This is the second year of a 2 year project to sink a Well to provide water to irrigate the crops and provide clean drinking water for public benefit. The main activities this year were to install the irrigation system to water the crops and to install a tap to provide clean drinking water. Purchase and installation of a 3000 litre water tank . Purchase and installation of solar panels to provide electricity to power the water pump.

In supporting these activities our aim was to raise the remaining amount to meet the cost of £9000 for the completion of the Well project.

These activities were successfully achieved this year.

In completing the well project we have provided wider benefit to the local community thus making clean drinking water available on tap for all thereby preventing water borne diseases.

This will prevent the time consuming, labour intensive and expense for transporting water by barrel to the site. Thus saving time for other tasks and reduce work load for the workers and ensure a good supply of water for the crops.

In completing the well project we have provided an irrigation system to ensure the crops are watered during the dry season in order to provide pig feed and a benefit to the local community in providing clean drinking water available on tap for all thereby preventing water borne diseases.

We purchased a 3000 litre water tank, water irrigation equipment, water pump and solar panels. This equipment supported the aims to achieve our objectives to provide an irrigation system to water the crops and provide clean drinking water for the local community. Thus helping the poor children and their families to support themselves by raising pigs to provide a sustainable livelihood for the relief of poverty which is the key aim of the charity.

Para 1.20	<p>The Well Project has been divided into 3 phases.</p> <p>Phase 1</p> <p>A. Drilling of a bore hole to locate water</p> <p>B. The necessary engineering work to secure the well.</p> <p>C. The installation of a submersible pump.</p> <p>D. The construction of a shelter for a security guard.</p> <p>Phase 1 has now been achieved and paid for by the UPPCIO. This is making progress towards the end point of the project which will provide clean water to irrigate the crops and prevent the time consuming need for transporting water by barrel. It will also provide wider benefits for the local community who currently do not have clean drinking water and are prone to waterborne disease such as diarrhoea, typhoid and hepatitis. The clean drinking water will be available on tap and prevent disease.</p> <p>Phase 2</p> <p>This is currently underway to provide the irrigation system.</p> <p>Phase 3</p> <p>This will follow with the installation of a 3,000 litre storage tank and the installation of solar panels to provide electricity to power the pump.</p>
