CONTENTS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2025

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The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our focus is on inclusion, relieving those who are in need, in particular but, not exclusively, those of all ages, who are lonely, isolated, medically and emotionally challenged in the ward of Rother District Council and surrounding areas.

We provide the opportunity for a variety of Befriending services, including, peer support and guidance, Health and Wellness services who attend our monthly Informative and Social Events to keep rural communities aware of services available to them. This reflects in our weekly Companionship Calls.

Significant activities

Collaborating with a variety of Health & Wellness organisations, providing a monthly Cancer Café.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the period ending 31st March 2025, the charity has developed awareness of its services. Our initial monthly Tilling, Tea and Cake (850 attendees to date) has attracted regular attendees from across communities of Rother District Council in East Sussex.

Our approach to providing 'Informative and Social events, where professionals from a variety of Health & Wellness services, Citizens Advice, Police, Fire & Rescue, 1st Responders, Care groups, East Sussex Hearing, Disc Dementia, a Mental Health Counsellor, a GP and Sussex Outreach Support, plus locally produced cakes and savouries and a visually decorated room, all add to an enjoyable event. Based on this successful format, in 2025, we have launched 'Winchelsea, Tea and Cake'.

Our monthly Cancer Cafe - launched in January 2025 in collaboration with the community hub, part of the Rye & Winchelsea Memorial Hospital. We provide a quiet, bright room with a terrace, where our attendees can feel safe, knowing everything discussed, stays in the room. We provide peer support and guidance for people of all ages and are regularly supported by a Care company providing information and form filling on Wills, Powers of Attorney and Benefits. In addition, volunteers for A Touch of Gentleness provide relaxing hand massages and a Calmer Self provide opportunities to learn techniques to reduce stress and anxiety.

At the beginning of February 2025, we launched our weekly 'Companionship Calls' earlier than planned - delivered by volunteers. We are now actively working to establish relationships with respected organisations to receive referrals in addition to the NHS, Social Prescribers and receiving personal referrals.

Our new Befriending Coordinator, comes with a wide variety of skills, delivering funded projects for the NHS, working closely with GPs, is a Mental Wellbeing Therapist and Counsellor working with Ted, a fully trained Pets as Therapists dog. These skills will allow us to widen our services.

All of the above is made possible by our generous funders, The Lottery - Awards for All, Sussex Community Foundation, Cheyne Wind Farm, Chalk Cliff Trust, Benefact group, and donations from local businesses and attendees to our events.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The total funds held at 31 March 2025 were £24,051 (2024 - £18,100) which includes restricted funds of £8,454 (2024 - nil).

The trustees set a goal of holding unrestricted financial reserves equal to 6 months of total running costs, based on these accounts the current reserves are in excess of this.

As the charity looks to increase its activity in the next accounting period, running costs are expected to increase. The trustees will continue to monitor reserve levels and budget accordingly.

The trustees set a goal of holding unrestricted financial reserves equal to 6 months of total running costs, current reserves are in excess of this.

FUTURE PLANS

Based on our successful monthly 'Informative and Social events' we are developing plans for a Battle, Tea and Cake to launch later in 2025 and will look to establish in other communities across rural Rother in East Sussex in 2026.

Once our 'Companionship Calls' are established, we would like to establish weekly 'face to face' visits.

We are also planning new projects, Pets as Therapy with Ted, and we are being considered for the UOK East Sussex Wellbeing service as one of the 5 principle sub-contractors and a grantee partner, including working with young people and those who are isolated due to Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA) and Elective Home Education (EHE), subjects currently high on the agenda of our MP Helena Doolimore and Central Government

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a constitution adopted upon registration as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Friends Altogether in Rother is a charitable incorporated organisation, registered in England and Wales. The charity's registered number and registered address can be found in the Report of the Trustees.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

There are no material uncertainties in relation to the charity's ability to continue as a going concern, these financial statements have therefore been prepared on the going concern basis.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings	- 20% on reducing balance
Computer equipment	- 33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our focus is on relieving people who are in need, in particular but not exclusively, those who are lonely and isolated in the ward of Rother District Council and the surrounding areas by the provision of support services including a Befriending service and facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and other leisure time occupation with object of improving their conditions of life

Significant activities

Developing collaborations with Health & Wellness organisations across East Sussex.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

During the period ended 31 March 2024 the charity launched a monthly Social Event 'Tilling, Tea and Cake' in Rye, where two Health & Wellbeing organisations plus a GP provide information, support and guidance plus hand massages provided by professionally trained volunteers.

We also held a Murder Mystery Lunch event attended by 55 people and started development work on a befriending service to provide companionship calls.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have set a goal of holding financial reserves equal to 6 months running costs.

FUTURE PLANS

The charity will be launching a cancer cafe in collaboration with The Community Hub on Rye Hill in January 2025.

It also plans to launch befriending companionship Calls in September 2025 and develop the 'Tilling, Tea and Cake' model in other areas starting with Battle.

BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
