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




**Charity Objectives**

**Financial Review**

- MS-CAS has benefitted from 2 donations of £12,500 in 2023 and 2024 from the MS Society, being funds transferred and raised by the former MS Society of Macclesfield. The combined monies totaling £25,000 has enabled the charity to get established and be in a position to provide regular support and help to the MS community.
- In 2024, Legacies were received of £11,061 and £1,910 in Memory of people who have passed away. These monies, together with the MS donation of £12,500 above, were part of a total income of £37,692 for 2024.
- Expenditure for 2024 amounted to £25,431, of which £23,761 {93%} was the provision of Consultancy, Counselling, Exercise Sessions and Social events for the MS community in Macclesfield.
- The combined income for the first 2 years amounted to £55,491, of which £28,723 was held in bank accounts. Most of the bank balance is held in an interest bearing deposit account.
- The MS-CAS is in a strong financial position, and its bank balance held is equal to the running costs of a period approximating to one year.

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

