Structure and Management

The Good Fund operates as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, governed by a board of three trustees who serve voluntarily. The charity has no paid staff. Governance ensures direct, impactful interventions that are community-driven and sustainable.

Activities and Objectives

The Good Fund's object is the prevention or relief of poverty by providing or facilitating safe, affordable, and sustainable housing for people in housing need or other related needs.

The charity works directly with communities experiencing poverty, focusing on single mother households and vulnerable families. Our approach combines housing with livelihood support — including livestock projects — so that the benefits of each intervention continue long after the initial grant is made. 100% of donations go directly to impact, with nothing spent on salaries or overheads.

Achievements and Performance

The 2025/26 financial year was a consolidation period. No new projects were initiated, and funds from prior periods continue to be held in reserve for future activity.

The ongoing impact from previous years' projects in Kigeme, Nyamagabe District, Southern Province, Rwanda, continues to benefit the families supported. Updates from local coordinators confirm that beneficiaries from earlier projects remain in improved circumstances.

Plans for the Future

The trustees intend to resume active fundraising and project delivery when resources allow, continuing the same model of providing safe housing alongside livelihood support for families living in poverty.

Public Benefit

The trustees have given due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The Good Fund's work directly benefits people living in poverty by providing housing and

sustainable livelihoods. Unlike one-off aid, our interventions create lasting change — families supported in prior years continue to benefit from the housing, livestock, and income generated through those projects.

Financial Review

The charity received no income during the financial year 2025/26 and had no expenditure. Funds held from prior periods remain in reserve.

The Good Fund operates as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, governed by a committed board of trustees. Our governance ensures direct, impactful interventions that are community-driven and sustainable.

Activities and Objectives:

Focused on empowering single mother households in Rwanda, we provide sustainable housing solutions and livelihood support through agricultural and livestock projects.

Ongoing Impact Profiles:

- **Profile 1 - Sustainable Livelihood through Livestock:** A widow with four children, previously living in a deteriorating home, now thrives in a rebuilt house with a secure fence protecting her two pigs. The livestock not only provides ongoing income through the sale of piglets but also generates organic fertilizer, enhancing her agricultural productivity.
- **Profile 2 - Secure Shelter and Economic Stability:** A single mother, living with her elderly mother and children, previously in an unsafe structure, now benefits from a secure home and goat rearing project. The goats have reproduced, providing continuous fertilizer and the potential for additional income through the sale of goat kids.

These profiles exemplify how our interventions have lasting effects, unlike one-time aids such as food donations. Each project is designed not just to provide immediate relief but to create enduring solutions that uplift entire families and communities over many years.

Feedback from Local Coordinators:

- “The money is an answer to prayers of a widow.”
- “You saved a family... very big deal mate even community members have come to join in for free so the money can be maximized on securing the house and fence.”
- “Good news...the goat has had kids, and the woman is extremely happy. They can sell them or raise them for more fertilizer.”
- “I was just told the pigs got piglets and they sold some of them to pay for healthcare and the house is as strong as ever....and family uses waste for fertilizer...the goat is also giving

good milk and fertilizer...she just checked on all of them and in recent rains the two women came home to report again on how happy they are to have a strong roof....they might not be completely out of poverty but they are in a way much better place....sometimes all we need is a little hand up!"

Public Benefit:

The ongoing benefits of our projects align closely with our mission to alleviate poverty through sustainable solutions, demonstrating substantial public benefit by enhancing living conditions and economic opportunities.
