Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)	<p>In consideration of the Commission's guidance on public benefit the trustees have continued the running of an outreach group initially based at the Kings Baptist Church Cleethorpes. This group provides support to parents-to-be and new parents in our area through the provision of a relaxed, safe space, a range of suitable toys, infant feeding support from a qualified breastfeeding counsellor, healthy refreshments and peer support.</p> <p>In addition, the trustees secured funding via a Start for Life grant from the local council to facilitate the ongoing provision of the group and accessible, free antenatal classes, as there is limited antenatal education available in North East Lincolnshire. Covid's enforced separation and social isolation increased instances of birth trauma, therefore unmet needs are greater than ever. The way to positively impact birth trauma and reduce depression in the perinatal and postnatal period is to provide empowering education pre-birth and enabling support postnatally. By securing this funding Nurture Village CIO has supported pregnant and new parents to form friendships with new parents and parents to be in similar positions by providing accessible antenatal workshops and antenatal/postnatal support in our community group. These provisions have reduced feelings of isolation, improved wellbeing and mental health and provided much valued peer support amongst the attendees.</p> <p>The remainder of the funding for the financial year 2024-2025 will be carried over into the next financial year to continue to provide group and antenatal class support with the aim of securing further funding to continue this provision.</p>

## Section D Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

*During the reporting period, the charity continued to deliver regular community-based support for parents and carers. Attendance at the weekly groups increased over the year. Feedback from participants indicates that the service provided effective emotional and practical support, contributed to improved parental wellbeing, and helped to reduce social isolation and loneliness.*

*A key achievement during the year was the delivery of antenatal education and postnatal support groups funded by the Start for Life grant. This funding enabled the charity to provide early intervention support to families during pregnancy and transition to parenthood and the postnatal period, contributing to increased parental confidence and improved access to peer support within the local community.*

*In response to identified local need, the charity expanded its activities by establishing a Baby Club in addition to its existing parent and toddler group. This provided an affordable and accessible postnatal group for families, including those transitioning from antenatal courses and those joining from the wider community.*

*During the financial year, the charity delivered three seven-week antenatal courses, supporting 19 couples. The charity also maintained ongoing postnatal and community support groups throughout the year.*

**Feedback received from beneficiaries across both courses and community groups was positive, indicating that the charity's activities were effective in meeting their aims and delivering public benefit.**

The trustees have also successfully applied for funding via a Start for Life grant from the local council to facilitate the ongoing provision of the group and accessible, free antenatal classes, as there is limited antenatal education available in North East Lincolnshire. Covid's enforced separation and social isolation increased instances of birth trauma, therefore unmet needs are greater than ever. 


