- Rescue Centres – liaising with the public and working alongside parrot rescue groups to ensure that parrots are properly catered for in an environment that best suits them
- Parrot Intake – taking in unwanted or bereaved parrots from the public
- Volunteering – giving opportunities for the public to take on volunteering roles


