Trustees Report for the year to 31st December 2024

CONSTITUTION

The trust is governed by a Declaration of Trust dated 17th December 2022 and was entered on the Central Register of Charities with effect from 21st February 2023.

An amendment was made and took effect on 27th March 2024.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

(including objectives and aims for the public benefit)

To advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in Basingstoke and the surrounding area through the holding of prayer meetings, religious education, teachings from the Bible, outreach and pastoral care in the local community, all to enlighten others about the Christian religion.

In March 2024 we also widened our objectives to include 'The relief of poverty and hardship in various forms, in the UK and abroad'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During 2024 we continued to meet together at Manor Field Junior School in Basingstoke. As mentioned previously, this venue was chosen partly because it resides within one of the most deprived regions of Basingstoke. The church commenced a trial of providing free community breakfasts. These have been provided at Manor Field Junior School. If these are successful, we expect to increase the frequency during 2025.

The church has continued to support the school and local community with:

- The presence of a welcoming church with the aim to be a hub in the community showing care, friendship and support both spiritually and practically for those in need.
- The trial of free community breakfasts, to encourage community, provide pastoral care for those in need and to introduce the Christian religion in a relaxed environment.
- A free BBQ for the local community where people could connect with each other in a non-threatening way, providing a meal for those who need it and encouraging friendships to develop.
- The provision of volunteers into the school including one on the Governing board.
- The Church paid for the students of the school again this year to go to a theatre performance. This is a rare experience of this kind for many of the children within the school.
- Supporting the work of the local food bank financially and by collecting supplies from our members on an ongoing basis. We also assisted with the packing of and distribution of Christmas Hampers.
- We have also made several donations towards other initiatives in the Basingstoke area where we felt there was a need.

In addition, the church has devised bible teaching programs that are beneficial to church members and the local community.

THE FUTURE

Our objective for 2025 is to continue to find favour with the local community and be able to bring the benefits of Christian principles to anybody that needs help and support. In particular supporting the children, parents and staff of Manor Fields Junior School.

This year we were unable to provide the planned CAP (Christians against Poverty) financial management course however, we have dates set aside for October 2025 to run a CAP Budgeting Course at Manor Field School. The school has agreed to promote this to all parents and guardians of children at the school.

After the trial of free community breakfasts in 2024 we want to continue this into 2025 on a more regular basis.

We also plan to run the free summer BBQ and fun day for the community again next year, building on the success of the trial in 2024.

We have also been looking at the needs of the local School Pastors and their work into a secondary school on Brighton Hill. This will be investigated further during 2025.

We are also considering the recruitment of a Youth Pastor to work with the young people on Brighton Hill and will continue to plan for this during 2025/26.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities is described in this document.

Financial Support

King's Church Basingstoke benefits from the generous support of it's church members.

During the year to 31st December 2024 the charity received income totaling £47,373

The charity does not make use of financial instruments.

Reserves policy

The charity is funded with an expectation to spend all public funds which are received and therefore has a policy not to maintain excessive reserves. The level of reserves held is monitored regularly by the board of trustees to ensure that sufficient funds are available to meet the charity's liabilities and obligations as they fall due. The Charity requires annual reserves of £12,000 to meet its obligations. As of 31st December 2024 the charity held funds of £79,816.

Public Benefit Reporting

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy.

Risk management

The main risk for the organisation is a reduction in donations being received due to economic circumstances. However, the trust has low overheads and a stable level of donations, therefore the trustees don't consider this to be a major risk at present.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document (trust deed), adopted on 17th December 2022.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

The Chairman and the Board of Trustees were selected for appointment on merit, through a fair and open recruitment process.

Trustee induction

All new Trustees receive various documents detailing the legal obligations of Trustees, alongside the Articles of Association, key policy and governance documents and details of the organisational structure.

CONSTITUTION

The trust is governed by a Declaration of Trust dated 17th December 2022 and was entered on the Central Register of Charities with effect from 21st February 2023.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

(including objectives and aims for the public benefit)

To advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in Basingstoke and the surrounding area through the holding of prayer meetings, religious education, teachings from the Bible, outreach and pastoral care in the local community, all to enlighten others about the Christian religion.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

2023 saw the establishment of King's Church Basingstoke as a new church. During this period, we began to meet together at Manor Fields Junior School in Basingstoke. This venue was chosen partly because it resides within one of the most deprived regions of Basingstoke. The school has one of the highest rates of pupil premium children in the UK. The church has supported the school and local community with:

- The provision of volunteers in a variety of areas.
- Support of school Governors.
- In December the Church paid for the students to go to a theatre performance. This would have been a first experience of this kind for many of the children.
- The offer of friendship and practical support within the community.

In addition, the church has devised bible teaching programs that are beneficial to church members and the local community.

THE FUTURE

Our objective is to continue to find favour with the local community and be able to bring the benefits of Christian principles to anybody that needs help and support. In particular supporting the children, parents and staff of Manor Fields Junior School.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The charity does not make use of financial instruments.

Reserves policy

The charity is funded with an expectation to spend all public funds which are received, and therefore has a policy not to maintain excessive reserves. The level of reserves held is monitored regularly by the board of trustees to ensure that sufficient funds are available to meet the charity's liabilities and obligations as they fall due. The Charity requires annual reserves of around £15,000 to meet its obligations. As of 31st December 2023 the charity held funds of £58,865.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting the grant making policy.

Risk management




