Objectives and activities

The objects of the CIO, to be carried out for the benefit of the public in Worcestershire and the West Midlands, are: 1. The promotion of community participation in healthy recreation in particular by the provision of facilities for the playing of Football and other sports capable of promoting physical health and fitness. 2. THE provision of recreational and leisure time activities in the interests of social welfare for people who have need by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, poverty or social and economic circumstances, or for the public at large, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons.

The charity was set up in 2023 to make football and sport more accessible for people of all ages and abilities. In our first year of operating, we've delivered a range of programmes to enable people to play sport from the age of 4 to 84. We've created 70 affiliated teams, including disability teams, walking football, women and girls and a range of junior teams. Our ethos is 'People not Players'. We want to create an environment where people get joy from playing sport in a way that leads to their personal growth. We work with a range of key stakeholders who buy into this vision including local schools, The Pathfinder Programme and our partner Charity 'The Charlie Fogarty Foundation'.

Achievements and performance

The Foundation has enjoyed a second successive year of success, with The Hayes becoming a key community asset that provides sporting opportunities for people aged 4 to 80 years old. We now operate 45 affiliated teams, ranging from 'Little Kickers' to Walking Football for older players.

Our ethos is 'People not Players'. We want to create an environment where people get joy from playing sport in a way that leads to their personal growth. We work with a range of key stakeholders who buy into this vision including local schools, The Pathfinder Program and our partner Charity 'The Charlie Fogarty Foundation'.

Our outreach football program aimed at the Hawkesley estate, continues to grow in strength. The Hawkesley estate has the highest rates of child poverty in the entire city. We were concerned that the cuts in youth services had meant the council's youth work offer had been reduced. Our National Lottery Funded sessions provide a key enrichment activity to young people experiencing the disadvantages of lack of opportunities and lack of resources.

We have successfully improved our Walking Football provision, providing 2 sessions a week. Walking Football has been hugely successful in engaging older people who've had a hiatus from exercise over many decades. It has also been proven to be a hugely effective way of promoting falls prevention, giving participants better balance and dexterity.

Our holiday provision reached over 250 young people thanks to the continued support from Nathan Redmond, formerly of Birmingham City FC. The camps have provided a high quality and positive enrichment activity for children who may otherwise find the school holidays a challenging experience. The holiday camps have also enabled us to offer employment pathways to young coaches who've earned their qualifications through one of our personal development Initiatives.

Achievements and performance *(continued)*

We've delivered sports sessions in 4 local schools helping children and young people develop a passion for sport and physical activity. Our partnership work with Pathfinder helps us identify families who would most benefit from our activities. We are also working with them to provide Christmas vouchers to families going through significant financial and emotional angst.

We continue to work with partners to build the infrastructure of football in Birmingham to make it a more inclusive sport. We have expanded our women's section from 3 to 9 teams. We've also developed our first competitive Walking Football Team in the Under 64 League and are planning to enter a team in the Under 67 years olds league. We are now operating 2 disability teams in the Ability Counts League.

We continue to operate an Alvechurch team in the recently formed Mental Health League which features Birmingham City, Wolves, Walsall, Coventry City and West Bromwich Albion. We played a pivotal role in establishing this league to create new opportunities for adults with mental health challenges.

As part of our drive to a more inclusive organisation, we have successfully continued to develop the skills of our staff team. This includes training the staff in British Sign Language and supporting the development of participants from our disability sessions to progress into coaching. We are particularly proud of the story of CD who went from being a participant with profound mental health barriers who struggled to attend sessions, to being a successful coach and a valued member of the staff team.


Financial review

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2025

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is a charitable incorporated organisation. The address of the principal office is The Hayes, Redditch Road, Kings Norton, Birmingham, B38 8LP.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase, costs of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the CIO, to be carried out for the benefit of the public in Worcestershire and the West Midlands, are:

1. The promotion of community participation in healthy recreation in particular by the provision of facilities for the playing of Football and other sports capable of promoting physical health and fitness; and
2. The provision of recreational and leisure time activities in the interests of social welfare for people who have need by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, poverty or social and economic circumstances, or for the public at large, with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons.

The charity was set up in 2023 to make football and sport more accessible for people of all ages and abilities. In our first year of operating, we've delivered a range of programmes to enable people to play sport from the age of 4 to 84. We've created 70 affiliated teams, including disability teams, walking football, women and girls and a range of junior teams. Our ethos is 'People not Players'. We want to create an environment where people get joy from playing sport in a way that leads to their personal growth. We work with a range of key stakeholders who buy into this vision including local schools, The Pathfinder Programme and our partner Charity 'The Charlie Fogarty Foundation'.

Achievements and performance

We have delivered a variety of funded programmes to support the local community.

We deliver an outreach football programme at the Hawkesley Community Centre in Kings Norton. The Hawkesley estate has the highest rates of child poverty in the entire city. We were concerned that the cuts in youth services had meant the council's youth work offer had been reduced. We therefore stepped in to deliver 2 weekly sports sessions and expanded the delivery during the 6 week holiday period.

Our local research foundation that girls were being precluded from taking up physical activity from the surrounding area due to concerns over a lack of safe spaces. As a result we secured Sport England funding to deliver a programme that provides them with a weekly Futsal session and Padel tennis. The project has been crucial in giving the participants a sense of belonging, where they can express themselves without fear of judgment.

We have successfully delivered a Walking Football project that enjoys participation from 30 participants weekly. Such is the popularity of the project we now run 2 sessions a week. The project has been particularly effective in engaging people who otherwise would not engage in social activities, helping them become more connected to their community.

We have delivered a holiday programme during each of the school holidays, supporting over 300 children. The camps are subsidized via a generous donation from premier league footballer Nathan Redmond. This has meant local working families have access to affordable, high quality sports enrichment activities during the holiday period.

We've delivered sports programmes in 12 local school helping children and young people develop a passion for sport and physical activity. We worked with Pathfinder to deliver Christmas Hampers to families in need from our local communities.

We continue to work with partners to build the infrastructure of football in Birmingham to make it a more inclusive sport. We have grown our women's section from 3 to 9 teams. We've also developed our first competitive Walking Football Team in the Under 64 League. We are currently working with the Birmingham FA to create the cities first Girls Futsal League.

We have an adult and a junior teams in the Ability Counts league. This enables participants to develop a sporting hobby and play competitively if they wish. Our Junior Ability Counts team won the U14 league championship last season.

We have 1 team in the newly formed Mental health league which features Birmingham City, Wolves, Walsall, Coventry City and West Bromwich Albion. We played a pivotal role in establishing this league to create new opportunities for adults with mental health challenges.

We have supported 5 of our participants from our disability programmes to achieve their level 1 FA Coaches. This is central to our ambition to build the capacity of disability football in Birmingham. Through our football holiday camps, we have offered paid placements for all 5.

As a result of our efforts, we were short-listed in the Sport Birmingham Awards for Inclusivity in Sport.

Financial review

The Foundation's income for the period amounted to £533,907, with costs totalling £465,941.

The net operating surplus for the period was therefore £67,966.


Independent examiner's statement

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. General information

The address of the principal office is The Hayes, Redditch Road, Kings Norton, Birmingham, B38 8LP.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.
