The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the accounting period ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

The Trustees of the Charity present their report of the charity's activities along with the financial statements of the Charity for the accounting period 31 March 2025.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The objectives of One Church Lancs are for the benefit of the public:

- (a) to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of beliefs in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit;
- (b) to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind including through the provision of counselling and support in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time think fit;
- (c) to advance education in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit.

### **Updated Trustee Information**

Sarah Duerden did step down from being a Trustee but as originally planned, Sarah carried out relevant checks and interviews with both Rachel Sollis and Timothy Haywood. Both were handpicked due to their impeccable characters, knowledge and their love for Jesus.

It was extremely sad to see Sarah resign but we fully understand her reasonings and we absolutely are cheering Sarah on in her new career roles. We are so thankful for all that she brought to the trusteeship of One Church Lancs and the way that she conducted herself through the transition period. She left a solid foundation that is easy to build on to move the Church forward.

### **Updated Vision & Values Information**

This year saw Simon and Valda visit the Hebrides Revival Conference in Stornoway on the Isle of Lewis. This was a trip that was paid for by One Church Lancs as donations had been received from Brave Church Ohio which were restricted for this intended purpose. This was so beneficial to both Simon and Valda as they could really feel the presence of God and with the main theme being 'God comes where He is wanted' they felt very convicted about the vision and Values of the values.

There was nothing wrong with the sentiment of them, but they truly felt burdened that God wasn't at the centre of them. Time was taken to just desire God more, to want Him enough that we start to see the manifest presence of Him in all areas. We realised that God had to be the reason that we do what we do.

After thoughtful prayer and conservation, we decided to update all our banners and website with a shortened but more impactful set of values. These are:

God comes where He is Wanted

So we want to be a Church, a community and individuals that are

- Passionate about God
- Authentic with God
- Humble before God
- Generous because of God

These are expanded on further with clarification of meaning but there is an evident shift in putting God central in all that we do and this has transformed every area of the organisation.

### **Achievement and Performance**

#### **Church Services**

Church has continued to go from strength to strength. Whilst some have moved on to other Churches, all parties have felt that this was the right decision for all concerned. At present we don't have anything for teenagers, and this is something that we do need to be established. We really do have a heart for them but at this time, the labourers who are highly skilled and burdened for this age group have not been sent to join us yet and therefore we do not want to start something that we cannot give the very best that it deserves. We do pray that this will change in the very near future as we would love to have lots of programs that suit all generations.

With that being said, we do have new people coming in who have now made One Church their home and we have had plenty of visitors, all of which are for us and not against us. In the last 6 months we have seen church attendance grow and although we had not previously collected data on attendance, primarily due to shifting priorities, there has been an influx of individuals coming from recovery backgrounds.

Throughout the year, we have seen people rising and finding their fit within the Church. Leah Hooper prayed and accepted her role as Worship pastor and Andrew and Abbie Davies have become our Children's Church pastors. We are humbled by their generous hearts and their obedience to serve God; their faithfulness has helped others to find their fit as part of the welcome team and pack down team.

This year we have seen Justin and Pamela Wharton becoming more visible in the Church. Whilst they have always served tirelessly in the background with no title assigned to them, this year we have seen them rise as leaders that are key to working alongside Simon and Valda. They are instrumental to the Church and now both have active roles on Preaching and Lead Through teams alongside their other duties.

The Church has also seen Bernadette Groves Wright return to Oswaldtwistle from Ireland. Bernadette has always supported the Church and in September 2024 she felt that God was telling her to move back home and attend One Church. Bernadette is now heading up most of our pastoral work and is loved by everyone who meets her. She has the heart of God and has the ability to help people work through their situations so that they can be the very best version of themselves. We see lots of fruit

from the pastoral meetings that she undertakes within the church and the community itself.

The Church teaching series has remained powerful throughout the year. The messages have prepared people for daily life, equipped them to stay strong and inspired them to become all that God is calling them to be. Andrew and Abbie have ensured that Children's Church teach from the same series as the main church and this has enabled healthy conversations when the congregation has returned home. We believe that this is extremely healthy, and we love that parents now feel confident that they can further explore the day's message at their dinner tables.

Children's Church now incorporate worship into their setting, so the children can worship freely with actions. This is such a blessing to them, and we embrace the fact that they love God just as much as the adults. We believe that our children are not just future leaders but that they are leaders now and we know that Andrew and Abbie are integral in enabling every one of the children entrusted into their care to see the treasure that is within them.

We continue to ensure that there are free refreshments and snacks for all that attend. We also try to have food and cake together every couple of months or sooner if financially possible as we recognise the importance of eating together. Alongside being spiritual, something powerful happens in conversations when eating together, there is a oneness that would not be the same if we only had chance to say hello quickly to each other.

There remains no collection plate during and after service, however we do have 'giving envelopes' that people have to actively get from the information desk. We recognise that giving is a biblical principle however we are also finding that many people want to give because we are not constantly asking.

We have been so blessed with the donations made this year by those attending, we are humbled, and our hearts are full of gratitude for every one of them. We take nothing at all for granted and ensure that we are good stewards with the monies donated.

### **Prayer**

Throughout this year we have been passionate about making prayer central to our church life and believe it should always be our first response. While we've made efforts to establish in-person prayer meetings with varying degrees of success, we recognise that building this into the core of our church culture will take time, and we're not quite there yet.

To help move in this direction, we have introduced a monthly online prayer meeting. Our goal is to prioritise prayer as an essential part of our church, and we are committed to attending this regularly. The first online prayer meeting began in September and this went well. After a brief introductory video where we said hello, we turned off our cameras and used audio only, allowing us to focus on praying through the strategic prayer plan that was shared.

We also have a weekly prayer email for those who would like to pray for people throughout the week. We love that nearly all attendees have embraced this by signing up to receive it and we have seen miracles on the back of people standing together in prayer.

### **Baptisms**

We have seen 3 baptisms this year and this has excited us to see so many more in the future. The 3 baptisms were 3 young males all of which have suffered with mental health problems. They have always seen themselves as unworthy and different than their peers and to see the chains of that type of thinking break has been heart wrenching. God is at work, and we don't ever want to miss out on what He is doing.

All baptisms have been conducted at the home of Simon and Valda. They have welcomed in the Church and the families of those being baptised and there is something so special about having them outside of the church walls. There is hot food and drink for everyone, and we really do celebrate those that are being baptised.

### **Bibles**

We are still making bibles free to those who want them. This year we have given another 33 away. We know that this is less than last year, but these are mainly to people who don't attend the services. We hope that people will explore their faith and see that God is a God who loves them unconditionally.

### **Community Hardship Support**

Community support has remained more important to us than ever, and we realise that there are still so many needs that are currently unmet. Many of these are related to poverty with the most basic needs being unmet for many in society. As a Church helping to meet those needs was always going to be an objective that we would aim to meet.

Valda currently oversees all this work and is paid part time for her role. She has really found favour in the community as many continually put their trust in her. It isn't easy for people to show their finances but Valda is key to helping people remove the barriers and stigma that is attached to poverty and isolation.

Throughout the year, we have been able to support just over 1,000 households in various ways which include

- Food parcels & emergency shops
- Gas/Electric provision
- Toiletries
- Clothing
- Uniforms
- White Goods
- Vouchers to meet basic needs

As a Church, we are so thankful that we have been able to partner with The Household Support Team to meet the needs above. Alongside the church donations, the funding has enabled the basic needs of families and individuals to be met. The problem of poverty is simply growing and that is just heartbreaking to see.

Many in society believe that those in need are on benefits and are just out for what they can get but the reality is so much different. Many of those that are in need are workers who can't make their money stretch the limited period. Most are just over the threshold so miss out on all the support and it is devastating to see the hardships that they face. Many have unexpected loss of a loved one and just have nowhere to turn for help. Sick pay doesn't help them manage their mortgage and bills. They have to choose whether they eat or stay warm. There are many pensioners being added to our numbers and this is a growing sign that poverty hits all generations.

Alongside the emergency support that we offer, we were able to directly refer the most needy families and individuals for a more specialised support package from The Household Support team. All eligible funding went directly to the person/household and although the referrals do not reflect in any of our financial accounting, we feel extremely blessed that One Church has been the vehicle used to facilitate the funding being directed to those suffering in silence. Through our direct referrals an additional £58,607 of funding went to homes that were desperately in need.

We also were able to give out Winter Warmer & Small Appliance packs which were a welcome blessing to the recipients. These were all funded by The Household Support team.

Each Winter Warmer pack included:

- Electric Blanket
- Retractable Washing Line
- Fan Heater
- Heated Maiden
- Hot Water Bottle
- Thick Blankets

Each Small Appliance pack include:

- Slow Cooker
- Air Fryer
- Soup Maker
- Toaster
- Kettle

Each family or individual has a one-to-one meeting and full action plans and paperwork is given or posted to those attending. Whilst this does incur additional administration costs for the Church, the benefit for the client is more impactful. As Valda is a qualified Level 6 Career's advisor, she has also helped people to create CV's and showed those that have been away from the job market for a period of time how to upskill and access vacant employment opportunities that are available to them.

Alongside helping families to have their basic needs met, One Church Lancs also bought wardrobes for a family and supported 3 homeless people moving into accommodation. One Church Lancs is proud that it continues to help some of our most vulnerable sectors in society by washing and drying their clothes on a weekly basis.

### **Rent & Storage**

Oswaldtwistle Mills Business and Conference Centre remains our home on Sundays and whilst we do have a small amount of storage there, we have had to rent additional storage. This is due to the incredible need of our community as many of the toiletries and non-perishables can be bought in bulk. It also allows us to have a safe space for some of the bigger church items that are not needed each week.

### **Pastoral Care Support**

Whilst pastoral care has always been needed in society, we are continuing to see that this is beneficial to our community. As a Church we are committed to walking a long-term journey with those who need additional support as we do want people to thrive in all areas of their life.

Many are not ready to attend a 6-week training program to help them gain more confidence, they simply need people to visit or telephone them. Building trust takes time and One Church Lancs realises the importance of this. We may be a small church in comparison to some in the area however we are a small church with a big heart for others and will always try to break down the barriers of isolation.

As a church we will always exist to offer a community that people can belong to and feel part of even if they never enter the Church doors. Church has never just been about a Sunday service experience, it's about being good news to our community every day of the week and supporting them in any way that we can whether that be spiritually, physically, mentally, emotionally, or socially.

### **Projects**

We realise that at certain times within the year that there are key times that put additional pressure on our community. These are generally in School holidays and Christmas when children are at home more which means extra food/toy parcels are needed or emotional support is required for parents.

Other key events are on what the world would call 'special days' such as Mother's Day, Father's Day, Valentine's Day etc. People in our society can dread these days for numerous reasons and we look at how we can support people on those days by helping them to feel valued and listened to.

We have loved all the projects that we have run in our community in this accounting period. Feedback from our community has been that they were able to enjoy Christmas for the first time in years and that people felt loved and cared about on the other special days. A small gesture has made a huge positive impact for those who have previously struggled on these days. Our projects are not always about monetary value but about the love and care shown to others when they are going through challenging times.

### **External Donations**

One Church Lancs has given donations to the value of £6,686 to external organisations that are doing great work supporting our community. Many of the donations have supported those providing food provision, children's education, young people's recreational activities and spiritual needs. We have given as much as our donations have allowed us to give.

Our external donations have also enabled us to support families that are going through the most heartbreaking of times such as unexpected death in the family helping with funeral costs.

Continuing to support other organisations will be a high priority for One Church Lancs as we realise that we can only make a difference if we support each other. We all serve the same purpose which is to see our community thrive in all aspects of life. Whilst there may be different ways of tackling poverty or social isolation, we see this as positive as it widens the routes so our community can access services in a way that is comfortable for them.

We commend all those making a positive difference within our community and will support them in any way that our resources allow us.

### **Other**

As a Charity, we recognise that we would not be able to carry out the work we do without the support, investment, and commitment of our faithful volunteers, who work tirelessly in their service of the Church/charity. We also realise how important donations are to us. We are so thankful for those who regularly tithe and give offerings to One Church Lancs and those that are restricted to our Community Hardship Support as without these donations we could not operate in the way that we do and that would mean that our community suffers.

We are also thankful to those in our community who are not directly associated with the church but who regularly donate through our online giving as they fully believe in the work we are doing within the community. We applaud them for their integrity to stay silent and therefore receive no glory. All these donations have helped us make a huge difference within our community that we would not have been able to do without their support.

### **Public benefit**

The trustees have regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and all issues relating to running a charity. The activities outlined above are the main activities undertaken to further the purpose for public benefit.

### **Structure, governance and management**

The Charity is governed by its Constitution and the on-going running of the Charity is overseen by the Board of Trustees.

The Board of Trustees ensures that the charity and its representatives' function within the legal and regulatory framework of the sector and in line with the organisations' governing document, continually striving for best practice in governance. The Board of Trustees has ensured that all relevant licences and subscriptions are appropriate to the operations of One Church Lancs and that sufficient Insurance for contents including contents in transit, Public Liability, Employer Liability and Trustee Insurance is in place.

They also uphold the fiduciary duty invested in the position, undertaking such duties in a way continually striving for best practice in governance that adds to public confidence and trust in the charity.

New trustees are appointed with adherence to the Charity Commission guidelines CC30. It is essential that they are a person committed to the teachings of the Bible and have personal knowledge of God through Jesus Christ. They should be in agreement with the objectives and core values of One Church Lancs. Trustees are to be nominated to join the team by the Trustees and approved and appointed by the existing Trustees.

### **Organisational structure**

The Lead Pastor, Simon Rushton has Spiritual and day to day oversight of the charity. Simon is a trustee as per the Constitution and is answerable to them. The trustees meet approximately three or four times a year however in the accounting period ending 31 March 2025, the trustees have met a total of 4 times.

Co-leading with Simon is Valda Rushton who is the wife of Simon and therefore is a Related Party. Valda preaches on a regular basis at our Sunday services however her main responsibilities are managing the finances of the charity and coordinating all community projects. Valda is also answerable to the trustees so that there is mitigated conflict of interest. Her part time salary is paid for by the Awards for All funding.

### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Trustee approval is required for all significant items of expenditure and receipts or invoices are required in support of all payments. These are allocated against the appropriate cost centres in our accounting system to ensure that an audit trail is provided for all expenditure. There are no items of expenditure that are unaccounted for in the accounting period 31 March 2025.

It is a requirement that all Trustees, staff, and persons working with children and/or vulnerable adults are cleared by the Police under Disclosure and Barring Service Scheme. The Charity subscribes to the Churches Protection Advisory Service (CCPAS) to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations relating to children and vulnerable adults. All DBS applications are made through thirtyone:eight formerly CCPAS. This year we have adopted all of our Child protection policies to make sure they are relevant and effective and carried out safeguarding training with all our staff and volunteers.

### **Financial Review**

At 31 March 2024, the Charity held total funds of 11,544 all of which are unrestricted funds. This includes all tangible fixed assets.

It is intended that sufficient reserves are retained in order to enable the Charity to undertake its financial commitments for a minimum of two months which would equate to approximately £5,000. The level of available, liquid unrestricted funds carried forward at 31 March 2025 meets the required level of reserve.

**Plans for future periods**

Plans are well underway for our development into the next year. We have completed a full review of our financial liabilities and are extremely confident in our ability to service these. The Trustees are particularly encouraged by the response of community and pastoral support and would like to widen the support packages that we can offer in the next 12 months.

We realise that to do this then we will need to start looking at ways that we can bring future finance into the church and look at funding/grants that One Church Lancs would meet the application criteria. We will be closely working with Lindsey West who is an integral part of One Church Lancs as she has the knowledge and expertise of working with funders.

Plans are still underway to try and expand our partnership with Brave Church Ohio and this will enable people from One Church Lancs to take a mission trip to Ohio in the next few years. This will be extremely beneficial to both churches and Brave Church Ohio are extremely passionate about coming over to serve our community in any way that they can. We are praying eagerly that all relevant procedures are put in place soon so that they can come to England within the next 12 months.

As Trustees, we consider that we are achieving our mandate as a charity and look forward to extending our work and partnerships within the local community this coming year.





**1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below.

**Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions.** The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

**Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably.

**Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

**Allocation and apportionment of costs**

Support costs directly attributable to an activity have been allocated to that activity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to any activity they have been allocated in proportion to direct expenditure.

**Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - 2% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 15% on cost

Electronic equipment - 15% on cost

**Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

**Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

**Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits**

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme with The People's Partnership. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

**Basic financial instruments**

Basic financial instruments are measured at amortised cost with changes recognised in profit or loss.

**Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement**

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

**Critical accounting estimates and assumptions:**

The charity makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. There are no resulting accounting estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year.

**Critical areas of judgement:**

In the application of the charity's accounting policies the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of certain assets and liabilities. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered relevant. The items in the financial statements where these judgements and estimates have been made include: -

Depreciation - Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its residual value, over the economic life of that asset

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the accounting period 18 November 2022 – 31 March 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

The Trustees of the Charity present their report of the charity's activities along with the financial statements of the Charity for the period 18 November 2022 – 31 March 2024.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The objectives of One Church Lancs are for the benefit of the public:

- (a) to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Statement of beliefs in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit;
- (b) to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind including through the provision of counselling and support in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time think fit;
- (c) to advance education in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit.

### **Background Information**

One Church Lancs became a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation on the 18 November 2022 however the organisation was founded by Simon and Valda Rushton in August 2022 after they believed God was calling them to plant a church in the local area that would be 'good news' to the community that they would be there to serve. Both Simon and Valda had held full time paid positions at Brave Church in Oswaldtwistle and had been instrumental in ensuring that the church was built on strong foundations and was meeting all the objectives that the church had set out as a charity in their Trust Deed.

With the full backing of the leadership at Brave Church, Simon and Valda stepped down from their positions, worked their notices and left their employment roles on the 30 June 2022. Both Simon and Valda had no intention of asking other people to leave with them and were adamant that they would not ask anybody to build One Church Lancs with them instead trusting God through this new and exciting journey. They spent the summer of 2022 taking time to hear God for clear vision of where to build, how to build and what the foundations should be.

It was in this prayerful time that people approached Simon and Valda with dreams, visions and scriptures confirming God was calling them to build church with them. Anybody that had nothing solid to stand on were asked to continue to pray and many of them did not return.

A meeting took place at the home of Simon and Valda in August 2022 where all those wanting to help build the church attended. People were encouraged to share what they believed God had put in their hearts regarding the vision and values and all attendees agreed the name of One Church Lancs. There was a common theme and oneness with everyone and this was another confirming factor that we were all meant to be on this journey together.

From regular meetings the Vision and Values were firmly established. These are as follows:

Simon and Valda have a wealth of experience and knowledge of building church and supporting the community that One Church Lancs is built in, they are also aware of some of the frustrations and conflicts that can arise. With this in mind there were two very definite foundational principles that they believed should be instrumental in the planning of planting a new church. These were agreed by all and are as follows and were accepted by the Charity Commission when One Church Lancs became a registered CIO on the 18 November 2022:

- 1) Simon as Lead Pastor would **NOT** be the Chair of Trustees until the first set of accounts had been fully prepared and examined– This principle was not a way of having no responsibility for how the charity operates as Simon would be on the trustees however, rather there would be a way forward for people to voice any concerns regarding the foundations of the Church that they perhaps didn't want to voice to Simon. To meet the charity recommendations of having a Chairperson in place, Sarah Duerden was appointed on the trustee board for 3 years and nominated Chairperson. Benjamin Uttley was appointed a trustee for the period of two years and Simon Rushton was appointed a trustee for the period of four years. All are in agreement that more trustees will be added as the church moves forward.
- 2) Finance Audits should match the transparency of the Charity SORP – Even though the finances for the foreseeable future are eligible to be audited on a Receipts and Payments Basis as the income will be between £25,000 and £250,000, we believe that for greater transparency all audits/examinations should be on an Accruals basis giving the reader a greater understanding of what the finances were really like in a particular year. It is also deemed important to One Church Lancs that the audit/examination meets the standards of the SORP showing any Remuneration or Related Party payments and be audited or independently examined by an individual who is a member of a body approved by the Charity Commission.

When completing the Foundation Model Constitution of a Charitable Incorporated Organisation whose only voting members are its Charity Trustees, the charity asked the Charity Commission for permission to employ Simon and Valda Rushton at a future date and after considering all the details of why Simon and Valda would be best placed to gain paid employment, permission was granted by the Charity Commission as they agreed that both Simon and Valda hold the greatest experience and knowledge and that they will show the greatest concern for the welfare of our community.

Regular meetings continued to take place and a temporary Bank account of Simon Rushton's was used whilst waiting for the Charity Bank Account to be processed. Many of those who were attending had voiced their concern that they felt as though they were being dishonourable to God by keeping their tithes and offerings until an account was set up.

Nobody was asked to transfer their monies into this account; however, it was made available if anybody wished to do so. Trusted officials were put in place to monitor the account so that transparency was in place and all bank statements were given to the relevant bodies when asked by the Regulators. Once the charity Bank Account was operating, all monies were successfully transferred into the new account and no further payments relating to the charity have since been paid into the temporary account. Gift Aid was not eligible to be claimed on any donations that were collected before the date of becoming a Registered CIO.

We think it is important to note that we are thankful for every person who has donated to One Church Lancs and we really do want to give a special thank you to the Mensah family who donated £10,000 on behalf of Michael Mensah who in January 2022 went to his home in Heaven. Michael always had such a loving heart to those who are often deemed unlovable in the world's eyes and always did everything he could to walk alongside people until they were strong enough to walk themselves. Whilst Michael is greatly missed by all who knew him, he has left a wonderful legacy for us all to follow. The donation from Michael has enabled us to establish One Church Lancs and for this we are extremely grateful.

In September 2022, it became apparent that the Church would need to rent a venue for Sunday Services as the Church was outgrowing the home of Simon and Valda. After considering many venues, the church members were invited to look around Oswaldtwistle Business and Conference Centre which is located in the area that One Church Lancs operates. Every person was overwhelmed with an incredible feeling that we had not just found a rented building but rather that we had found a home. One Church Lancs signed a Tenancy Agreement for a twelve month period where we have access to a main hall meeting room and a hall for Kids Church on Sundays. That Contract has been extended and we also have some storage facilities at the building.

Church Services at Oswaldtwistle Business and Conference Centre commenced on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2022 and are carried out on a weekly basis at 10.30am. All other meetings and charitable activities operate from the charity's registered address which is the home address of Simon and Valda Rushton.

Many of the pastoral meetings do take place from the charity's registered address, however the growing need for these meetings have meant that often it is more convenient for the meetings to take place in open, familiar establishments known to those requiring support and this has proved a vital lifeline for those referring into this service.

**Achievement and Performance**

**Church Services**

Setting up a new church from scratch can be extremely expensive and the trustees had to be astute with the generous donations from tithes and offerings. The decision was taken to look for a second-hand sound desk that was analogue rather than digital as there was no justification in starting out with a brand-new digital desk. Both Simon and Ben had years of experience with analogue and therefore they were confident when using their initiative to seek out one that would fulfil the purpose it was designed to meet. It was also decided that it made more sense to buy much of the other sound equipment and musical instruments new as the price difference did not substantiate taking the risk of something breaking within a short space of time.

A MacBook and iPad were also purchased as these were required to ensure that the worship experience could maximise its full potential.

All Sunday services have been structured in such a way that anybody that attends would feel welcome and loved regardless of their age, background, culture and belief. Whilst we stand firm on the truth of God and never waiver from the scriptures, we actively stand on our values by thinking of others above ourselves by operating in grace and love to everyone.

We have tried to remove barriers that many face by providing free hot/cold drinks and snacks with regular extended times where we can eat a meal together. Food Safety is paramount and therefore we use businesses that meet the criteria and relevant standards. Whilst this does bring extra costs to the expenditure of Sunday Services we feel that this is beneficial and ensures that our church is all inclusive rather than exclusive.

As the Church began to operate, the sermon series was based on the book of Philippians as this enabled us to build a firm foundation that all our charitable activities can work out from. In January 2023 we felt pressed to answer some of the questions that the world asks which has enabled us to concentrate on the early origin stories of the Bible. This was an amazing series that has encouraged those less confident to be spiritual leaders in their own homes. We encouraged families to use the Jesus Storybook Bible that One Church Lancs provided, and discussion points were given so that families could use them throughout the week. The feedback from this is that families, single people and children have been able to find their own values that they would like to stand on and the sermons have given them ideas of how they can show God's love to the people that they encounter. One Church Lancs has given away over 100 bibles throughout the Origin Series and 46 more since the series ended.

Whilst there are no collections taking place within our services, we have been incredibly humbled by those who use the giving methods available to them. This is not something that we take for granted and we realise that we are truly blessed to be a blessing to those in our community who need our support. This year 41% of all giving that came into the church through donations went straight back into the community through Community Hardship Support or our 'Special Day' Projects. This does not include any running costs, pastoral costs, or any donations to external organisations even though we know that donations will have been used for the purpose of benefiting those in our operating area.

As part of our church services, we did offer baptism services to those who wanted to follow the biblical principle of being fully emerged in water. One Church Lancs bought a baptism tank and held 2 services in 2023 at the registered home of the charity. One service was for those who attend One Church Lancs weekly and 4 people chose to be baptised. We then held another service for those who listen to our service which is broadcast through Spotify. On that day we saw 2 more people being baptised.

**Community Hardship Support**

Community is important to us, and we realise that there are so many needs that are currently unmet. Many of these are related to poverty with the most basic needs being unmet for many in society. As a Church helping to meet those needs was always going to be an objective that we would aim to meet. Valda Rushton heads up all our community work and has knowledge and experience of supporting the community in this way which spans over 24 years with the first food bank in the local area being delivered out of her home address on a council estate.

We realise that there are many food banks within the local area and our intention has never been to start another one. They are meeting the community needs in a great way and One Church Lancs has never wanted to recreate something just for the sake of it however we do believe that the work we carry out in the community compliments what other service providers are doing. Many of the families that One Church Lancs support are on an emergency basis where an emergency food shop which we call a 'big shop' is delivered to those in need. The reasoning for a 'big shop' is to give people a head start before they are referred to other providers that can meet their long term needs or to simply provide for those who are going through a temporary crisis. We try to relieve as much pressure on the person/family as possible covering everything from toiletries, laundry products, food and condiments and gas/electric cards.

As the needs of our community were bigger than we could have ever anticipated, One Church Lancs applied for monies from Round 4 of the Household Support Funding given to local councils. We knew that the funds could help us reach many of those who were not yet reached by the service providers in the local area. In total One Church Lancs received £18,000 to help us provide support from 1 September 2023 – 31 March 2024. Our original application had been for £8,000 of funding however due to the vast number of those needing support, more financial support was added.

Between 1 September 2023 and 31 March 2024, 602 households received support through provisions. The breakdown of households is as follows:

- Households with children – 312
- Households with pensioners – 119
- Households with disabilities – 82
- Household with other – 89

On average each household received support from the Household Support Fund totalling £30 and church donations were added to the funding so that every household had their needs met. In January 2024, One Church Lancs were eligible to directly refer our most vulnerable families into the Household Support Fund to receive additional funding that would go direct to them. Between 1 January 2024 and 31 March 2024, One Church Lancs facilitated 142 households to access the provision that was available to them. All of those referred had no idea that there was support out there to help them with the cost-of-living crisis and they were extremely grateful for the support that they received. Each household were desperately facing or already in severe poverty and due to their needs, funding was allocated accordingly to them. The monies through direct referrals totalled £41,886.

Those who self-refer or are referred to us by partner organisations often have other challenges in life and we assess every person to see if they need additional support that One Church Lancs can meet, or we signpost to service providers that are better skilled to meet their individual needs. Valda Rushton is a qualified Level 6 Careers Guidance advisor and has utilised her skills to instil confidence into others to look at possibly retraining or upskilling to have a more secure future financially.

Valda has also helped people to create CV's and showed them how to access vacant employment opportunities that are available to them.

Alongside helping families to have their basic needs met, One Church Lancs also bought a washer for a family and supported a homeless person moving into accommodation. One Church Lancs continues to help some of our most vulnerable sectors in society by washing and drying their clothes on a weekly basis.

### **Pastoral Care Support**

Whilst pastoral care has always been needed in society, we have seen a growing need in the last three years. On one hand people feel isolated from society as many people have had to concentrate on supporting their own close-knit family hence communities don't look out for one another like they once did and on the other hand many others have isolated themselves through a lack of trust of others or a way of keeping themselves safe through the pandemic. Government restrictions may have been lifted for a while now, but many people are still finding it hard to reintroduce themselves back to society, they are lonely, and many are vulnerable. The world may move on quickly but many in society aren't ready to move on yet and there is not a quick fix for this.

As a Church we are committed to walking a long-term journey with those who need additional support as we do not want anybody to be left behind. Many are not ready to attend a 6-week training programme to help them gain more confidence, they simply need people to visit or telephone them. Building trust takes time and One Church Lancs realises the importance of this. We may be a small church in comparison to some in the area however we are small church with a big heart for others and will always try to break down the barriers of isolation.

We are well aware that at the moment mental health services are also pushed to crisis levels with many of those needing support having to wait. Many of our pastoral visits in the community are supporting those that are going through a crisis such as illness, grief, loneliness, fear and hopelessness. We also make many hospital visits or sit with people as they wait in A & E/attend appointments and help families to fill out health applications.

One Church Lancs helps people to reintegrate people back into society. We do this by taking small steps and we will not move to a new step until the individual is ready. Some of the good news stories have been that those previously isolated have progressed from being sat in each day to being taken to a quiet establishment for coffee. Whilst this may seem like a small step forward, in terms of mental and emotional health this is huge for the person. For others who always had their shopping dropped off by delivery drivers due to the anxiety of going out to public places, we have seen them go from strength to strength and become comfortable and even excited about being taken out to do their own shopping.

As a church we will always exist to offer a community that people can belong to and feel part of. Church has never just been about a Sunday service experience, it's about being good news to our community every day of the week and supporting them in any way that we can whether that be spiritually, physically, mentally, emotionally, or socially.

### **Projects**

We realise that at certain times within the year that there are key times that put additional pressure on our community. These are generally in School holidays and Christmas when children are at home more which means extra food/toy parcels are needed or emotional support is required for parents.

Other key events are on what the world would call 'special days' such as Mother's Day, Father's Day, Valentine's Day etc. People in our society can dread these days for numerous reasons and we look at how we can support people on those days helping them to feel valued and listened to.

We have loved all the projects that we have run in our community in this accounting period. Feedback from our community has been that they were able to enjoy Christmas for the first time in years and that people felt loved and cared about on the other special days. A small gesture has made a huge positive impact for those who have previously struggled on these days. Our projects are not always about monetary value but about the love and care shown to others when they are going through challenging times.

### **External Donations**

One Church Lancs has given donations to the value of £5,379 to external organisations that are doing great work supporting our community. Many of the donations have supported those providing food provision, children's education, young people's recreational activities and spiritual needs. We have given as much as our donations have allowed us to give.

Our external donations have also enabled us to support families that are going through the most heartbreaking of times such as unexpected death in the family. In January 2024 we were able to donate directly to a funeral director in Blackburn so that a body could be released from the mortuary. The family had no way of raising all the funds needed and it was heavy on our hearts that we needed to help.

In January 2024 we also worked closely with Oswaldtwistle Funeral Director's to help a son pay towards his mother's funeral. Whilst our donation did not solve the heartbreak the son was facing, it showed that there was a community out there who valued and loved him. One Church Lancs stood with him in a time when he would have felt completely alone.

One Church Lancs also raised money for Safespace Nelson as part of a Michael Mensah Award. In February 2024, the family of Michael were able to take a cheque in person to this amazing organisation which totalled £1,541. The cheque was not cashed until April 2024 which is why it still appears as a Creditor.

Continuing to support other organisations will be a high priority for One Church Lancs as we realise that we can only make a difference if we support each other. We all serve the same purpose which is to see our community thrive in all aspects of life. Whilst there may be different ways of tackling poverty or social isolation, we see this as positive as it widens the routes so our community can access services in a way that is comfortable for them.

We commend all those making a positive difference within our community and will support them in any way that our resources allow us.

### **Other**

As a Charity, we recognise that we would not be able to carry out the work we do without the support, investment, and commitment of our faithful volunteers, who work tirelessly in their service of the Church/charity.

We also realise how important donations are to us. We are so thankful for those who regularly tithe and give offerings to One Church Lancs and those that are restricted to our Community Hardship Support as without these donations we could not operate in the way that we do and that would mean that our community suffers.

We are also thankful to those in our community who are not directly associated with the church but who regularly donate through our online giving as they fully believe in the work we are doing within the community. Also, a massive thankyou to The Rock Church Harpenden who gifted One Church Lancs £2,750 in February 2023 and Brave Church Ohio who gifted \$1,000 in January 2024 which equated to £760. All these donations have helped us make a huge difference within our community.

**Public benefit**

The trustees have regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and all issues relating to running a charity. The activities outlined above are the main activities undertaken to further the purpose for public benefit.

**Structure, governance and management**

The Charity is governed by its Constitution and the on-going running of the Charity is overseen by the Board of Trustees.

The Board of Trustees ensures that the charity and its representatives' function within the legal and regulatory framework of the sector and in line with the organisations' governing document, continually striving for best practice in governance. The Board of Trustees has ensured that all relevant licences and subscriptions are appropriate to the operations of One Church Lancs and that sufficient Insurance for contents including contents in transit, Public Liability, Employer Liability and Trustee Insurance is in place.

They also uphold the fiduciary duty invested in the position, undertaking such duties in a way continually striving for best practice in governance that adds to public confidence and trust in the charity.

New trustees are appointed with adherence to the Charity Commission guidelines CC30. It is essential that they are a person committed to the teachings of the Bible and have personal knowledge of God through Jesus Christ. They should be in agreement with the objectives and core values of One Church Lancs. Trustees are to be nominated to join the team by the Trustees and approved and appointed by the existing Trustees.

**Organisational structure**

The Lead Pastor, Simon Rushton has Spiritual and day to day oversight of the charity. Simon is a trustee as per the Constitution and is answerable to them. The trustees will meet approximately three or four times a year however in the year ending 2023, the trustees have met a total of six times.

Co-leading with Simon is Valda Rushton who is the wife of Simon and therefore is a Related Party. Valda preaches on a regular basis at our Sunday services however her main responsibilities are managing the finances of the charity and coordinating all community projects. Valda is also answerable to the trustees so that there is no conflict of interest.

Until March 2023 both Simon and Valda had been carrying out all work on the charity on a voluntary basis, however funding was received from Awards for All to fund a part time position for Valda.

The funding enabled Valda to receive £771 as gross pay each month for a twelve-month period. Her first salary was paid on 31 March 2023. A new application to Awards for All to extend this employment position for a further two years has been successful however the monies will not be received until the next accounting period.

£2,168 of donations were marked restricted for salaries by One Church Lancs members which enabled Valda to receive a salary of £771 on 31 March 2024 and the remaining £1,397 was allocated to the salary that Simon Rushton received when One Church Lancs asked him to take time off from agency teaching due to the demands of the community. In total Simon Rushton received £3,642 for work carried out as a paid employee of One Church Lancs between 1 April 2023 – 31 December 2023.

### **Risk Management**

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the Charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Trustee approval is required for all significant items of expenditure and receipts or invoices are required in support of all payments. These are allocated against the appropriate cost centres in our accounting system to ensure that an audit trail is provided for all expenditure. There are no items of expenditure that are unaccounted for in the accounting period 18 November 2022 - 31 March 2024.

It is a requirement that all Trustees, staff, and persons working with children and/or vulnerable adults are cleared by the Police under Disclosure and Barring Service Scheme. The Charity subscribes to the Churches Protection Advisory Service (CCPAS) to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations relating to children and vulnerable adults. All DBS applications are made through thirtyone:eight formerly CCPAS. This year we have adopted all of our Child protection policies to make sure they are relevant and effective and carried out safeguarding training with all our staff and volunteers.

### **Financial Review**

At 31 March 2024, the Charity held total funds of £11,513 all of which are unrestricted funds. This includes all tangible fixed assets.

It is intended that sufficient reserves are retained in order to enable the Charity to undertake its financial commitments for a minimum of two months which would equate to approximately £5,000. The level of available, liquid unrestricted funds carried forward at 31 March 2024 meets the required level of reserve.

### **Plans for future periods**

Plans are well underway for our development into the next year. We have completed a full review of our financial liabilities and are extremely confident in our ability to service these. The Trustees are particularly encouraged by the response of community and pastoral support and would like to widen the support packages that we can offer in the next 12 months.

We realise that to do this then we will need to start looking at ways that we can bring future finance into the church and look at funding/grants that One Church Lancs would meet the application criteria. We will be working closely with Lindsey West who is an integral part of One Church Lancs as she has the knowledge and expertise of working with funders.

The trustees will be changing in June 2024 as Sarah Duerden will be stepping down from her role as Chair of Trustees. As Chair of Trustees for the charity, Sarah was heavily involved in the registration of the charity and has ensured policies and procedures for the charity are up to date. When she first took on the role she aimed to use her experience to ensure compliance with all charity commission frameworks and to ensure a stable charity trustee board was maintained. Her initial plan was to complete at least 2 years as Chair of Trustees prior to handing the Chair role over, however, she has successfully gained an additional role with The General Dental Council as a registration assessment panellist and therefore cannot commit the time to both the new role and the role of Chair of Trustees.

The trustees of One Church Lancs fully support Sarah in her decision and are extremely grateful for all the hard work and commitment that she has given to ensure that the charity is built on a solid foundation. Sarah's organisational skills are second to none and everybody is aware that the CIO would not be as stable as it is if Sarah had not been involved in the foundational process.

Sarah and the trustees are busy vetting the right people to join the trustee board of One Church Lancs before Sarah steps down. Sarah will not step down before having the right people in place. The trustees are hopeful that 2 more names will be added to the board, each of which will have their own areas of expertise that can further advance each of the charity's objectives.

Due to Sarah stepping down, all trustees agree that Simon Rushton will be the best placed person to become the Chair of trustees. This change will take affect once Sarah has completed a full handover once the new trustees are in place.

In the next couple of years, we would like to further partner with Compassion International. Many of our congregation sponsor children through Compassion International and we would like to see the number sponsored raised. Moving forward we would like to invite our congregation to take mission trips out to Rwanda where many of our sponsored children are in Compassion projects. We realise that those wanting to travel to Rwanda would need ample time to raise the funds through sponsorship so this is something that would need to be relayed to the church at the earliest convenience.

Plans are also being made to further partner with Brave Church Ohio and this will enable people from One Church Lancs to take a mission trip to Ohio in the next few years. This will be extremely beneficial to both churches.

As Trustees, we consider that we are achieving our mandate as a charity and look forward to extending our work and partnerships within the local community this coming year.



## **1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below.

**Financial reporting standard 102** - reduced disclosure exemptions. The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably.

### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

### **Allocation and apportionment of costs**

Support costs directly attributable to an activity have been allocated to that activity. Where support costs cannot be directly attributed to any activity they have been allocated in proportion to direct expenditure.

### **Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - 2% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 15% on cost

Electronic equipment - 15% on cost

**Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

**Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

**Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits**

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme with The People's Partnership. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

**Basic financial instruments**

Basic financial instruments are measured at amortised cost with changes recognised in profit or loss.

**Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement**

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

**Critical accounting estimates and assumptions:**

The charity makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. There are no resulting accounting estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year.

**Critical areas of judgement:**

In the application of the charity's accounting policies the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of certain assets and liabilities. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered relevant. The items in the financial statements where these judgements and estimates have been made include: -

Depreciation - Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its residual value, over the economic life of that asset

**2. CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES**

There were no other trading as all activities activities run by One Church Lancs meet the objectives and the aims written within the Charitable Incorporated Organisation Constitution.
