Summary of the purpose of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	The charity exists to support children and young people undergoing cancer treatment, with a particular focus on those with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), and their families. We provide both financial and practical assistance to help alleviate some of the challenges associated with treatment and hospitalisation. This support includes the provision of entertainment and wellbeing packages (now known as Bundles of Fun) and, where needed, food vouchers to assist families experiencing financial hardship.
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>During this year the charity continued to support children and young people undergoing cancer treatment, particularly those with Autism, and their families. Alongside providing direct support, we focused on increasing public awareness of the charity's work and strengthening fundraising efforts to ensure the continued delivery of our service.</p> <p>We received and fulfilled 48 referrals for our entertainment and wellbeing packages (Bundles of Fun). These packages were designed to provide comfort, distraction and enjoyment for children during periods of treatment and hospitalisation. In</p>

		<p>addition, food vouchers were provided to families experiencing financial hardship as a result of their child's illness and treatment. Feedback received from recipients of both our packages and vouchers programme was overwhelming and very positive, demonstrating the value of this support in reducing stress and improving wellbeing during difficult circumstances.</p> <p>The charity also continued its annual Christmas initiative, offering children spending the festive period in hospital the opportunity to write letters to Santa. Each child received a personalised reply together with a small gift. During this year, 48 children of varying ages participated in the scheme, helping to bring comfort, joy and a sense of normality during what can be a particularly challenging time for families.</p> <p>During the year, we began developing a new "Comfort Kit" initiative for parents whose child is receiving palliative or end-of-life care. The purposed kits will contain practical and supportive items for families facing the possibility of a transfer to a hospice or an extended hospital stay. This initiative was inspired by the lived experience of the charity founders and aims to provide comfort, guidance and practical assistance to families during exceptionally difficult circumstances.</p> <p>We also commenced planning, in partnership with a local motorcycle group, to deliver sensory toys to children undergoing treatment during the Easter period. This project aims to provide additional comfort and engagement for children in hospital and will further extend the charity's</p>
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		<p>support services in the coming year.</p> <p>We as a charity have expanded its range of practical support by sourcing materials and producing specialised IV drip covers for children receiving chemotherapy, blood transfusions and platelet treatment. These covers are designed to conceal the contents of IV bags, helping to reduce anxiety and distress for children who may find medical procedures and visible treatment equipment intimidating. By providing a source of comfort during treatment, they contribute to a more positive hospital experience for children undergoing treatment. In conclusion with healthcare professionals on paediatric oncology wards, the charity also identified a need to support parents and carers who are unexpectedly admitted to hospital with their child and may not have had the opportunity to pack essential personal items. In response, we have begun developing emergency parent support bags containing practical items such as toothbrushes, flannels, comforts socks, toiletries, puzzles books. Colouring material and other every day essentials. These aim to alleviate some of the practical and emotional pressures experienced by families during hospital admissions, ensuring that both parents and children receive additional support at what can be an extremely challenging time.</p>

Para 1.20	<p>During the year, the charity continued to make a positive impact on the families its supports. Feedback from beneficiaries has been overwhelmingly positive, with parents expressing appreciation for the thoughtful and personalised nature of the gifts provided. Families particularly valued the flexibility of receiving supermarket vouchers, enabling them to choose their retailer best suited to their individual circumstances and needs.</p> <p>The charity's work has also gained recognition within the local community. As a result of support provided to beneficiaries, being approached by a local motorcycle group who want to explore opportunities to raise</p>

		<p>awareness. This demonstrates a growing profile within the wider community and their willingness to engage and support our mission.</p> <p>Looking ahead, trustees have been actively considering opportunities to increase fundraising activity and diversify income streams to ensure the long-term sustainability of the charity. Plans are being developed to expand the range and reach of services provided, enabling the charity to support more people and further strengthen its positive contribution to the local community.</p>

<p>Achievements against objectives set</p>	<p>Para 1.41</p>	<p>During the year, Raeyah's Hands of Support successfully achieved its primary objective of providing practical support to families experiencing financial hardship. A total of 48 families received assistance through the charity's programmes, including food vouchers and our "Bundles of Fun" entertainment packages, helping to reduce financial pressures while providing positive experiences for children and families.</p> <p>The charity also sought to increase community engagement and raise awareness of its work. This objective was achieved through participation in a variety of community events and fundraising activities throughout the year. These included a Summer Fete, Bingo events, a Children's Halloween Party, and attendance at local fetes and markets. These activities not only generated valuable funds but also increased the charity's visibility within the local community and helped build new relationships with supporters and partner organisations.</p>
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		<p>Trustees are encouraged by the positive feedback received from beneficiary families, many of whom commented on the thoughtful support provided and the flexibility offered through supermarket vouchers. The charity's growing reputation was further demonstrated by interest from local community groups seeking opportunities to support and collaborate with the charity.</p>
<p>Performance of fundraising activities against objective set</p>	<p>Para 1.41</p>	<p>The charity's fundraising objective for the year was to generate sufficient income to sustain and develop its support for families experiencing financial hardship, while increasing awareness of the charity's work within the local community.</p> <p>This objective was successfully achieved through a range of fundraising and community engagement activities, including a Summer Fete, Bingo events, a Children's Halloween Party, and attendance at local fetes and markets. These events provided valuable opportunities to raise funds, engage with supporters, and promote the charity's aims and activities.</p> <p>During the year, the charity raised a total of £13,475.29. This income has enabled the charity to continue delivering practical support to families through the provision of food vouchers and "Bundles of Fun" entertainment packages, directly benefiting 48 families during the reporting period.</p> <p>Fundraising activities also helped strengthen the charity's presence within the community, resulting in increased awareness of its work and the development of new relationships with supporters and local organisations. The trustees are pleased with the outcome of the year's fundraising efforts and believe they have provided a strong foundation for the charity's continued growth and future sustainability.</p>

Income generated through fundraising activities and donations enabled the charity to meet its charitable objectives and provide support to 48 families through food vouchers and "Bundles of Fun" entertainment packages.</p> <p>The trustees have continued to monitor the charity's finances carefully to ensure that funds are used effectively and in furtherance of the charity's charitable purposes. The charity maintained appropriate financial controls throughout the year and all expenditure was directed towards supporting beneficiaries and the operation of the charity.</p> <p>The trustees are satisfied with the charity's financial position at the year end and believe that the funds available will enable the charity to continue its activities and pursue its objectives in the forthcoming year. Efforts will continue to focus on growing and maintaining financial sustainability through ongoing fundraising and community support.</p>

Reasons for holding zero reserves	Para 1.22	<p>The trustees have chosen not to maintain a reserves fund at this stage of the charity's development. As a small charitable organisation, the trustees believe that funds raised should be applied directly to supporting beneficiaries and delivering the charity's objectives wherever possible.</p> <p>During the reporting period, available funds were used to provide food vouchers and "Bundles of Fun" entertainment packages to families in need, as well as to support the charity's activities and fundraising events. As a result, no unrestricted reserves were held at the year end.</p> <p>The trustees recognise the importance of maintaining adequate reserves and will continue to review the charity's financial position regularly. As the charity grows and income becomes more predictable, consideration will be given to establishing an appropriate reserves policy to support the charity's long-term sustainability.</p>

Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>The first year was slow and fundraising was minimal from fundraising activities.</p> <p>We put together 40 entertainment packages to promote the work we do for children going through a cancer diagnosis whilst working on the referrals paperwork and the information that needs to be included to make it simple and efficient for hospital staff to understand and send requests.</p> <p>Feed back from vouchers and entertainment packages sent in has been positive.</p> <p>From experience of being in hospital over the Christmas period with our daughter we were saddened to know she would be missing out on some of the festivities that young children enjoy at this time of year, including writing a letter to Santa. Therefore, we set ourselves an objective to send Santa post boxes onto the two children's cancer wards and provide</p>

		<p>them with the opportunity to write a letter to Santa. We write individual letters back, with a certificate and Christmas bell to hang on their tree or put at the end of there bed on Christmas Eve making sure Santa visits.</p> <p>This was well received and we had over 25 letters and pictures from children of all ages.</p> <p>We also provided gifts, arts and crafts for the staff to supply to the children admitted over the Christmas period which was a huge hit as reported by the nursing staff.</p> <p>We were asked about overnight bags for parents with a child who was suddenly admitted as the hospital often don't have supplies of toothbrushes etc for parents. Therefore, we made up ten overnight bags for parents and delivered them to the hospital to hand out as and when they were needed.</p>

Para 1.20	<p>We have sent out 146 packages during this first year and feedback has been very positive, parents commenting about how thoughtful it is and it kept their child entertained for ages. Families were also grateful of food vouchers and stated they have been a great help during difficult times.</p> <p>“Thank you so much for our daughter’s package, she has been in hospital for three weeks, these gifts have given her such a boost and provided her with hours of fun, I can’t thank you enough”.</p> <p>We have received letters in the post from an anonymous supporter who wanted us to know the admire the work we do, especially given the history of how the charity was started.</p> <p>The parents over night bags we provided contained, a flask, tea, coffee, hot chocolate, biscuits, toothpaste, a toothbrush and other essential items that are needed at short notice. These came in handy for parents who suddenly found themselves staying in with their child unable to leave to buy essentials. Staff were extremely grateful and it meant parents didn’t need to leave their child’s bed side to</p>

		find a shop or spend money for purchase these items.
