Object and Purpose	The object and purpose of the Foundation is to advance the education of pupils at St. Ann’s School, Hanwell, by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities and or resources (not required to be provided by the local education authority) for education at the school. And, for the public benefit to promote the education of people under 25 years old with special needs and supporting staff/care workers in St. Ann’s School, Hanwell, in such ways as the charity trustees believe fit, including: delivering training/ awareness courses, providing extra curricular or post 19 activity provisions.
Summary of Main Activities	We held a number of fundraising events, including a Christmas market, carol singing, and our involvement in the Hanwell Carnival. In addition, we organised activities to raise awareness of disabilities, such as producing picture books on disabilities, marking World Mental Health Day, and supporting Learning Disability Week. Grants were awarded to promote the wellbeing of both staff and pupils at St. Ann’s School. All events and initiatives were carried out in line with the Charity Commission’s guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Summer 2024 The Foundation's official website was successfully launched this year, with the generous support of a volunteer who has taken on the design and ongoing management of both the site and the Foundation's social media platforms. These channels now serve as key means of showcasing the Foundation's work, achievements, and community impact.

Elthorne Park High School continued its commitment to supporting the Foundation as its Charity of the Year. This valuable partnership between the Foundation and local schools has grown steadily, strengthening ties within the community. Elthorne Park High School also joined forces with St Ann's School for their Summer Arts Festival, further embedding the collaboration between the two schools and raising awareness of the Foundation's aims.

This year also marked the Foundation's first appearance at the Hanwell Carnival. Trustees, supported by volunteers, led a lively parade through the town and hosted stalls to raise both funds and awareness. The event proved to be an excellent opportunity to connect with the wider community and share the Foundation's mission.

In addition to these activities, the Foundation was delighted to sponsor the school prom for leavers as well as the end-of-year celebration at St Ann's School. These events were a highlight for pupils, providing a joyful opportunity to mark their achievements, celebrate friendships, and create lasting memories. The Foundation's contribution ensured that all pupils could take part in these special occasions, reflecting our commitment to supporting not only education but also the wellbeing and happiness of young people.

We remain deeply grateful to all those who have supported the Foundation financially, including individual donors and those who have undertaken fundraising on our behalf. Their generosity and commitment have been vital in enabling the Foundation to continue and expand its work.

Autumn 2024 To mark World Mental Health Day, the Foundation provided resources to support the wellbeing of staff at St Ann's School. A special parents' mental health meeting was also organised, offering families the opportunity to share experiences, receive guidance, and highlight the importance of mental health within our community.

The Christmas season was celebrated on a larger scale this year, with events proving both festive and memorable. The Christmas Raffle drew great enthusiasm, with a range of prizes on offer. The star prize – two Eurostar return tickets – was met with particular excitement. The winners later shared their joy and recounted how much they enjoyed using their tickets, a reminder of the positive impact these events bring to families.

The Foundation also partnered with Elthorne Park High School for a carol singing event at Paddington Station. Their wonderful performance drew in commuters and visitors alike, spreading festive cheer while raising awareness of the Foundation's work.

Trustees and volunteers took part in the Christmas Huts at Ealing Broadway, using the opportunity not only to raise funds but also to promote disability awareness among the wider public. The stalls provided valuable engagement with local shoppers and helped shine a light on the Foundation's mission.


The Christmas Market at St Ann's School was another great success, with more stalls than ever before. Parents, pupils, and visitors all enjoyed the lively atmosphere, and the event provided pupils with the opportunity to showcase and develop their skills. The market highlighted the strong sense of community at the school and the ways in which festive celebrations can bring people together.

Spring 2025 In February, the Foundation organised a trip to the Twist Museum in central London for pupils of St Ann's School and their parents. The outing provided a wonderful opportunity for families to spend time together, explore an engaging cultural venue, and enjoy a memorable day out.


The Foundation also supported the school through the provision of key resources. Sports mats were donated to enhance pupils' learning and physical development, while practical equipment, such as microwaves, was supplied to support staff during lunchtimes. These contributions, though modest, play an important role in enriching daily school life for both pupils and staff.

A particular highlight this year was a special exhibition of pupils' artwork at a gallery in Ealing Broadway. The exhibition gave pupils the chance to express their creativity, while also offering valuable work experience in preparing, curating, and presenting their art to the public. Visitors were able not only to appreciate the talent and effort on display but also to purchase pieces, providing pupils with a sense of pride and achievement. This event was a powerful reminder of how creativity can build confidence and foster community engagement.



ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Autumn 2022	<p>The Foundation was officially established, marking a significant milestone for our organisation. To celebrate and kickstart our efforts, we organised carol singing sessions in collaboration with MTR Elizabeth Line Ambassadors. These festive events took place at Ealing Broadway Station and Hanwell Station, providing us with an opportunity to connect with the community and raise funds in a public setting.</p> <p>This initiative was particularly special as it was the first time we stepped out not just as a school, but as a recognised charity. The success of these carol singing sessions opened the door to further discussions with MTR Elizabeth Line, laying the groundwork for potential future partnerships. This collaboration promises to enhance our outreach and impact, aligning with our mission to serve and benefit the community through charitable activities.</p> <p>We also received grants from Lidl and Clothworkers' Foundation to make the purchase of an accessible vehicle possible.</p>
Summer 2023	<p>The inaugural picture book, <i>The Wheelchair Walk</i>, was produced and introduced to our students. To help them engage with the story, we held poetry sessions within the school, allowing students to delve into the narrative and its themes.</p> <p>In addition to these sessions, the Foundation organised two short parades around Hanwell, which was enthusiastically supported by local businesses and school staff. This event not only brought the community together but also highlighted our commitment to raising awareness about disabilities.</p> <p>Furthermore, copies of <i>The Wheelchair Walk</i> were gifted to various local establishments, including shops, the library, and schools. This distribution aimed to extend the reach of our message, fostering a greater understanding and awareness of disabilities within the community.</p>

Autumn 2023 The Foundation leveraged World Mental Health Day to both raise awareness of mental health issues and generate funds for our initiatives. The event received overwhelming support from families and school staff, many of whom donned green attire and made donations to demonstrate their commitment to the cause.

In December, trustees and volunteers organised a series of festive Christmas celebrations. The highlight was the inaugural Christmas Market, held in the school hall. Students and staff collaborated to design and produce various items for sale, showcasing the practical life skills learned in school. The market attracted numerous families eager to support and observe their children's efforts.

Additionally, a successful carol singing event was coordinated with the Elthorne Park High School choir. This inclusive performance at Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre featured our students with learning difficulties, drawing significant attention from the local community. The event was covered by local news outlets and even caught the eye of the Deputy Lieutenant of Ealing, who subsequently became the Foundation's patron.

Thanks to generous donations from the local community, we were also able to host our first Christmas raffle. Volunteers diligently wrapped the gifts, and the event enjoyed robust support from families and school staff, contributing to its overall success.

One of our dedicated supporters undertook a remarkable challenge by embarking on a sponsored walk to raise funds for the Foundation. This inspiring endeavour not only demonstrated the personal commitment of our supporters but also highlighted the broad appeal and positive impact of the Foundation within the wider community. The enthusiastic response and generous contributions from the public further underscored the strong connection and support we have cultivated through our mission and activities.


Spring 2024 During this period, the trustees decided to step back, recharge, and replan our future initiatives. To raise awareness of Down syndrome, we encouraged school staff and students to wear odd socks, a simple yet powerful gesture to promote inclusivity.

Building on our previous success, we produced our second book, *Who Teaches US Joy?*. To further promote our literary efforts, we sent out information about pre-ordering our books to families and shared it on social media. This helped generate excitement and support for *Who Teaches US Joy?* and our previous work, *The Wheelchair Walk*, showcasing the creativity and dedication of our Foundation.

In celebration of World Book Day, we invited all classes to decorate their classroom doors as their favourite stories. Students and staff alike dressed up as beloved characters from their favourite books, creating a joyful and vibrant atmosphere throughout the school. The day culminated in a prize for the best-decorated door, generously provided by the head teacher.

We were delighted to announce that we successfully achieved our first major goal with the purchase and delivery of an all-electric accessible vehicle. This specially equipped vehicle will significantly enhance the opportunities for our students, enabling them to participate in community visits and develop essential daily life skills. By providing reliable and inclusive transportation, we are opening new avenues for experiential learning and personal growth, ensuring that all our students can fully engage with and benefit from the broader community.

Two of St. Ann's School's pupils and their family embarked on a fundraising campaign for the Foundation, successfully raising a substantial amount of money. In addition to their fundraising efforts, they distributed flyers to increase public awareness about the Foundation's mission and activities.
