OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Objects of the CIO are: The relief of the poor and needy in Colchester and any other part of the United Kingdom or elsewhere in the world, or such other charitable purpose, as the members of the CIO shall in duly constituted meeting direct.

These activities are considered to be for the public benefit and in running the Charity the Trustees have regard for the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

APPLICATION OF INCOME

After the success of our water containers to Mongolian families last year we decided to continue our work in Mongolia. We agreed to fund further education for disadvantaged students in the village that we supported last year. £2,000 was sent to Mongolia, £1,000 from our funds and £1,000 grant from Rotary Foundation.

£500 was donated to the Rotary Charity End Polio Now which has the ambition of eradicating Polio from the world. £425 was spent on securing electronic Tablets for Ukrainian school children living in Colchester. £500 was given to the Anti Loo-Roll Brigade for their work with SEN Children over Christmas. £500 was also given to Coates4Kids providing children from low-income homes in Colchester with new warm coats for winter. Money was allocated to provide 57 Christmas Dinner food packages, continuing our work with HomeStart. £500 was given to Greenpath ventures to create raised beds for their new allotments at Yarra Farm. £400 was donated to Colchester Toy Library to replace broken toys push chairs etc. Finally, £750 was donated to Essex and Herts Air Ambulance from the proceeds of a Quiz Night.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Building on the success of our first two years we continued and expanded our projects and helped new causes. We joined forces with Colchester Forum Rotary Club for the Garden Party where even with horrendous weather we managed to raise £1000 so that each Club could donate £500 to Post Polio Now.

Our links with HomeStart continue and we supplied Christmas dinner food packs for 67 families, Santa for their Christmas party and Easter Eggs at Easter.

We supported a new charity to us (Coats4Kids) enabling 27 children at a local school get new coats for the winter.

We helped ALRB with their Santa grotto and Christmas parties for SEN children.

We managed to get a local company to make a flat pack Santa Sleigh along with two Reindeer. This was invaluable with our Christmas Collections. We also managed to collect at three supermarkets, Tesco, ASDA and ALDI.

We introduced Greenpath Ventures to Yarra Farm, a charity supporting people of all ages with SEN providing a safe space to grow fruit and vegetables.

Our bees were incredibly industrious, and we managed to raise over £800 from their efforts.

We also supported Colchester Toy Library and Kids Out Toy Box appeal.

Our final event of the year was a quiz night where we managed to raise £750 for Essex and Herts Air Ambulance. All in all a very fruitful year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the current Statement of Recommended Practice (FRS102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value. The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the Charity is responsible in law.

The financial statements are prepared in pound sterling (£) with the level of rounding being to the nearest pound.

Funds

Unrestricted funds - are funds (including legacy funds) which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects, at the discretion of the members of the Club for ordinary purposes.

Restricted funds - are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when funds are raised for particular purposes, these can be way of donations or events and activities. Any balance unspent at the end of the year must be carried forward as a balance on that fund.

Unrestricted and restricted funds are as shown on the Statement of Financial Activities.

Incoming Resources

Voluntary income - donations are recognised when received. Tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is credited when the income is recognised.

Grants and legacies - to the Charity are accounted for as soon as the Charity is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the Charity is reasonably certain.

Other ordinary income – Income from events and activities are accounted for gross.

Income from Investments - Dividends are accounted for when due and payable. Interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue.

Gains and Losses on investments - Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 30 June.

Resources Expended

Grants - Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the Charity.

Activities directly relating to the Charity - All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed Assets

Investments - Investments are valued at market value at 30 June.

Current Assets

Debtors and prepayments - Amounts owing to the Charity at 30 June, including expenditure incurred in advance, is included under debtors and prepayments.

Transfers between funds

Transfers between restricted and unrestricted funds - are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Activities. Transfers between unrestricted and designated funds are disclosed in the notes to the accounts. The most common is when funds are set aside for particular purposes.

These activities are considered to be for the public benefit and in running the Charity the Trustees have regard for the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

APPLICATION OF INCOME

By observing our objectives, we have we have continued with some of the projects started in our first year and added to them. The Yarra farm rewilding project is expanding drawing in help from a third local Rotary Club, Funding generated during the year has been spent on an observation shelter, bee keeping equipment and a path through the site to the shelter. Following the success of the Christmas meal packages, we provided another 50 that were distributes to needy families in the Area with the help of HomeStart Colchester. We completed the project to supply bicycles to the Ukrainian evacuees and gained another grant to help by giving electronic tablets to those pupils to help in their school studies. We funded a project in Mongolia to assist families transport clean water to their homes. We also supported the Rotary initiative End Polio Now.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Following on from a successful start last year we continuing to receive support from local businesses and channel this support into the local community needs. Again, we held our Christmas collections outside ADSA and Tesco in Colchester, borrowing Manningtree's Santa Sleigh which again helped to increase footfall and takings. Some of the money raised went towards the Christmas Dinner Package's.

The Yarra Farm rewilding project is expanding after its initial launch and has become very popular with the four local schools with SEN children. By establishing a path this has enabled access for wheelchairs and the shelter to provide relief from the sun. The bees were active and looked to be producing a lot of honey.

Helping those in need internationally is also an objective of ours and after identifying a need in a remote village in Mongolia, with the people there living in severe poverty, households required a means of transporting fresh water to their accommodation, money was raised via a grant from Rotary Foundation and a fund-raising BBQ.

As well we provided electronic pads to Ukrainian evacuee school children and money donated to Kids Out to provide toy boxes.

To summarise, we have made good use of our contacts to secure funding and donations to help both local and international projects, the charity continues to perform with great energy.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Charity's financial position is as set out in the attached accounts and is considered satisfactory.

Reserves Policy

The Charity's policy on reserves is to maintain sufficient reserves to enable the Charity to continue to achieve its principal objectives.

We will continue to support HomeStart with the Christmas meals, increasing the numbers if required. Expand the Christmas collections to more sites and build our own Santa Sleigh removing the need to borrow one.





Basis of financial statements





Grants and legacies - to the Charity are accounted for as soon as the Charity is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the Charity is reasonably certain.

Other ordinary income – income from events and activities are accounted for gross.

Income from Investments - Dividends are accounted for when due and payable. Interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue.

Gains and Losses on investments - Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 30 June.

Resources Expended

Grants - Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the Charity.

Activities directly relating to the Charity - All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed Assets

Investments - Investments are valued at market value at 30 June.

Current Assets

Debtors and prepayments - Amounts owing to the Charity at 30 June, including expenditure incurred in advance, is included under debtors and prepayments.

Transfers between funds

Transfers between restricted and unrestricted funds - are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Activities. Transfers between unrestricted and designated funds are disclosed in the notes to the accounts. The most common is when funds are set aside for particular purposes.
