

The aim is to open up far more of the site to visitors, and for community use , and to operate the winding engine regularly. Elements completed in this first year of a 3 year project include :- Extensive repairs to masonry walls supporting the pit bank; Provision of a new Fire Escape for the Winding House and the purchase and import of a special high volume compressor from China which has been permanently installed to enable the winding engine to be run on a regular basis. Further elements of this program will continue into 2026.</b>
