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2. Structure, Governance and Management

BASSE CÔTE UK PROGRESS is an unincorporated charity governed by its constitution. The charity is managed by a board of trustees appointed in accordance with the governing document.

The charity was officially registered on **18 May 2023**, and this report covers the period from its registration date to 31 December 2023.

2. Structure, Governance and Management

BASSE CÔTE UK PROGRESS is an unincorporated charity governed by its constitution. Upon registration, the charity appointed its initial board of trustees, responsible for managing the organisation in accordance with its governing document and ensuring compliance with relevant charity law.

The trustees are responsible for ensuring that the charity operates for the public benefit and in accordance with the guidance of the Charity Commission.

No governance changes were made during the reporting period.

3. Objectives and Activities

The charity's stated objectives are to:

- Support social and community development for individuals connected to the Basse Côte region and diaspora.
- Promote education, cultural development, and wellbeing.
- Advance charitable initiatives aimed at improving community cohesion and quality of life.

Activities from 18 May 2023 to 31 December 2023

During this initial period, **the charity did not undertake any formal charitable activities.** This was primarily due to the charity's focus on establishing its governance, registration, and administrative structure following its incorporation in May 2023.
