Report of the Trustees For the Year Ended 31 December 2025

The Trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

It is with great pleasure that we present this year's annual report on the work of The Evelyn Glennie Foundation, a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation (England and Wales) since January 2023.

In our third full year of operation The Foundation continued to strengthen its governance functions, adding six new Trustees bringing valuable expertise and experience in a number of disciplines including compliance and risk management, financial management, fundraising and marketing and communications. With our wider team of volunteers supporting the development of The Evelyn Glennie Collection – our key intellectual asset, made available under a loan agreement with Dame Evelyn – we dedicated our year to further development of The Foundation's mission, to Teach the World to Listen, achieving a number of key milestones and creating a clear set of priorities for 2026.

Highlights of the year included:

- Launching The Foundation's first website (January 2025);
- Running and extensive Trustee recruitment and engagement, which resulted in the appointment of five new Trustees (net) with significant and valuable skills to bring to our mission (over several months);
- Commencing build of a prototype database for The Evelyn Glennie Collection, a key stage in our progress towards full digitisation of The Collection, alongside the ongoing work of cataloguing thousands of artefacts and data points still being added to this resource (ongoing);
- Engagement with a number of external museums and collections (including Royal Albert Hall Museum, Horniman Museum, Farmland Museum and Samuel

Pepys House) to further our own understanding of Collection development and its role in our mission (ongoing);

- Agreeing a partnership with City Lit (adult university, London) to host The Foundation's first major public residency, Listen Up!, in May 2026;
- Active contribution/participation in the 'Feel the Sound' exhibition at The Barbican, London (May-August 2025);
- Developing our brand, brand strategy and values (June 2025);
- Supporting the stage text production of Shakespeare at The Towers (July 2025);
- Developing our risk strategy and key financial policies (July-November 2025);
- Developing and launching a new campaign - 'Ways of Listening' - with Cities and Memory, inviting submissions around the theme of what listening means to creative communities; (November 2025)
- Designing and delivering a new workshop, Listening as a Radical Act, with the Methodist Diocese in Doncaster (November 2025);
- Working in partnership with the Office of the Children and Young People's Commissioner for Scotland in the delivery of The Shoogle Lab - a major one-day conference for education professionals and young people designed to shake up how children and young people engage with their education in Scotland (December 2025)
- Running 12 volunteer-led tours of The Collection, for a total of 34 people (throughout the year).

2025 was an important year for The Foundation as we continue to refine our mission and build structures to help us deliver against our charitable objectives. With some small exceptions, everything we achieved this year has been delivered by volunteers and, building on what we have learned, we move into 2026 with greater confidence, a refined mission and an exciting programme of campaigns and wider plans designed to help us further our work.

Our sincere thanks to all Trustees active in this period and our Collection volunteers, for their considerable efforts this year, as well as the many partners and stakeholders that have provided support, encouragement and feedback.



1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)(Charities SORP (FRS102)), the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

It is with great pleasure that we present the second annual report on the work of The Evelyn Glennie Foundation, a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation (England and Wales) since January 2023.

In our second full year of operation The Foundation continued to strengthen its governance functions, adding three new Trustees bringing valuable expertise and experience in website build and design, marketing, digital projects and project management. With wider volunteers supporting development of The Evelyn Glennie Collection, our expanded group worked to further develop and refine The Foundation's mission, to *Teach the World to Listen*, achieving a number of key milestones and creating a clear set of priorities for 2025.

Highlights of the year included:

- Delivering an interactive listening enrichment session for twelve women at Askham Grange Prison for Women in North Yorkshire, in partnership with the National Literacy Trust (May);
- Developing and piloting *Who's Listening?* – a new iteration of our core listening workshop helping corporate workforces to rethink how they engage with each other (their teams) and listen closer to their customers, using the profound impact of attentive listening (September);
- Creating 'More than Simply Drums and Cymbals' – a booklet describing The Evelyn Glennie Collection – as a fundraising and educational tool;

- Embarking on the first phases of our Collection Digitisation project, starting with recruitment of a new, skilled volunteer to design and create a prototype database;
- Partnering with local theatre company Shakespeare at The George to provide inclusive stage text at of their one performances (July);
- Running nine volunteer-led free tours of The Collection, reaching 30 individuals, in addition to a number of other private tours for our partners and income-generating 'Meet the Dame' versions;
- Commissioning and creating our first dedicated website – www.evelynglennie.foundation (September – December 2024)
- Finalising plans for an extensive round of Trustee recruitment, seeking to add valuable skills and diverse voices to our Board, and celebrating the year with a gathering of Trustees, Volunteers and wider friends, to reflect on our achievements this year and look ahead to 2025.



The Trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Charity Objectives

To advance the education of the general public, in particular by supporting the development and application of curricula and practices that enhance communication skills and cognitive development including through workshops and training sessions in active listening, through the use of music.

It is with great pleasure that we present the first annual report on the work of The Evelyn Glennie Foundation. We received our status as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (England and Wales) on 5th January 2023, meaning this report effectively covers our first full operating year.

As is natural for any new charity, much of this period has been devoted to establishing our governance functions, fulfilling our statutory requirements and developing an operating model relevant to our unique mission, to *Teach the World to Listen*. Highlights include recruiting our founding group of Trustees, developing our ways of working as a Board and creating a clear separation between the interests, activities and legal identity of The Foundation and Dame Evelyn's business interests, as a performer.

Though these were all necessary establishing activities, The Foundation is fortunate in that we are not starting from scratch. The themes underpinning our mission have been incubated and nurtured throughout much of Dame Evelyn's professional career. Over several decades countless individuals and organisations, working in diverse fields, have sought out her help in areas beyond musical performance, to contribute to a range of initiatives with wider social value. They are drawn as much by Evelyn's unique approach to listening as her entrepreneurial nature, having forged a career in solo percussion where none previously existed, and despite the considerable personal obstacles she faced.

The Foundation now picks up this mantle, ensuring the social impact that Evelyn's wider work has often generated can be replicated more systematically, and on a greater scale. Harnessing the power of The Foundation's key assets - both Evelyn's lived experience of listening and also The Evelyn Glennie Collection - a vast archive of global instruments and career artefacts, made available to The Foundation to help us make 'teach the world to listen' a practical reality.

This year we were fortunate to receive some financial support to help us develop our approach, and in particular we wish to extend sincere thanks to the Charities Aid Foundation's American Donor Fund and We (Free the Children) UK, for two crucial grants that helped us pilot some key elements of our operating model.

These include our volunteer-led Collection tours - in person opportunities to test interaction between The Collection and beneficiaries, which we use to engage in cross-cultural discussions, explore the nature of sound and the importance of developing better listening skills. Drawn from all walks of life, early participants from the 22 tours we ran in 2023 have helped us to understand more about the impact of The Collection as a vehicle for boosting wellbeing and happiness, fostering co-operation and team building, as well as delivering wider educational objectives.

Despite not yet having a staff team in place, Trustees also wish to highlight the wider, largely partner-led work in which Dame Evelyn has participated this year, which included:

- Welcoming Young Carers and Scout Groups to The Collection;
- Loaning instruments to Higher Education institutions to inspire creativity and new repertoire;
- Delivering keynote addresses on the importance of engaging with the arts;
- Supporting the launch of animated ITVX series 'The Sound Collector';
- Offering work experience to local school children;
- Opening up The Collection to academics engaging in social research;
- Sponsoring the stage text production of a local Shakespeare company;
- Contributing to broadcasts on hospital radio and other mediums;
- Offering listening experiences to local people with neurodiversity;
- Supporting an immersive international sound exhibition and inclusive orchestras.

As we move into 2024 we are reflecting on these early opportunities to test our work, developing plans to scale up our efforts and refining the outcomes and impact we are seeking to achieve.

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment - 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Pension costs and the other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
