Report of the Board of Trustees :

BURUNGA UNION FOUNDATION UK is a community based Charity organisation working for the welfare of the communities. The BUF UK is committed to help disadvantaged people who are having economic hard ship due to homelessness, language barriers particularly people from ethnic minorities who are underachieved in mainstream education. The young and old alike people participate in a wide range of religious, cultural and social activities such supplementary education classes, IAG sessions on issues affecting their social and economic wellbeing.

Trustees are the people responsible for controlling the work, management and administration of the charity on behalf of its beneficiaries. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Reserve policy:

It is the policy of the BURUNGA UNION FOUNDATION UK that unrestricted funds, which have not been designated for a specific use, should be maintained at a level equivalent to at least their month's expenditure. The Board of Trustees consider that reserve at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Foundation activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

The BURUNGA UNION FOUNDATION UK Board of Trustees will actively work to achieve this level of reserves.
