Achievements and Performance

The charity meets regularly for the promotion of physical and spiritual wellbeing of members and our immediate community at large. In the year under review, we've continued to reach out to the community through our Saturdays free coffee mornings. Apart from the members of the community coming in for a free drinks and chats, we also have a qualified counsellor/psychologist on ground who people can confidentially chat with and get signposted to various help and support where needed.

In the year, we've had various programmes for the youths which have been beneficial to their career development plans and promoting their health and wellbeing.

Our woman group has engaged in various programmes aimed at reaching out to our local care homes, in addition to ensuring support for one another which has been helpful in promoting their mental health and emotional wellbeing.

We've continued to invest on our children ministry and this has helped children for a good bond and relationship with their peers and the children's teachers, with a corresponding positive effects in their various homes and childhood development milestones.

We've continued our partnership with other churches around Luton and the local community to send Christmas hampers to the less privileged in the communities. We organise Christmas carol with the local care home in our community as a way of bringing the joy of Christmas to the elderly in the care homes. We also partner with compassion UK and CAP UK to support people through their charities.

Objectives of the Charity:

The advancement of Christian Faith, empowerment of members and involvement in local communities as set out in the Charity's Article and Schedule, in accordance with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission for promoting the objects.

Achievements and Performance

The charity meets regularly for the promotion of physical and spiritual wellbeing of members and our immediate community at large. As a way of meeting diverse needs, we have introduced variety/interactive services which takes place quarterly. Topics are carefully chosen to reflect the diverse background of the people we serve.

We've had such programmes in the past on issues that bothers on Mental Health Awareness, Raising Children in this 21st Century, Community Engagement Services, Carer Development, Financial Management, among others, and have chosen topics from a diverse range of life issues. We've also engaged a well diverse group of professionals/specialist in the past to handle such programmes. We've had good feedbacks on the impact the programmes have had in the life of our members and invited guests generally.

We conduct coffee mornings outreach on every 3rd Saturday of the month handled by a qualified counsellor/psychologist. This programme is open to the public and conducted in the Bedford square community centre. There has been a good engagement from the local community with this programme. We had a community BBQ last summer which provided the platform for people to come around, had a chat over some nibbles and engaged in sporting activities within the venue. We hope this will continue to be a yearly event.

As a way of developing our youth and young adult, we have introduced a quarterly youth service where our youths take over the church service. In addition, we've sponsored some of our youths on musical instrument trainings and have continued to be actively involved in helping youths embrace and maximise their potential. We've created different parts of learning where some of our youths have embraced and now taking active roles in volunteering in places such as school, communities, etc. Some of our youths have has taken the apprentice programmes while some have chosen a carer path in the university due to our vibrant youth outreach. We are very much family oriented and try to meet welfare need as much as we could thereby helping to stem the pressure of physical and mental stress among our members.

We celebrate Christmas every year by partnering with other churches around Luton and the local community to send Christmas hampers to the less privileged in the communities. We organise Christmas carol with the local care home in our community as a way of bringing the joy of Christmas to the elderly in the care homes. 
