All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no remuneration or other benefits.

The trustees seek the views of volunteers in the execution of the day to day running of the Club activities regarding rugby and other sporting provision. Committee meetings are held monthly and are open to all volunteer members who wish to attend.

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year, and any wider benefits to society as a whole:

We continue to grow and provide regular training and games for both adults and Age Grade (4yrs to 18yrs) by providing the use of grounds, floodlights and other facilities to our members.

We also continue to facilitate and provide opportunities for our local secondary and primary school settings and some of our volunteer coaches have given freely of their time to run extra-curricular rugby sessions in these schools. We again supported and assisting in the running of the area Schools' Tag Rugby Skills Festival for Key Stage 2 children which was well attended by over 20 local schools. We'd like to thank the Forest Heath Sports Partnership Manager for continuing to engage with the Club and sharing our love and enthusiasm for rugby activities.

	<p>Our partnership with Northampton Saints Rugby Club has also continued to grow and we have again provided both the facilities and grounds, as well as coaching support to run school holiday camp activities and skills development courses.</p> <p>Our youth teams have had great success in their leagues across the season as have our senior team, who were winners of County Cup. Our girl's section is also expanding, and we have formed an alliance with local clubs to ensure that they get plenty of game time too.</p> <p>We continue to support the local rugby community. Our qualified First Aid Trainer is able to provide many first aid courses as well as the necessary Level 3 Emergency First Aid courses. These have been well attended by our Club members along side local Rugby Clubs and rugby clubs from the surrounding counties, other sports clubs, local schools and businesses. The Club also benefits financially from the reasonable charges for the service.</p> <p>This year has seen yet another cohort of older children (14yrs+) access coaching courses to further improve their education outside of the scope of the National Curriculum provided by their schools as well as being supported in their Duke of Edinburgh Award. We have given our young coaches the support to involve themselves in community-based activities via the coaching of younger players, that were not previously available.</p>
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Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period:

<p>Our main source of income remains that from membership and sponsorship payments.</p> <p>We would like to express our deepest thanks to our Club Sponsorship and Marketing Director, who has worked tirelessly to ensure that our sponsorship remains constant. The cost-of-living crisis has hit hard this year and consequently sponsorship opportunities have decreased. There are some sponsorship payments that are due within our playing season which, however, fall outside of the financial year and will be reflected in the next year's accounts.</p> <p>We would also like to send a big thank you to our sponsors without whom many of our children could not continue to play sports. Their sponsorship allows us to keep the cost of our membership low and in some cases, (fully) subsidise their membership payment to the Club; allowing many families who struggle financially to access our activities. A cause that is at the heart of Newmarket Rugby Club.</p>

The social, physical and mental benefits of what we provide for our players is immeasurable, and our sponsors are a part of this.

Despite several obstacles and rising costs our kitchen sales have increased this year and again a big thank you to our Kitchen Co-Ordinators and parent volunteers for being in the kitchen every Sunday throughout the season and some mid-week.

We continue our discussions with Suffolk County Council, and more recently West Suffolk Council, to try to negotiate a lease (or shared lease) for grounds in the Newmarket area which will have the added benefit of allowing us to access the available funding and grants we very much need to improve our facilities and equipment and ensure our players get the best of what they need.

Our major fundraising event for the year usually takes place in the off-season months. This is a very important event that usually raises thousands in much needed revenue for the Club's following season. Unfortunately, last year we were locked out of the grounds we use, from the beginning of May to the 31st August (training restarted on 1st Sept) and our summer fundraising event was cancelled. Sadly, a missed opportunity for the Club to raise much needed funds. The hard work on fundraising at this year's end of season events will be reflected in the accounts for our next financial year (cash at bank sits at just under £18k – early May 2025).

Our costs have increased greatly this year. The majority of our income is used to pay for use of the grounds, changing rooms and toilet access, with other costs to cover training equipment and food – the RFU place upon us a duty to provide post-match food for both home and away teams (with the added benefit of providing a warm meal for those children whose families struggle to provide this).

(N.B grounds and building facilities not owned by NRUFC, however, floodlights, all sporting equipment and refreshment facilities are).

Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held:

We do not hold funds in reserve but seek to keep funds at such a level so that we are able to continue to pay for our annual costs including use of the grounds, electric bill for the floodlights, food, annual replacement of kit and other occasional costs.

We have had two projects this year: one to replace the goal post protectors to improve safety for our players which we have achieved, and the new protectors have been very welcomed by both our membership and the referees society.

Our second and third, on going, projects are to replace the goal posts and update our training equipment, both expensive costs and we have several fundraising avenues in place to help us achieve these providing

our other costs do not increase to such a level that we will need to use the Club funds to pay for those.

We have provided regular training and games for both adults and Age Grade (4yrs to 18yrs) by providing the use of grounds, floodlights and other facilities to our members.

We have facilitated and provided opportunities for our local schools by supporting and assisting in the area Schools' Tag Rugby Skills Festival – attended by over 12 local schools – as well as providing coaches to run extra-curricular rugby classes at some of these schools (at both secondary and primary settings).

We have connected with Northampton Saints Rugby Club to ensure facilities and grounds to run school holiday activities and skills development courses.

Our qualified First Aid Trainer has provided first aid courses to our Club as well as local Rugby Clubs, other sporting Clubs and local schools and businesses. Renumeration for this service was in terms of equipment needed, travel and use of his time.

We are strong supports of other charitable organisations and this year we support the Men's Testicular Cancer Charity by holding a charity run in which all funds raised were donated to the Testicular Cancer Charity.

We have enable our older children (14yrs+) to access coaching courses to further improve their education outside of the scope of the National Curriculum provided by their schools and support those doing their Duke of Edinburgh Awards. We have given our young coaches the support to involve themselves in community-based activities via the coaching of younger players, that were not previously available.

(N.B grounds and building facilities not owned by NRUFC, however, floodlights, all sporting equipment and refreshment facilities are).

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period:

Our main source of income comes from membership payments and sponsorship payments from local businesses. We use general funds to subsidise membership and training kit costs for individuals who would otherwise not be able to participate. The majority of our income is used to pay fees for us of the grounds and building with other costs to cover training equipment and food – the RFU place upon us a duty to provide post-match food for both home and away teams (with the added benefit of providing a warm meal for those children whose families struggle to provide this).

The Club has been fundraising for some time and this financial year finally saw us in a position to be able to update the floodlights in our possession. The updated floodlights have allowed us to provide a safer environment for mid-week training as well as extend our offering to a Friday evening for both Club and County matches.

Although the accounts show a deficit this can be offset by late sponsorship payments that had not yet been paid into the account before the financial year due to a change over of staff.

Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held:

We do not hold funds in reserve but seek to keep funds at such a level so that we are able to continue to pay for use of the grounds and buildings we use as well as the electric bill for the floodlights, food, annual replacement of kit and other occasional costs.

Having spent funds on the floodlights, our next fundraising project is to replace the goal posts and the post protectors to improve safety for our players.


