Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	<p>The charity's purpose, as set out in its constitution, is to relieve sickness, infirmity and the disabilities attendant amongst persons living in County Durham by providing a local broadcasting service for hospitals, hospices, care homes, and similar institutions.</p> <p>Where possible, the charity also provides a similar service within the local community to assist patients receiving care in the community.</p>

Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>During the year, the charity continued to deliver hospital broadcasting services, providing entertainment and companionship to patients. Activities included collecting music requests, engaging with patients and staff, and delivering live and recorded programming.</p> <p>The charity also undertook community engagement initiatives and outside broadcasts to raise awareness and extend its reach. A key partnership with the Spice Lounge Indian Restaurant supported the charity's main fundraising efforts.</p>

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	<p>During the year, Prince Bishops Hospital Radio has made significant progress in delivering its charitable objectives. The charity increased its presence on hospital wards, enhancing direct engagement with patients and staff. Online listenership also grew, reflecting the wider reach of its services beyond the hospital environment.</p> <p>The station was shortlisted for 2 awards after entering the Hospital Broadcasting Association National Awards.</p> <p>The volunteer base increased, strengthening the charity's capacity to deliver its services.</p> <p>The station continues to support the County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust (CDDFT) in producing their new podcast, <i>Inside CDDFT</i>, further embedding the station within the local healthcare community.</p> <p>The charity also advanced its health and wellbeing aims by conducting weekly interviews on a range of relevant topics, providing valuable information and support to listeners.</p> <p>Prince Bishops Hospital Radio maintained 100% compliance with the OFCOM Broadcasting Code throughout the year and received no complaints, demonstrating its commitment to high broadcasting standards.</p>

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	During the financial year ending 30 September 2025, Prince Bishops Hospital Radio received total income of £5,776.00, primarily from fundraising events such as Indian Nights and donations. Expenditure for the year totalled £7,983.75, resulting in a deficit of £2,207.75. This was largely due to the costs of going onto DAB. Despite this, the charity remains in a stable financial position with year-end reserves of £1,274.40 held in the bank with additional income due in the next financial year.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	The charity aims to maintain sufficient reserves to cover at least six months of core operating costs, including licensing, insurance, and communication expenses. This policy ensures continuity of service in the event of unforeseen income shortfalls or

		emergency expenditures.

The charity's principal sources of funds (including any fundraising)	Para 1.47	The principal source of income during the year was the ongoing partnership with the Spice Lounge Indian Restaurant, which hosts regular fundraising events. While this has been a reliable source of funding, the trustees recognise the risk of over-reliance on a single income stream. As such, efforts are underway to diversify income sources to ensure long-term financial sustainability.

How is the charity constituted?	Para 1.25	Prince Bishops Hospital Radio is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).
Trustee selection methods including details of any constitutional provisions e.g. election to post or name of any person or body entitled to appoint one or more trustees	Para 1.25	The charity's constitution provides for the appointment of both elected and appointed trustees. Elected trustees are chosen by the members at the Annual General Meeting, with one-third retiring each year by rotation. Appointed trustees are selected by resolution of the existing trustees, based on the skills and experience needed for effective governance. All trustees must be natural persons aged 16 or over, and at least one trustee must be aged 18 or over.

Additional training is provided to trustees and volunteers through the County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust, including annual refresher training.
The charity's organisational structure and any wider network with which the charity works	Para 1.51	The charity operates within a hospital setting and aligns many of its day-to-day practices with NHS policies and procedures, particularly in areas such as safeguarding, health and safety, and infection control. However, the charity remains independently governed and adheres to the regulatory framework set out by the Charity Commission.
