



Smaller amounts of money were received as grants and donations, as well as from shed membership and session fees.

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1.46	<p>Break-ins</p> <p>Last year, the shed premises were constantly under attack from those keen to break into the shed and help themselves to our battery-operated tools. Significant work was performed to secure the premises, ensuring future break attempts would not be an easy task.</p> <p>This year, there was only one such incident, which occurred to an adjacent storage building used for storing materials and partially finished projects. The thieves successfully gained access but left disappointed, having found nothing of value, but leaving the shed members to resecure the premises.</p> <p>Membership</p> <p>The shed's membership is static, with very few joining enquiries. This means that the shed's membership is not increasing, and there is no new blood or ideas. This may be due to the shed's limited size, which restricts the number of people who can come to the shed during a session.</p> <p>Trustees</p> <p>With no new blood joining the ranks of the Bingley shed, it presents challenges in finding members willing to take on specific Trustee roles, such as Chairman and Treasurer, etc. This will come to a head at</p>

		<p>the next AGM, when current role-holding members will step down after holding on to their roles for the last three years.</p> <p>Tenure of lease and Shed premises expansion</p> <p>This is an ongoing saga that remains unresolved. Not having a lease tenure prohibits the shed from applying for larger grants to help expand to larger premises or purchase larger equipment. As Bradford/Bingley council still has not decided on the plans for the old Bingley council and pool premises, this impacts the shed's future in its current location, which is to expand to available premises as initially promised.</p>

Trustees are also sourced through member nominations, and a ballot is taken if there is more than one nominee for a role.</p> <p>The trustees assume the roles of chairman, secretary, and treasurer, or serve as trustees with no specific role (e.g., committee member).</p> <p>Other roles available are membership, DPO and Safety Officer. These roles require very little week-to-week attention and are adjunct tasks to the treasurer's role. Trustee meetings are held regularly, typically every month.</p>

As part of setting up the shed's governing structure, a bank account was set up a few days before Christmas. After the New Year, Gift Aid was applied for, and the shed has now received approval to claim this.</p> <p>During the year, the shed received start-up grants from</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community First Yorkshire, which has allowed for the purchase of tools and refurbish the shed. • Bradford Council Bradford VCS Alliance • Bingley Bubble. Some of these have helped with our members' membership. <p>We have also had donations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • from our members themselves • Others from outside of the organisation. <p>Community organisations have approached us to help deliver small projects such as the Crosses for All Saints Church, the ramp and platform for the foodbank, hedgehog boxes for Prince of Wales Park, and park benches for Myrtle Park. These have all brought in donations as thanks for delivering them to these organisations/people. These received donations go to help with the club's subsistence.</p> <p>In summary, Through grants and donations received, the shed has managed to redecorate the provided stone building and purchase woodworking equipment and hand tools</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our income for the year was £10.5k • Our expenses for the year were 7.5k, mainly due to the establishment of the shed and the purchase of power tools. • A surplus of 2.9k will be carried over to the following year's accounts to help with the shed's continued subsistence. <p>The surplus comprises of unspent insurance money, donations for community work performed and shed membership and session fees.</p>

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1.46	<p>Break-ins The shed premises have suffered multiple break-in attempts, with the first attempt being successful, where the shed power tools were stolen. Through contents insurance, the power tools have been replaced. Unfortunately, the insurance covered the contents only and shed finances had to cover the bolstering of the shed's security to increase the difficulty of illicit entry. There remains a risk of persons with breaking-in and entering intentions continuing to try to gain access to the shed's contents. This creates a potential financial burden, and the shed needs to be ready to manage any damage caused as a result.</p> <p>Grants/Fundraising Larger grants are outside the shed's scope due to the council not granting tenure of occupation. This now limits the shed's scope for any future development/expansion that the trustees would like to achieve.</p> <p>Small grants are a challenge, as we were unsuccessful with the submissions that were made during the year. The intention is to attend training courses and other forums to learn what is required to be more successful. If no small grants are obtained during the year, that would exert quite a bit of financial stress on the trustees and operational side.</p>

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

