employed and we have mutually agreed that we use our own resources to archive our charitable goals.

3. Devuli Helpers Trust UK does not have funds in the bank account, it does not have assets nor liabilities.

FUTURE PLAN

1. We are planning to continue applying for funding and identifying more beneficiaries.

2. All the activities we have done in the past years will continue.

We may do some fundraising activities in the following year as may be permitted by Council and allowed by the law.

3. We need to identify an income generating project such as import and export of goods to raise money for the charity to be able to self sustain in the long term.

1. The name of the trust is Devuli Helpers Trust UK.

It's charity number is 1200379.

Purposes- Devuli Helpers Trust UK exists to promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society.

2. The charity had no income during this reporting period except activities to fulfil our charitable purposes.

3. It is very important that as an Organisation we are transparent in all activities that we do and financially. We are also obliged to be accountable in all

aspects of our practices.

4. We have been involved in sports, physical exercises during this period. These activities helped the young people to be engaged and it promotes social cohesion and boosts moral. This has helped the young people not to embark on drug and alcohol misuse and or abuse. The activities improved the health of the participants and has created entertainment to onlookers.

We also participated in Drama . This improves social inclusion, identifies talent and mould it and helps community integration.

Our charity participates in befriending services and hospital visits. This helps the beneficiaries from isolation and stigma. Some of our beneficiaries do not have family and we are there to provide emotional and psychological support.

5. On 17 ,December 2022 , 07 January and 21 January 2023 we focused and participated in walks and other physical exercises all age groups. It was a milestone for those not used to walk and those that never got encouraged. The local communities were interested in identifying who we are and expressed their interest in joining us therefore promoting social inclusion.

6. The challenges that we faced were financial as we needed to book the spaces that we operate and payments were needed. We were lucky to get well wishers and get free spaces from them or other charitable organisations doing similar activities. Sometimes we would deep in our pockets to sustain activities.

7. Our Trustee, Felandino Mwamba is the sports Coordinator and supervises all activities. The drama Club is led by Jaspan

Mudekunya including the hospital visits. Fagesi Mudekunya is responsible for befriending services and works with other volunteers.

8. The activities are arranged and organised through zoom meetings or physical meetings. The Chairman endorses all proposed activities and approves them.

9. There has been conflict of interest in that most of our activities are done on Saturdays and for some Saturday is a working day but we had to work things out. After the death of our Secretary Pamela Veremu on 1st November 2022, there was a huge gap left in the Organisation. We finally got a replacement and all is now moving well.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The charity had no income during the reporting period and we relied on

handouts.

Most of our activities did not require funding so we had to work with the available resources.

The charity does not have any assets or liabilities. It's rented Office is in the house of the Chairman.

FUTURE PLAN

We plan to apply for funding from the National lottery fund and other financial Institutions.

We are planning to increase the number of our beneficiaries this year especially the young people.

The Charity is planning to open a shop to fund its future activities. Once capital is secured, we are planning to open a sculpture shop to sell African Sculptures and souvenirs.
