Volunteers were engaged in the charity's activities based on their expertise where they were either experts in mental health topic, or are trained and fully assessed such that their contribution aligns with the needs, activities and operations of the charity's objectives in line with governing documents. Engagement is voluntary based and is not permanent/ or formal employment, but activity based. Remuneration of costs such as transport fare which volunteers may incur in engaging with the charity's activities can be reimbursed based on the funding available and allocated to each activity.

Para 1.20	<p>The charity has managed to deliver 12 online and face to face workshops, equipping attendees with self-help strategies and techniques to manage stress, anxiety, worry, low mood, and sleep hygiene. The average number of Attendees was 25 people per session.</p> <p>The attendees feedback post the workshops was that they noticed better capacity to tolerate uncertainty, and manage stress better, anxiety, worry and low mood better, noticing an improvement in mood and motivation , and engagement in pleasurable, social and relational activities.</p>

		Other attendees reported that they found the workshops beneficial, particularly that they felt equipped with practical strategies which they were implementing. Further reported benefit for wider society included improved productivity, improved sleep, reduced reliance on mainstream NHS health services as before for stress related symptoms, and reduced sick leave days from work.

Para 1.20	<p>The charity has managed to offer its services to different groups within Leeds UK area. The Charity undertook 7 workshops to date. The Charity Trustees who are professional mental health practitioners volunteered to deliver mental awareness and promotion workshops with diversified groups including asylum seekers and refugee population residing in Leeds UK, from Ukraine, east Africa and Afghanistan and Iraq, black and ethnic minority groups, and other wider population groups including in churches and university groups.</p> <p>In these sessions the residents of Leeds, have benefited from getting psychoeducation about mental health, noticing the signs of mental ill health, implementing self-help strategies, and how to contact mental health and support agencies and services in Leeds.</p> <p>We believe that this has benefited the residents of Leeds to enable them to improve their mental health by encouraging them to engage in low-cost self-help mental health promotions activities like taking walks, increasing social contact and maintaining value-based activities.</p> <p>Furthermore, we believe that this has a positive effect in reducing overdependence on primary and secondary care mental health services when residents are maintaining good mental wellbeing.</p>
