With reference drawn to the guidance provided by the Charity Commission on public benefit, we had streamlined our focus for the immediate future as thus:

- supporting existing schools in Africa, including building new structures, if required, improving standards and supporting teacher training
- providing basic supplies, such as children’s clothes and shoes, books and other personal or educational supplies to help families, children and schools in Africa that are unable to afford them.
- providing payments of fees for instruction, examination, or other expenses connected with formal education, vocational training, language, literacy, numerical or technical skills

We have particularly made impact in the provision of basic supplies, such as children’s clothes and shoes, books and other personal or educational supplies to help families, children and the school in Jago Community as they are unable to afford these items.

During meetings with the Chief and Council of the community, grave concerns had consistently been expressed about challenges faced by young girls in the only school situated within the community: period poverty. We have been informed about how period poverty causes girls and female teachers to have poor attendance as they are unable to attend school on days when they are going through their menstrual cycle. Therefore, we provided 550 sanitary towels, which even though was a scratch on the surface, but have been reported to have made a positive impact on attendance during that period.

In going forward, we are exploring opportunities and solutions for a more sustainable, hygienic and environment-friendly approach.

- Positive impact on attendance of girls and female teachers in the only school situated in Jago Community
- Provision of story books to children, with that being the first time more than 98% of the children could claim ownership of a story book. A few of them have been fortunate to own text books previously.
- Provision of raw food item (rice) to families in the community to ensure, for a period of time, that students are able to focus on their learning and not worry about hunger.
