It is also benefiting the local workforce by providing affordable and accessible childcare for children allowing parents to return to work. The Cylch is improving the Welsh Language skills of children which supports the transition to primary school in Cemaes. To ensure inclusion and support children with Additional Learning Needs, the Cylch employed
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	a part time 121 support assistant. The role was funded by the local authority. In addition to the three employed part time members of staff, the Cylch recruited a bank staff member, able to cover at short notice, during periods of staff absence. The Cylch has undertaken an annual parents' consultation at the end of the summer term, with the parents being very positive about the Cylch's impact on their children's development.
