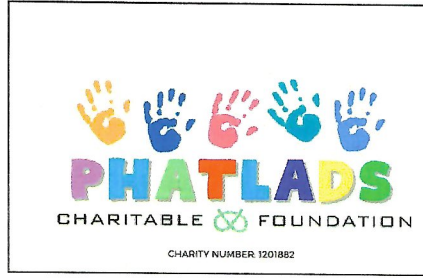

1. Introduction

1.1 Charitable Objects

The charity's charitable objects, as set out in its governing document.

The object of the CIO is the relief to those in need by reason of youth, age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other social or economic disadvantage by the provision of financial relief and assistance for the public benefit of those people residing in the West Midlands, East Midlands and North West of England regions.

1.2 Overview (Executive Summary)

Our second year as a charity was spent helping mostly children & families in the local area. Mainly focused on children suffering with illness, providing support to the Royal Stoke Children's Hospital with regular toy and sweets donations throughout the year, supporting small local charities - raising funds for and awareness of their causes, donating to many charitable fund raisers held by our members for causes in line with our charitable objects, donated food regularly to local Food Banks & Homeless shelters, donated money, toys and food to children's charities, community initiatives that work with under privileged children and helping bereaved families to pay for headstones for their babies.

2. Activities & Achievements

2.1 Outputs & Outcomes

Examples of the work we did was raise funds and pay for headstones for three babies whose parents could not afford to give them a memorial – this was done via Phat Lads Competition's generous donations.

We also raised a substantial amount of money £1,500 for Royal Stoke Children's Hospital by doing a sponsored Potters 'Arf half marathon with the staff of Phat Lads Competitions to raise much needed funds for their Neo Natal Vein Finder appeal.

We did a large toy drive for the Royal Stoke Children's hospital and have become their official fund-raising partner for the UHNM Charity. We bought hundreds of toys for children and their siblings who had to spend Christmas in hospital due to illness and the Oncology Ward's Christmas party.

2.2 Policies on Grant-Making and/or Social Investments

The charity does not make any grants, or make social or programme-related investments.

2.3 The Roles & Contributions of Volunteers

We'd like to thank Phat Lads Competitions for their generous donations of money throughout the year and their time in taking part in the Potter's 'Arf to raise funds for Royal Stoke Children's Hospital.

We'd also like to thank Kerry Kent for her endeavours as our Chair of Trustees. She has stepped down from that role but will remain on the board as a Trustee.

2.4 How the Public Have Benefitted

We hope that many families have benefited from the donations to Food banks and those we have made to the various Children's Hospitals and made life slightly more bearable for the children whilst undergoing treatment.

2.5 Looking Ahead

As an official fund-raising Partner of UHNM we hope to continue to raise money towards their Vein Finder Appeal for the Children's hospital and we want to develop greater links with more local charities and will be looking at restructuring by bringing in a new Trustee to spearhead the development and increase the amount of charitable activity we do. Paul Bate will be taking over the role of Chair of Trustees, supported by the new Trustee Vivien Bentley.

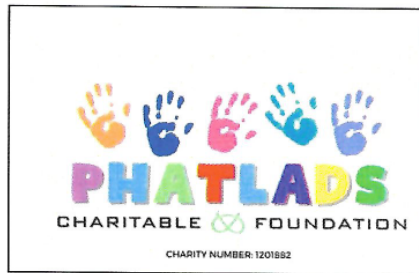

Mainly focused on children suffering with illness, providing support to the local Children's Hospitals with toy and sweets donations throughout the year, supporting small local charities - raising funds for and awareness of their causes, donating to many charitable fund raisers held by our members for causes in line with our charitable objects, donate regularly to local Food Banks & Homeless shelters and holding a family fun day fundraiser which had the aims of bringing the Phat lads community together and raising money for our donations for the Royal Stoke Children's Hospital.
