Para 1.20	<p>The key focus for this year, with the support of the National Lottery Reaching Communities Grant has been about development, with strategy development leading to evaluation framework development, fundraising and marketing strategies. This has been supported by extensive staff training.</p> <p>The project delivery has been dominated by:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Community training, leading to several communities now self-sustaining in delivering their own cooking activities; 2) Early Years projects working with families with young children, starting off their food journeys on healthier trajectory. 3) Long term community support in 2 key areas of deprivation, providing regular and ongoing access to cooking support. This has led to greater levels of confidence, social community contact and healthier diets. 4) Accessibility pilot projects have highlighted the desperate need for those with disabilities to be supported effectively and confidence increased, to

		be able to give them healthier choices and the ability to cook for themselves.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	<p>The charity's turnover has dropped slightly from £266,285 to £234,062. This is primarily due to a large contract won in the 23/4 financial year, but delivered in this financial year, limiting capacity for other new projects. The funding environment has also become more competitive since Covid and funding principles are changing away from Cost of Living support, from which the Charity benefited from in 23/4.</p> <p>Fixed costs have increased, as part of the National Lottery grant has enabled 5 salaried staff (part time) to support the Charity, supported also by Dorset Council.</p> <p>Our insurance, IT and other support costs have increased as a result of growth and ensuring that the team and our activities fully covered and connected.</p> <p>Other support costs have also increased, but mainly due to one off development costs, supported by the National Lottery.</p> <p>The session costs remain broadly in line with the number of events delivered, despite increases in food prices.</p>

However, our fundraising strategy provides a pathway to mitigate this risk. 2) Financial risks – low reserves – mitigated by recruitment of a Financial lead Trustee, review of policies including reserves 3) The manual tracking of funds presents a governance risk and increases the potential for the misuse of restricted funds. The Charity Commission expects clear and consistent fund tracking. We will be working to amend this in the forthcoming year. 4) Capacity of team to deliver objectives, however this is mitigated by our HR and operational plans, supported by investment in IT systems and use of self-employed contractors where needed.
