**TRUSTEES' REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2025**

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the Charity for the 1 December 2024 to 30 November 2025.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The charity's mission is to promote, maintain, improve and advance the public's education in and appreciation of the arts. The charity provides mentoring and training to artists to enable them to produce public works of a higher standard, thus benefitting the public's understanding and experience of live theatre.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Activities undertaken to achieve objectives

The Trustees participate in quarterly meetings to discuss the progress of the charity with regard to its mission and its fundraising.

The charity discuss working with young people in the community and how they can reach out to the less advantaged members of society as a whole but also within the creative industry. Any monies spent is only to enhance the events or to pay a living wage to the creative artist the charity employs.

Achievements and performance

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

Income for the period was £2,678 and expenditure was £3,243. At the Balance Sheet date total unrestricted reserves were £5,914 and cash held was £7,327.

The Trustees are seeking to ensure that going forward unrestricted reserves are at a level that will fund 3 months expenditure. The trustees consider that holding reserves at this level will ensure that the charity's activities could continue in the event of a significant drop in income.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

Persever Productions CIO is a registered charity, number 1201022, and is constituted under a Trust deed.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Trust deed.

Apart from the first charity Trustees, every Trustee must be appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity Trustees.

In selecting individuals for appointment, the Charity Trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the charity.

The charity trustees will make available to each new Charity Trustee, on or before his or her first appointment:

- (a) a copy of the current version of their constitution; and
- (b) a copy of the latest Trustees' Annual Report and statement of accounts.

1. General information

Persever Productions CIO is a charity incorporated in England and Wales with charity registration number 1201022. Its registered office address is The Old Post Office Cottage, The Ridings, Leafield, Oxfordshire, OX29 9NN.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

Persever Productions CIO meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

2.2 Going concern

The Trustees have reviewed the circumstances of the Charity and consider that adequate resources continue to be available to fund the activities of the Charity for the foreseeable future. For this reason the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donations are recognised on receipt, subject to the income criteria being met.

Income from tutoring and ticket sales is recognised in the period in which it is receivable and to the extent where the service has been completed.

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

2.4 Expenditure (continued)

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the Charity for the period 15 November 2022 to 30 November 2023.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The charity's mission is to promote, maintain, improve and advance the public's education in and appreciation of the arts. The charity provides mentoring and training to artists to enable them to produce public works of a higher standard, thus benefitting the public's understanding and experience of live theatre.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Activities undertaken to achieve objectives

The Trustees participate in quarterly meetings to discuss the progress of the charity with regard to its mission and its fundraising.

The charity discuss working with young people in the community and how they can reach out to the less advantaged members of society as a whole but also within the creative industry. Any monies spent is only to enhance the events or to pay a living wage to the creative artist the charity employs.

The charity is run on a day-to-day basis by its founder and artistic director, Charlie Barker. There is also a part time producer, Becky Armes who is in charge of marketing and publicity, including raising the charity's social media presence. The Trustees and unofficial friends of the company contribute their time and skills in charity events by performing for free and publicising the events via their social media.

In the last year the charity has continued to provide events for the community at very reasonable rates. In November 2023 with the help of one of the Trustees Caroline Doyle, the charity secured the Parish Hall in Chiswick Catholic Centre. This was given to the charity on a monthly basis for 7 hours on a Sunday afternoon and evening for free, enabling them to put on 5 Sunday events.

All money spent by the charity was in bringing interesting and uplifting performances to the local communities of West London.

Moving forward

The charity are in meetings with Kibo theatre company who run Baron's Court, about a possible collaboration with them, and are investigating spaces to hire as rentable rehearsal spaces and spaces to potentially start offering sessions and classes to the local West London community.

Achievements and performance

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

Income for the period was £14,966 and expenditure was £10,032. At the Balance Sheet date total unrestricted reserves as at 31 December 2023 of £4,934 and cash held was £6,434.

The Trustees are seeking to ensure that going forward unrestricted reserves are at a level that will fund 3 months expenditure. The trustees consider that holding reserves at this level will ensure that the charity's activities could continue in the event of a significant drop in income.

1. General information

Persever Productions CIO is a charity incorporated in England and Wales with charity registration number 1201022. Its registered office address is The Old Post Office Cottage, The Ridings, Leafield, Oxfordshire, OX29 9NN.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.
